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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 22.1-206.01:1 as follows:
13	§ 22.1-206.01:1. Safety First Comprehensive Drug Education Pilot Program; established;
14	requirements.
15	A. As used in this section, "Safety First Curriculum" means the Safety First: Comprehensive Drug
16 17	Education and Intervention Curriculum developed by the Halpern-Felsher REACH Lab in the Department of Pediatrics at Stanford Medicine.
18	B. The Safety First Comprehensive Drug Education Pilot Program (the Program) is established for the
19	purpose of providing public school students scientifically accurate, interactive, and compassionate
20	instruction relating to drugs and substance use based on a comprehensive, harm-reduction-based drug
21	intervention curriculum.
22	C. Pursuant to the Program, each public secondary school located in Superintendent's Region 7 shall (i)
23	implement the Safety First Curriculum in any program of instruction through which instruction relating to
24	drugs is provided to students pursuant to subsection A of § 22.1-206 or (ii) if any such public secondary
25	school does not offer any such program of instruction, provide at such grade level as the applicable school
26	board and the Department deem appropriate, a program of instruction relating to drugs based on the Safety
27	First Curriculum. The school board of each public secondary school located in Superintendent's Region 7
28	shall collect and submit to the Department by September 1 of each year data relating to the impact of the
29 20	Program on students in each public secondary school for the immediately preceding school year, including
30 31	data on (a) the number of students who received instruction based on the Safety First Curriculum pursuant to the Program: (b) the number of drug related disciplingry health or safety insidents involving students that
31	the Program; (b) the number of drug-related disciplinary, health, or safety incidents involving students that occurred on school property; and (c) such other data as such school board deems appropriate.
33	D. The Department shall be responsible for the implementation and administration of the Program. The
34	Department shall:
35	1. Coordinate with the school board of each public secondary school located in Superintendent's Region 7
36	to implement the Safety First Curriculum through an existing program of instruction through which
37	instruction relating to drugs is provided to students pursuant to subsection A of § 22.1-206 or to develop and
38	provide a program of instruction based on the Safety First Curriculum;
39	2. Develop guidelines relating to the implementation of the Safety First Curriculum in an existing
40	program of instruction or to the development and provision of a program of instruction based on the Safety
41	First Curriculum that includes guidance (i) for school boards and administrative personnel on determining at
42	what grade levels the implementation of the Safety First Curriculum would be appropriate and (ii) for
43	instructional personnel on transitioning from providing instruction relating to drugs based on any curriculum
44 45	currently utilized to providing instruction relating to drugs based on the Safety First Curriculum;
45 46	3. Make available to each school board that governs a school division located in Superintendent's Region 7 any instructional materials, curriculum guidelines, or other resources developed by the Halpern-Felsher
47	REACH Lab for the purpose of implementing and providing instruction based on the Safety First curriculum;

49	4. Develop and submit to the Senate Committee on Education and Health and the House Committee on
50	Education by October 1 of each year a report detailing the impact of the Program on each public secondary
51	school located in Superintendent's Region 7, based on the data received pursuant to subsection C.
52	2. That the provisions of the first enactment of this act shall expire on July 1, 2027.
53	3. That the Board of Education shall amend its regulations set forth in 8VAC20-310-10 relating to the
54	provision of health education program instruction in drugs and drug abuse to require public schools in
55	the Commonwealth to emphasize in any such health education program instruction prevention,

intervention, and harm reduction, consistent with the Safety First: Comprehensive Drug Education and Intervention Curriculum developed by the Halpern-Felsher REACH Lab in the Department of 

**Pediatrics at Stanford Medicine.**
