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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 18.2-287.4 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 18.2-287.4. Carrying assault firearms in public areas prohibited; penalty.
13	It shall be is unlawful for any person to carry a loaded (a) any of the following on or about his person on
14	any public street, road, alley, sidewalk, or public right-of-way or in any public park or any other place of
15	whatever nature that is open to the public:
16	1. A semi-automatic center-fire rifle or pistol that expels single or multiple projectiles by action of an
17	explosion of a combustible material and is equipped at the time of the offense with a magazine that will hold
18 19	more than 20 rounds of ammunition or designed by the manufacturer to accommodate a silencer or equipped with a folding stock or (b) with a fixed magazine capacity in excess of 10 rounds;
20	2. A semi-automatic center-fire rifle that expels single or multiple projectiles by action of an explosion of
21	a combustible material that has the ability to accept a detachable magazine and has one of the following
22	characteristics: (i) a folding, telescoping, or collapsible stock; (ii) a pistol grip that protrudes conspicuously
23	beneath the action of the rifle; (iii) a second handgrip or a protruding grip that can be held by the
24	non-trigger hand; (iv) a grenade launcher; (v) a flare launcher; (vi) a sound suppressor; (vii) a flash
25	suppressor; (viii) a muzzle brake; (ix) a muzzle compensator; (x) a threaded barrel capable of accepting (a) a
26	sound suppressor, (b) a flash suppressor, (c) a muzzle brake, or (d) a muzzle compensator; or (xi) any
27 28	characteristic of like kind as enumerated in clauses (i) through (x) ;
28 29	3. A semi-automatic shotgun that expels single or multiple projectiles by action of an explosion of a combustible material that has one of the following characteristics: (i) a folding, telescoping, or collapsible
30	stock, (ii) a pistol grip that protrudes conspicuously beneath the action of the shotgun, (iii) the ability to
31	accept a detachable magazine, (iv) a fixed magazine capacity in excess of seven rounds, or (v) any
32	characteristic of like kind as enumerated in clauses (i) through (iv); or
33	4. A shotgun with a magazine that will hold more than seven rounds of the longest shortest ammunition
34	for which it is chambered on or about his person on any public street, road, alley, sidewalk, public
35	right-of-way, or in any public park or any other place of whatever nature that is open to the public in the
36 37	Cities of Alexandria, Chesapeake, Fairfax, Falls Church, Newport News, Norfolk, Richmond, or Virginia Beach or in the Counties of Arlington, Fairfax, Henrico, Loudoun, or Prince William.
38	The provisions of this section shall not apply to law-enforcement officers, licensed security guards, in the
39	<i>performance of their lawful duties</i> , military personnel in the performance of their lawful duties, or any person
40	having a valid concealed handgun permit any member of a cadet corps who is recognized by a public
41	institution of higher education while such member is in the performance of sanctioned military training or
42	such member is participating in an official ceremonial event for the Commonwealth, or to any person actually
43	engaged in lawful hunting or lawful recreational shooting activities at an established shooting range or
44	shooting contest. The provisions of this section shall not apply to a firearm that has been rendered
45 46	permanently inoperable, an antique firearm as defined in § 18.2-308.2:2, or a curio or relic as defined in § 18.2-308.2:2.
40 47	Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be <i>is</i> guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
48	The Except for the exemption in subdivision C 2 of § 18.2-308, the exemptions set forth in §§ § 18.2-308
49	and 18.2-308.016 shall apply, mutatis mutandis, to the provisions of this section.
50	2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or
51	commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the necessary
52	appropriation cannot be determined for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities;
53	therefore, Chapter 2 of the Acts of Assembly of 2024, Special Session I, requires the Virginia Criminal

Sentencing Commission to assign a minimum fiscal impact of \$50,000. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation cannot be determined for periods of commitment to the custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice.

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
