That § 22.1-298.1, as it is currently effective and as it shall become effective, of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 22.1-298.1. (Effective until July 1, 2030) Regulations governing licensure. A. As used in this section: "Alternate route to licensure" means a nontraditional route to teacher licensure available to individuals who meet the criteria specified in the guidelines developed pursuant to subsection P or regulations issued by the Board. "Equivalency assessment framework" means a structured process and set of guidelines and criteria (i) established by the Board to evaluate and recognize experiential learning or industry credentials as equivalent to formal educational coursework for individuals seeking renewable licensure with an endorsement in the area of career and technical education through a pathway established in accordance with subdivision B 3 and (ii) biennially reviewed, adjusted as necessary to ensure alignment with evolving industry and educational standards, and reported to the General Assembly by the Board. "Industry certification credential" means an active career and technical education credential that is earned by successfully completing a Board-approved industry certification examination, being issued a professional license in the Commonwealth, or successfully completing an occupational competency examination. "Licensure by reciprocity" means the issuance of a license as a teacher in the Commonwealth to an individual coming into the Commonwealth from another state when that individual meets certain conditions specified in the Board's regulations. "Local eligibility license" means a nonrenewable license issued in accordance with subsection M, not to exceed one year, to an individual who needs to take additional coursework but otherwise meets certain conditions for licensure set forth in the Board's regulations and subsection M, and who may be employed by a school division in the Commonwealth with the intention of such individual, upon satisfaction of the renewable license.

"Provisional license" means a nonrenewable license issued by the Board or by a division superintendent as permitted pursuant to subdivision D 5 for a specified period of time, not to exceed three years, to an individual who may be employed by a school division in the Commonwealth and who generally meets the requirements specified in the Board's regulations for licensure, but who may need to take additional

coursework, pass additional assessments, or meet alternative evaluation standards to be fully licensed with a

"Renewable license" means a license issued by the Board for 10 years to an individual who meets the requirements specified in the Board's regulations.

'Universal licensure by reciprocity" means the issuance of a license as a teacher in the Commonwealth to any individual who holds a valid out-of-state teaching license with full credentials and without deficiencies that has been in force and in use by the individual as an employed teacher in a non-virtual classroom setting at a public or private elementary or secondary school for at least three years prior to and is in force at the time the Department receives such individual's application for a license as a teacher in the Commonwealth.

B. The Board shall prescribe, by regulation, the requirements for the licensure of teachers and other school personnel required to hold a license. Such regulations shall include procedures:

- received a notice of dismissal or resignation pursuant to subsection F of § 22.1-313 and, in the case of a 65 person who is the subject of a founded complaint of child abuse or neglect, after all rights to any 66 67 administrative appeal provided by § 63.2-1526 have been exhausted. In the case of a teacher who is the subject of a founded complaint of child abuse or neglect and whose license has been revoked pursuant to this 68 69 subsection, in the event that a court reverses such finding of abuse or neglect and the individual submits to 70 the Department an application for the reinstatement of his license as a teacher, the Board shall consider and act upon such application no later than 90 days after the date of submission. Regardless of the authority of 71
- 72 any other agency of the Commonwealth to approve educational programs, only the Board shall have the 73 authority to license teachers to be regularly employed by school boards, including those teachers employed to 74 provide nursing education-;

75 The Board shall prescribe by regulation 2. Prescribe the licensure requirements for teachers who teach only online courses, as defined in § 22.1-212.23. Such license shall be valid only for teaching online courses. 76 77 Teachers who hold a 10-year renewable license issued by the Board may teach online courses for which they 78 are properly endorsed; and

79  $\overline{3}$ . Establish additional pathways to renewable licensure as a teacher with an endorsement in the area of 80 career and technical education, including:

For individuals who have at least five years of relevant work experience, the substitution of experiential 82 learning for coursework in classroom management, curriculum and instruction in career and technical 83 education, and human growth and development, in accordance with the equivalency assessment framework; 84 and

Licensure by reciprocity with an endorsement in the area of career and technical education for 86 individuals with out-of-state teaching licenses who have the work experience and experiential learning 87 described in subdivision a. The Board shall determine eligibility within 60 days of receiving a completed 88 application.

