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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 22.1-271.9 as follows:
12	§ 22.1-271.9. Cardiac emergency response plans required; grant program.
13	A. As used in this section:
14	"Automated External Defibrillator" or "AED" means a lightweight, portable device that delivers an
15	electric shock through the chest to the heart for the purpose of potentially stopping an irregular heartbeat or
17 18	arrhythmia and allowing a normal heartbeat rhythm to resume following sudden cardiac arrest. "Cardiac emergency response plan" or "CERP" means a written document that establishes the specific
10	steps to reduce death from sudden cardiac arrest that occurs on school grounds.
	"CPR" means cardiopulmonary resuscitation.
20 21	"High-need school" means any public elementary or secondary school (i) at which at least 50 percent of
21 22	children are eligible to receive free and reduced-price meals, (ii) that participates in the federal Community
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23 24	Eligibility Provision or any federal, state, or local universal free meals program, or (iii) that is classified as a Title Lephon purpose to Title Lephon Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, P. L. 20, 10
24 25	<i>Title I school pursuant to Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, P.L. 89-10, as amended.</i>
25 26	"Sudden cardiac arrest" means a condition whereby the heart unexpectedly malfunctions and stops
20 27	beating and that is likely to lead to death if not treated within minutes.
28	B. Each public elementary or secondary school shall develop a cardiac emergency response plan that
20 29	addresses the appropriate use of school personnel to respond to incidents involving an individual who is
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30 31	experiencing sudden cardiac arrest or a similar life-threatening emergency (i) while on school grounds and (ii) in the event that such school has an athletic department or organized athletic program, while attending or
31 32	participating in an athletic practice or event. Each such CERP shall integrate nationally recognized
32 33	evidence-based core elements such as those recommended by the American Heart Association guidelines and
33 34	shall integrate provisions and guidelines, consistent with relevant law, relating to:
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35 36	 Establishing a cardiac emergency response team; Activating such team in response to a sudden cardiac event;
30 37	3. Integrating the CERP into the local community's emergency medical services response protocols in
38	accordance with subsection C;
39	<i>4. Practicing responses to sudden cardiac arrest on school grounds through the use of drills;</i>
40	5. Placing and routinely maintaining AEDs in the school building in accordance with guidelines set by the
41	American Heart Association;
42	6. Ensuring periodic training in first aid, CPR, and the use of AEDs by appropriate staff, including school
43	nurses, athletic trainers, and coaches, that follows evidence-based guidelines set forth by the American Heart
44	Association or nationally-recognized guidelines focused on emergency cardiovascular care;
45	7. Disseminating the CERP to appropriate individuals throughout the school community; and
46	8. Reviewing, evaluating, and, as necessary, amending the CERP on an ongoing and annual basis.
47	C. Public elementary or secondary school officials shall work directly with local emergency service
48	providers to integrate the CERP into the local community's emergency medical services response protocols.
49	D. With such funds as may be appropriated for such purpose pursuant to the general appropriation act,
50	the Department shall establish and administer the CERP Grant Program for the purpose of awarding grants,
50 51	on a competitive basis, to any public elementary or secondary school to assist such school in the development
51 52	or implementation of its CERP or in the purchase or funding of activities or equipment that further promotes
52 53	<i>CERP</i> preparedness, including the purchase of AEDs, the funding of AED maintenance, the purchase of first
55 54	aid or CPR training kits and educational materials, and the funding of first aid or CPR training for faculty
5 4 55	and staff. The Department shall establish such rules, regulations, processes, procedures, and deadlines as it
56	deems necessary for the proper administration of the CERP Grant Program and, in considering applications
50 57	and awarding grants, shall give priority to high-need schools.
