| 10 | Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: |
| 11 | 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 40.1 a section |
| 12 | numbered 40.1-28.7:12 as follows: |
| 13 | § 40.1-28.7:12. Restricting use of accrued leave for other employment prohibited; civil penalty. |
| 14 | A. No employer shall prohibit any employee from using accrued annual or vacation leave to work on |
| 15 | behalf of another employer unless such other employment would create a conflict of interest. However, an |
| 16 | employer may prohibit or restrict an employee's use of such employer's property, office space, equipment, |
| 17 18 | materials, trade secrets, confidential information, or other assets for any purpose relating to such employee's employment by another employer. |
| 10 | B. Any employer that knowingly violates the provisions of this section shall be subject to a civil penalty |
| 20 | not to exceed \$100 for each violation. The Commissioner shall notify any employer that he alleges has |
| 21 | violated any provision of this section by certified mail. Such notice shall contain a description of the alleged |
| $\frac{1}{22}$ | violation. Within 15 days of receipt of notice of the alleged violation, the employer may request an informal |
| 23 | conference regarding such violation with the Commissioner. In determining the amount of any penalty to be |
| 24 | imposed, the Commissioner shall consider the size of the business of the employer charged and the gravity of |
| 25 | the violation. The decision of the Commissioner shall be final. Civil penalties under this section shall be |
| 26 | assessed by the Commissioner and paid to the Literary Fund. The Commissioner shall prescribe procedures |
| 27 | for the payment of proposed penalties that are not contested by employers. |
| 28 | C. The Commissioner or his authorized representative shall have the right to petition a circuit court for |
| 29 | injunctive or such other relief as may be necessary for enforcement of this section. |
