25105016D **HOUSE BILL NO. 1616** 1 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 2 3 4 5 (Proposed by the House Committee on Labor and Commerce on January 28, 2025) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Feggans) 6 A BILL to direct the Director of the Department of Energy to identify and develop training resources to 7 advance workforce development in the offshore wind industry. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 9 1. § 1. That the Director of the Department of Energy (the Director) shall identify and develop training resources to advance the offshore wind industry in the Commonwealth, including the development of 10 offshore wind careers and training curriculum, such as pre-hire soft skills training and technical skills 11 12 training, for manufacturing trades, providers of offshore wind products and services, maritime workers, and 13 other skilled trades. As part of such curriculum, the Director shall assess the availability of offshore wind 14 developers, original equipment manufacturers, and supply chain firms that operate within the 15 Commonwealth and, following such assessment, consider establishing a Global Wind Organisation training 16 program to meet minimum safety requirements including training on fire awareness, first aid, sea survival, 17 working at height, and manual hauling for offshore wind industry workers. Training opportunities for 18 veterans, local workers, and workers from historically economically disadvantaged communities, as defined 19 in § 56-576 of the Code of Virginia, shall be prioritized. In developing such training resources, the Director 20 shall consult with public and private institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth, vocational-technical institutions, apprenticeship programs, and at least one historically black college or 21 22 university, as defined in § 2.2-1604 of the Code of Virginia. Funding for developing such resources may 23 include existing sources of local, state, or federal funding and grant resources for the purposes of 24 identifying and developing skills required to support workforce development in the offshore wind industry 25 and expand the offshore wind industry in the Commonwealth. Any training programs developed pursuant to 26 this act shall be developed in coordination with the Transmission Siting and Economic Development 27 Program as awarded to the Department of Energy, including awards granted to the Hampton Roads 28 Workforce Council.

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