C. The Board's regulations shall include requirements that a person seeking initial licensure:

Demonstrate proficiency in the relevant content area and other core skills for educators by achieving a 95 qualifying score on professional assessments or meeting alternative evaluation standards as prescribed by the Board. Such assessments for any individual seeking initial licensure with an endorsement in early/primary 96 97 education preschool through grade three, elementary education preschool through grade six, special education 98 general curriculum kindergarten through grade 12, special education deaf and hard of hearing preschool 99 through grade 12, or special education blindness/visual impairments preschool through grade 12 or as a 100 reading specialist shall include a rigorous test of science-based reading research and evidence-based literacy instruction; 101

- 102 2. Complete study in attention deficit disorder;
- 103 3. Complete study in gifted education, including the use of multiple criteria to identify gifted students; and 4. Complete study in methods of improving communication between schools and families and ways of 104 105
- increasing family involvement in student learning at home and at school. 106
  - D. In addition, such regulations shall include requirements that:

1. Every person seeking initial licensure and persons seeking licensure renewal as teachers who have not 107 completed such study shall complete study in child abuse recognition and intervention in accordance with 108 109 curriculum guidelines developed by the Board in consultation with the Department of Social Services that are 110 relevant to the specific teacher licensure routes;

111 2. Every person seeking renewal of a license shall complete all renewal requirements, including professional development in a manner prescribed by the Board, except that no person seeking renewal of a 112 license shall be required to satisfy any such requirement by completing coursework and earning credit at an 113 114 institution of higher education;

115 3. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall provide evidence of completion of 116 certification or training in emergency first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and the use of automated 117 external defibrillators. The certification or training program shall (i) be based on the current national 118 evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines for cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an

automated external defibrillator, such as a program developed by the American Heart Association or the

American Red Cross, and (ii) include hands-on practice of the skills necessary to perform cardiopulmonary
 resuscitation. The Board shall provide a waiver for this requirement for any person with a disability whose
 disability prohibits such person from completing the certification or training;

4. Every person seeking licensure with an endorsement as a teacher of the blind and visually impairedshall demonstrate proficiency in reading and writing Braille;

5. Every teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth with an endorsement in the area of career
and technical education shall have an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks
endorsement. If a teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth has not attained an industry
certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement, the division superintendent may
issue the teacher a provisional license to allow time for the teacher to attain such credential;

6. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete awareness training,
 provided by the Department, on the indicators of dyslexia, as that term is defined by the Board pursuant to
 regulations, and the evidence-based interventions and accommodations for dyslexia;

133 7. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement as a school
134 counselor shall complete training in the recognition of mental health disorder and behavioral distress,
135 including depression, trauma, violence, youth suicide, and substance abuse;

8. Every person seeking initial licensure as a teacher who has not received the instruction described in subsection D of § 23.1-902 shall receive instruction or training on positive behavior interventions and supports; crisis prevention and de-escalation; the use of physical restraint and seclusion, consistent with regulations of the Board; and appropriate alternative methods to reduce and prevent the need for the use of physical restraint and seclusion;

141 9. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete instruction or training in142 cultural competency;

143 10. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement in history and144 social sciences shall complete instruction in African American history, as prescribed by the Board;

11. Every person seeking renewal of a license as a teacher shall complete training in the instruction of
students with disabilities that includes (i) differentiating instruction for students depending on their needs; (ii)
understanding the role of general education teachers on the individualized education program team; (iii)
implementing effective models of collaborative instruction, including co-teaching; and (iv) understanding the
goals and benefits of inclusive education for all students; and

Every person seeking initial licensure with an endorsement in early/primary education preschool through grade three, elementary education preschool through grade six, special education general curriculum kindergarten through grade 12, special education deaf and hard of hearing preschool through grade 12, or special education blindness/visual impairments preschool through grade 12 or as a reading specialist shall complete study in science-based reading research and evidence-based literacy instruction.

155 É. No teacher who seeks a provisional license shall be required to meet any requirement set forth in
156 subdivision D 1, 3, 6, or 8 as a condition of such licensure, but each such teacher shall complete each such
157 requirement during the first year of provisional licensure.

