**Fiscal Analysis:** This legislation adds a requirement for the Council to approve training courses used to train FOIA officers at state agencies. The Council has never approved courses presented by others in the past, so they would need to create an approval structure, including establishing criteria for the approval. They would also need to set up the administrative apparatus to receive, review, and approve the individual courses. These additional duties cannot be absorbed by current Council staff. An additional policy analyst position will be required at a cost of \$85,200, including salary and fringe benefits, to support the establishment of the approval criteria and maintain the review and approval process going forward.
