**Bill Number:** SB1125 **Patron:** Boysko

**Bill Title:** Department of Wildlife Resources; propagation of wildlife without a permit unlawful;

premature separation; hybridization.

Bill Summary: Makes it unlawful to propagate wildlife unless authorized by a permit issued by the Department of Wildlife Resources and provides that any permit holder authorized by the Department to propagate wildlife shall not prematurely separate any wildlife from the mother prior to the natural time of weaning that is appropriate for such species, except that wildlife may be prematurely separated if a medical necessity exists pursuant to a written order from a licensed veterinarian as provided in the bill. The bill also makes it unlawful to intentionally (i) propagate wildlife of different species or subspecies, also known as hybridization, or (ii) keep or house wildlife of different species or subspecies in conditions in which they could propagate unless such activities are undertaken by a facility accredited or certified by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums.
