6	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 32.1-134.03, relating to maternal
7	health; protocols and resources for hospitals and outpatient providers.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 32.1-134.03 as follows:
10	§ 32.1-134.03. Maternal health; protocols and resources for hospitals and outpatient providers.
11	A. In order to improve maternal health outcomes and address the most common causes of maternal
12	mortality in the Commonwealth, the Virginia Neonatal Perinatal Collaborative (VNPC) shall:
13	1. Develop training materials and standardized management protocols for inpatient providers regarding
14	the treatment of obstetric emergencies, the recognition of urgent maternal warning signs, and the transfer of
15	pregnant and postpartum patients, based on clinical safety bundles established by the Alliance for Innovation
16	on Maternal Health; and
17	2. Develop training materials and provider-specific checklists for outpatient providers regarding the
18	treatment of obstetric emergencies, the recognition of urgent maternal warning signs, and the transfer of
19	pregnant and postpartum patients, based on clinical safety bundles established by the Alliance for Innovation
20	on Maternal Health.
21	B. When adopting such protocols, VNPC shall collaborate with facilities and account for their specific
22	resources, patient populations, and care models.
23	C. All hospitals with an emergency department or labor and delivery, freestanding emergency
24	departments, and birthing centers as defined in § 63.2-1914 shall implement standardized protocols for
25	identifying and responding to obstetric emergencies, including obstetric hemorrhage, preeclampsia,
26	eclampsia, and other life-threatening conditions based on the protocols developed by the VNPC.
27	D. The VNPC shall collect data regarding implementation of the protocols and maternal health outcomes
28	and submit a report annually by October 1 to the Secretary of Health and Human Resources and the
29	Chairmen of the Senate Committee on Education and Health, the Senate Committee on Finance and
30	Appropriations, the House Committee on Health and Human Services, and the House Committee on
