Bill Title: Zoning; recovery residences.

Bill Summary: Provides that zoning ordinances for all purposes shall consider a certified recovery residence in which no more than eight individuals with substance use disorder reside, either with or without one or more resident or nonresident staff persons, as residential occupancy by a single family and that no conditions more restrictive than those imposed on residences occupied by persons related by blood, marriage, or adoption shall be imposed on such certified recovery residence. The bill provides that no clinical treatment shall take place in such recovery residence and that the recovery residence shall submit the individual name and contact information for the person responsible for the residence to the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services.

Fiscal Summary: There is no anticipated fiscal impact to this legislation.

Fiscal Analysis: This legislation makes changes to zoning ordinances for recovery residences and is not anticipated to have a fiscal impact. Any administrative costs to the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services for maintaining a list of recovery residences can be absorbed in existing resources.