158 F. The Board shall issue a license to an individual seeking initial licensure who has not completed 159 professional assessments as prescribed by the Board, if such individual (i) holds a provisional license that will expire within three months or, at the discretion of the school board and division superintendent, within six 160 161 months if the individual has received a satisfactory mid-year performance review in the current school year; (ii) is employed by a school board; (iii) is recommended for licensure by the division superintendent; (iv) has 162 163 attempted, unsuccessfully, to obtain a qualifying score on the professional assessments as prescribed by the 164 Board; (v) has received an evaluation rating of proficient or above on the performance standards for each year 165 of the provisional license, and such evaluation was conducted in a manner consistent with the Guidelines for Uniform Performance Standards and Evaluation Criteria for Teachers, Principals, and Superintendents; and 166 (vi) meets all other requirements for initial licensure. 167

G. Each division superintendent may waive for any individual whom he seeks to employ as a career and technical education teacher and who is also seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement in the area of career and technical education any applicable requirement set forth in subsection C or subdivision D 2, 4, or 6.

H. The Board's regulations shall require that initial licensure for principals and assistant principals be contingent upon passage of an assessment as prescribed by the Board.

I. The Board shall establish criteria in its regulations to effectuate the substitution of experiential learning
 for coursework for those persons seeking initial licensure through an alternate route as defined in Board
 regulations. Such alternate routes shall include eligibility for any individual to receive, notwithstanding any
 provision of law to the contrary, a renewable one-year license to teach in public high schools in the
 Commonwealth if he has:

179 1. Received a graduate degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education;

180 2. Completed at least 30 credit hours of teaching experience as an instructor at a regionally accredited

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181 institution of higher education;

182 3. Received qualifying scores on the professional teacher's assessments prescribed by the Board, including 183 the content-area assessment for the endorsement sought. Such assessments for any individual seeking initial 184 licensure through an alternate route with an endorsement in early/primary education preschool through grade 185 three, elementary education preschool through grade six, special education general curriculum kindergarten through grade 12, special education deaf and hard of hearing preschool through grade 12, or special education 186 blindness/visual impairments preschool through grade 12 or as a reading specialist shall include a rigorous 187 test of science-based reading research and evidence-based literacy instruction; and 188

4. Met the requirements set forth in subdivisions D 1 and 3.

190 J. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board (i) may provide for the issuance of a 191 provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, pursuant to subdivision D 5 or to any person 192 who does not meet the requirements of this section or any other requirement for licensure imposed by law; 193 (ii) shall provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, to any 194 former member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the Virginia National Guard who has received an 195 honorable discharge and has the appropriate level of experience or training but does not meet the 196 requirements for a renewable license; and (iii) may provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, to any individual who has held within the last five years a valid and 197 officially issued and recognized license or certification to teach issued by an entity outside of the United 198 199 States but does not meet the requirements for a renewable license if the individual's license or certification to teach has been evaluated and verified by an entity approved by the Department. 200 201

K. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for licensure by reciprocity:

202 1. With comparable endorsement areas for those individuals holding a valid out-of-state teaching license 203 and national certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or a nationally 204 recognized certification program approved by the Board. The application for such individuals shall require evidence of such valid licensure and national certification and shall not require official student transcripts; 205 206 and

2. For any spouse of an active duty or reserve member of the Armed Forces of the United States or a 207 208 member of the Virginia National Guard who has obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full credentials 209 and without deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is received by the Department. Each such individual shall establish a file in the Department by submitting a complete 210 211 application packet, which shall include official student transcripts and an official copy of the military 212 permanent assignment orders of the individual's spouse. No service requirements or licensing assessments shall be required for any such individual. The Department shall determine and communicate such individual's 213 214 eligibility for licensure by reciprocity within 15 business days of receipt of the complete application packet.

L. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for universal licensure by reciprocity for any 215 individual who holds a valid out-of-state teaching license with full credentials and without deficiencies that 216 has been in force for at least three years prior to and is in force at the time of application. No service 217 requirements or licensing assessments shall be required for any individual who applies for universal licensure 218 by reciprocity. Any individual who applies for universal licensure by reciprocity shall provide a copy of the 219 220 individual's out-of-state teaching license that meets the criteria set forth in this subsection. Any such 221 individual shall be subject to the provisions of §§ 22.1-296.2 and 22.1-296.4. The Department shall prioritize applications for universal licensure by reciprocity. 222

M. The Board shall include in its regulations an alternate route to licensure for elementary education 223 preschool through grade six and an alternate route to licensure for special education general curriculum 224 225 kindergarten through grade 12. Each such alternate route to licensure shall require individuals to (i) meet the 226 qualifying scores on the content area assessment prescribed by the Board for the endorsements sought and (ii) 227 complete an alternative certification program that provides training in the pedagogy and methodology of the 228 respective content or special education areas prescribed by the Board. The curriculum of any such alternative 229 certification program shall be approved by the Board. Nothing in this subsection shall preclude the Board 230 from establishing other alternate routes to licensure.

N. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board, upon recommendation of the division 231 232 superintendent or school board, may provide for the issuance of a valid one-year nonrenewable local 233 eligibility license to any individual who (i) received a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited 234 institution of higher education and (ii) has experience or training in a subject or content area as the local 235 school board and division superintendent may deem appropriate for the applicable teaching position or 236 endorsement area. Any such one-year nonrenewable local eligibility license shall be issued in accordance 237 with the following criteria:

238 1. Each school board shall ensure that the number of teachers employed by the school board under such 239 local eligibility license does not exceed five percent of the teachers employed by such school board during 240 the preceding school year;

241 2. No school board shall issue such local eligibility license to any individual who is (i) seeking to provide 242 instruction in special education or (ii) eligible for a collegiate professional license or postgraduate 243 professional license;

3. Any individual who is issued a local eligibility license pursuant to this subsection shall be required to 244 245 complete within such one-year period the requirements set forth in subsection C and subdivisions D  $\overline{1}$ , 3, 6, 8, 246 and 9 as well as any additional training requirements that may be prescribed by the school board and division 247 superintendent;

248 4. Such local eligibility license shall only be valid within the issuing school division;

249 5. Each school board may, upon an individual's completion of a local eligibility license, issue a 250 provisional license to such individual upon receiving from the division superintendent (i) a recommendation 251 for such license and (ii) a satisfactory performance evaluation for such individual for the local eligibility 252 licensure period;

253 6. Any individual issued a one-year local eligibility license shall be considered a probationary teacher and 254 shall be subject to the probationary terms of employment pursuant to  $\S$  22.1-303;

255 7. Any teacher employed under a one-year local eligibility license shall be issued a collegiate professional 256 or postgraduate professional license upon the expiration of the local eligibility license if such teacher, before 257 or by the expiration of such local eligibility license, (i) receives a recommendation from the division superintendent and the school board, (ii) satisfies all requirements for the applicable license pursuant to 258 259 relevant law and regulations, and (iii) satisfies any other criteria as may be prescribed by the Board; and

260 8. The Department's Office of Licensure shall review each local eligibility license within a month of 261 issuance to any individual to ensure compliance with all Board regulations.

O. The Board, in its regulations providing for licensure by reciprocity established pursuant to subsections 262 263 K and L, shall (i) permit applicants to submit third-party employment verification forms and (ii) grant special 264 consideration to individuals who have successfully completed a program offered by a provider that is 265 accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation.

266 P. The Board shall develop guidelines that establish a process to permit a school board or any organization 267 sponsored by a school board to petition the Board for approval of an alternate route to licensure that may be 268 used to meet the requirements for a provisional or renewable license or any endorsement. Any such alternate 269 route may include alternatives to the regulatory requirements for teacher preparation, including alternative 270 professional assessments and coursework. The petitioner may proffer or the Board may impose conditions in 271 conjunction with the approval of such petition. 272

Such assessments for any individual seeking initial licensure with an endorsement in early/primary 350 education preschool through grade three, elementary education preschool through grade six, special education general curriculum kindergarten through grade 12, special education deaf and hard of hearing preschool 351 through grade 12, or special education blindness/visual impairments preschool through grade 12 or as a 352 reading specialist shall include a rigorous test of science-based reading research and evidence-based literacy 353 354 instruction; 355

2. Complete study in attention deficit disorder;

3. Complete study in gifted education, including the use of multiple criteria to identify gifted students; and 356 357 4. Complete study in methods of improving communication between schools and families and ways of 358 increasing family involvement in student learning at home and at school.

