## **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 307**

Celebrating the life of Joy Ann Durham Painter.

WHEREAS, outside of her career, Joy Painter offered her leadership and wise insights to several civic and social organizations, including the ACCA Shrine Center and the Ladies Oriental Shrine of North America ACCABA Court No. 105; and

WHEREAS, Joy Painter enjoyed fellowship and worship with the Richmond community as a member of Derbyshire Baptist Church, where she expressed her faith through her vocal talents as a member of the choir; and

WHEREAS, predeceased by her husband, Bill, and her daughter, April, Joy Painter will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by her son, J.E. Dilday, and stepson, Scott Painter; her children's families; and numerous other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby note with great sadness the loss of Joy Ann Durham Painter; and, be it
