6	A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 2.2-2903, 15.2-1509, and 40.1-27.2 of the Code of Virginia, relating to		
7	military spouses; preference in employment.		
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:		
9	1. That §§ 2.2-2903, 15.2-1509, and 40.1-27.2 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as		
10	follows:		
11	§ 2.2-2903. Grade or rating increase and other preferences for veterans and their surviving spouses		
12	and children, and members of the National Guard.		
13	A. In a manner consistent with federal and state law, if any veteran, or surviving spouse, or child, or		
14	spouse of an eligible service member, or member of the National Guard applies for employment with the		
15	Commonwealth that is based on the passing of any written examination, the grade or rating of the veteran		
16	surviving spouse, or child, or the spouse of an eligible service member on such examination shall be		
17	increased by five percent. However, if the veteran has a service-connected disability rating fixed by the U.S		
18	Department of Veterans Affairs, his grade or rating shall be increased by 10 percent on such writter		
19	examination. Such increases shall apply only if the veteran passes such examination.		
20	B. In a manner consistent with federal and state law, if any veteran, surviving spouse, or child, or spouse		
21	of an eligible service member, applies for employment with the Commonwealth that is not based on the		
22	passing of any examination, the veteran, surviving spouse, or child, or spouse of an eligible service member,		
23	shall be given preference by the Commonwealth during the selection process, provided that the veteran		
24	surviving spouse, or child, or spouse of an eligible service member, meets all of the knowledge, skill, and		
25	ability requirements for the available position. Additional consideration shall also be given to veterans who		
26	have a service-connected disability rating fixed by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. The Department		
27	of Human Resource Management shall develop and distribute guidelines as an addendum to the Hiring Policy		
28	for Executive Branch agencies to provide guidance to agencies to comply with the preference of this section.		
29	C. A member of the National Guard applying for a position or job classification under this chapter and		
30	possessing the necessary qualifications for such position or job classification shall be entitled to a separate

31	preference as provided	d in this subsection. When a member of the National Gu	ard or a veteran has applied for
32	a position or job classification that requires an assessment using numerical ratings, points equal to five		
33	percent of the total points available from the assessment device or devices shall be added to the passing score		
34	of the applicant member of the National Guard or veteran. In an assessment not using numerical ratings		
35	consideration shall be afforded to a member of the National Guard provided that member meets all of the		
36	knowledge, skill, and ability requirements for the available position.		
37	The preference under this subsection shall not be applied for a position that is limited to state employees.		
38	In addition, the preference provided by this subsection shall not be applied if any other applicant for the		
39	position or job classification is (i) a veteran or (ii) a former prisoner of war.		
40	D. If any veteran, or surviving spouse, or child, or spouse of an eligible service member, or member of the		
41	National Guard is denied employment with the Commonwealth, he shall be entitled, to the extent permitted		
42	by law, to request and inspect information regarding the reasons for such denial.		al.
43	E. As used in this section, unless the context requires a different meaning:		
44	"Child" means any surviving child or children under the age of 27 years of a veteran as defined herei		s of a veteran as defined herein
45	who was killed in the line of duty.		
46	"Eligible service member" means a full-time active duty member of any branch of the uniformed service.		ranch of the uniformed services

locality shall take into consideration or give preference to an individual's status as (i) an honorably discharged

60	veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States or status as, (ii) a person with a disability, or (iii) the spouse
61	of a full-time active duty member of any branch of the uniformed services of the United States, in its
62	employment hiring policies and practices, provided that such veteran, spouse, or person with a disability
63	meets all of the knowledge, skills and eligibility requirements for the available position. Additional
64	consideration shall also be given to veterans who have a service connected disability rating fixed by the U.S.
65	Department of Veterans Affairs. "Veterans" as used in this section refers to the same class as included in §
66	2.2-2903 with regard to the state service. "Person with a disability" as used in this section refers to the same
67	class as included in § 51.5-40.1.

§ 40.1-27.2. Preference for veterans and spouses.

- A. As used in this section, unless the context requires a different meaning:
- "Disabled veteran" means a veteran who has been found by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs or by
 the retirement board of one of the several branches of the armed forces to have a compensable serviceconnected permanent and total disability.
- "Eligible service member" means a full-time active duty member of any branch of the uniformed servicesof the United States.
- 75 "Veteran" has the same meaning ascribed to such term in § 2.2-2903.
- B. An employer may grant preference in hiring and promotion to a veteran or the spouse of a disabled veteran *or the spouse of an eligible service member*.
- 78 C. Granting preference under subsection B does not violate any local or state equal employment79 opportunity law.