D. In addition, such regulations shall include requirements that:

359 1. Every person seeking initial licensure and persons seeking licensure renewal as teachers who have not 360 361 completed such study shall complete study in child abuse recognition and intervention in accordance with 362 curriculum guidelines developed by the Board in consultation with the Department of Social Services that are 363 relevant to the specific teacher licensure routes;

364 2. Every person seeking renewal of a license shall complete all renewal requirements, including

professional development in a manner prescribed by the Board, except that no person seeking renewal of a
 license shall be required to satisfy any such requirement by completing coursework and earning credit at an
 institution of higher education;

368 3. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall provide evidence of completion of 369 certification or training in emergency first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and the use of automated 370 external defibrillators. The certification or training program shall (i) be based on the current national 371 evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines for cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an 372 automated external defibrillator, such as a program developed by the American Heart Association or the 373 American Red Cross, and (ii) include hands-on practice of the skills necessary to perform cardiopulmonary 374 resuscitation. The Board shall provide a waiver for this requirement for any person with a disability whose 375 disability prohibits such person from completing the certification or training;

4. Every person seeking licensure with an endorsement as a teacher of the blind and visually impairedshall demonstrate proficiency in reading and writing Braille;

5. Every teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth with an endorsement in the area of career
and technical education shall have an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks
endorsement. If a teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth has not attained an industry
certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement, the division superintendent may
issue the teacher a provisional license to allow time for the teacher to attain such credential;

6. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete awareness training,
 provided by the Department, on the indicators of dyslexia, as that term is defined by the Board pursuant to
 regulations, and the evidence-based interventions and accommodations for dyslexia;

386 7. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement as a school counselor shall complete training in the recognition of mental health disorder and behavioral distress, including depression, trauma, violence, youth suicide, and substance abuse;

8. Every person seeking initial licensure as a teacher who has not received the instruction described in subsection D of § 23.1-902 shall receive instruction or training on positive behavior interventions and supports; crisis prevention and de-escalation; the use of physical restraint and seclusion, consistent with regulations of the Board; and appropriate alternative methods to reduce and prevent the need for the use of physical restraint and seclusion;

394 9. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete instruction or training in395 cultural competency;

396 10. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement in history and397 social sciences shall complete instruction in African American history, as prescribed by the Board;

11. Every person seeking renewal of a license as a teacher shall complete training in the instruction of
 students with disabilities that includes (i) differentiating instruction for students depending on their needs; (ii)
 understanding the role of general education teachers on the individualized education program team; (iii)
 implementing effective models of collaborative instruction, including co-teaching; and (iv) understanding the
 goals and benefits of inclusive education for all students; and

12. Every person seeking initial licensure with an endorsement in early/primary education preschool
through grade three, elementary education preschool through grade six, special education general curriculum
kindergarten through grade 12, special education deaf and hard of hearing preschool through grade 12, or
special education blindness/visual impairments preschool through grade 12 or as a reading specialist shall
complete study in science-based reading research and evidence-based literacy instruction.

408 E. No teacher who seeks a provisional license shall be required to meet any requirement set forth in subdivision D 1, 3, 6, or 8 as a condition of such licensure, but each such teacher shall complete each such requirement during the first year of provisional licensure.

411 F. The Board shall issue a license to an individual seeking initial licensure who has not completed 412 professional assessments as prescribed by the Board, if such individual (i) holds a provisional license that will 413 expire within three months or, at the discretion of the school board and division superintendent, within six months if the individual has received a satisfactory mid-year performance review in the current school year; 414 415 (ii) is employed by a school board; (iii) is recommended for licensure by the division superintendent; (iv) has attempted, unsuccessfully, to obtain a qualifying score on the professional assessments as prescribed by the 416 417 Board; (v) has received an evaluation rating of proficient or above on the performance standards for each year of the provisional license, and such evaluation was conducted in a manner consistent with the Guidelines for 418 419 Uniform Performance Standards and Evaluation Criteria for Teachers, Principals, and Superintendents; and 420 (vi) meets all other requirements for initial licensure.

421 G. Each division superintendent may waive for any individual whom he seeks to employ as a career and
422 technical education teacher and who is also seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an
423 endorsement in the area of career and technical education any applicable requirement set forth in subsection
424 C or subdivision D 2, 4, or 6.

425 H. The Board's regulations shall require that initial licensure for principals and assistant principals be

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426 contingent upon passage of an assessment as prescribed by the Board.

427 I. The Board shall establish criteria in its regulations to effectuate the substitution of experiential learning

for coursework for those persons seeking initial licensure through an alternate route as defined in Board 428 429 regulations. Such alternate routes shall include eligibility for any individual to receive, notwithstanding any

430 provision of law to the contrary, a renewable one-year license to teach in public high schools in the 431 Commonwealth if he has: 432

1. Received a graduate degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education;

433 2. Completed at least 30 credit hours of teaching experience as an instructor at a regionally accredited 434 institution of higher education;

3. Received qualifying scores on the professional teacher's assessments prescribed by the Board, including 435 436 the content-area assessment for the endorsement sought. Such assessments for any individual seeking initial 437 licensure through an alternate route with an endorsement in early/primary education preschool through grade 438 three, elementary education preschool through grade six, special education general curriculum kindergarten through grade 12, special education deaf and hard of hearing preschool through grade 12, or special education 439 blindness/visual impairments preschool through grade 12 or as a reading specialist shall include a rigorous 440 441 test of science-based reading research and evidence-based literacy instruction; and 442

4. Met the requirements set forth in subdivisions D 1 and 3.

443 J. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board (i) may provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, pursuant to subdivision D 5 or to any person 444 who does not meet the requirements of this section or any other requirement for licensure imposed by law; 445 446 (ii) shall provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, to any 447 former member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the Virginia National Guard who has received an 448 honorable discharge and has the appropriate level of experience or training but does not meet the 449 requirements for a renewable license; and (iii) may provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, to any individual who has held within the last five years a valid and 450 officially issued and recognized license or certification to teach issued by an entity outside of the United 451 452 States but does not meet the requirements for a renewable license if the individual's license or certification to 453 teach has been evaluated and verified by an entity approved by the Department.

K. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for licensure by reciprocity:

455 1. With comparable endorsement areas for those individuals holding a valid out-of-state teaching license and national certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or a nationally 456 457 recognized certification program approved by the Board. The application for such individuals shall require evidence of such valid licensure and national certification and shall not require official student transcripts; 458 459 and

460 2. For any spouse of an active duty or reserve member of the Armed Forces of the United States or a member of the Virginia National Guard who has obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full credentials 461 and without deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is received by the 462 Department. Each such individual shall establish a file in the Department by submitting a complete 463 application packet, which shall include official student transcripts and an official copy of the military 464 permanent assignment orders of the individual's spouse. No service requirements or licensing assessments 465 shall be required for any such individual. The Department shall determine and communicate such individual's 466 eligibility for licensure by reciprocity within 15 business days of receipt of the complete application packet. 467

L. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for universal licensure by reciprocity for any 468 individual who holds a valid out-of-state teaching license with full credentials and without deficiencies that 469 470 has been in force for at least three years prior to and is in force at the time of applications. No services 471 requirements or licensing assessments shall be required for any individual who applies for universal licensure 472 by reciprocity. Any individual who applies for universal licensure by reciprocity shall provide a copy of the 473 individual's out-of-state teaching license that meets the criteria set forth in this subsection. Any such individual shall be subject to the provisions of §§ 22.1-296.2 and 22.1-296.4. The Department shall prioritize 474 475 applications for universal licensure by reciprocity.

M. The Board shall include in its regulations an alternate route to licensure for elementary education 476 477 preschool through grade six and an alternate route to licensure for special education general curriculum kindergarten through grade 12. Each such alternate route to licensure shall require individuals to (i) meet the 478 479 qualifying scores on the content area assessment prescribed by the Board for the endorsements sought and (ii) 480 complete an alternative certification program that provides training in the pedagogy and methodology of the respective content or special education areas prescribed by the Board. The curriculum of any such alternative 481 certification program shall be approved by the Board. Nothing in this subsection shall preclude the Board 482 483 from establishing other alternate routes to licensure.

484 N. The Board, in its regulations providing for licensure by reciprocity established pursuant to subsections 485 K and L, shall (i) permit applicants to submit third-party employment verification forms and (ii) grant special 486 consideration to individuals who have successfully completed a program offered by a provider that is 487 accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation.

488 O. The Board shall develop guidelines that establish a process to permit a school board or any 489 organization sponsored by a school board to petition the Board for approval of an alternate route to licensure

499 organization sponsored by a school board to perform the board for approval of an alternate route to neerstree 490 that may be used to meet the requirements for a provisional or renewable license or any endorsement. Any

**491** such alternate route may include alternatives to the regulatory requirements for teacher preparation, including

492 alternative professional assessments and coursework. The petitioner may proffer or the Board may impose and the second secon

- 493 conditions in conjunction with the approval of such petition.
- 494 2. That the Board of Education shall amend its regulations as necessary in accordance with the
- 495 provisions of this act.
