Bill Title: Department of Wildlife Resources; propagation of wildlife without a permit unlawful;

premature separation; hybridization.

Bill Summary: The bill makes it illegal to prematurely separate mammalian wildlife offspring from their mother before the natural weaning period, except for medical reasons as determined by a licensed veterinarian. The Department of Wildlife Resources, with expert consultation, will define the appropriate weaning time for each species. This does not apply to transfers between accredited zoological facilities. Additionally, the bill prohibits intentionally hybridizing different mammalian species or housing them in conditions where they could do so for commercial purposes.

Budget Amendment Necessary: No. Items Impacted: N/A

Explanation: This bill involves the Department of Wildlife Resources (DWR), as well as local and regional

jails, courts, and localities. However, no budget action is required. See Fiscal Analysis

section, below.

Fiscal Summary: It is anticipated that any costs DWR may incur can be absorbed within existing resources.

Fiscal Analysis: This impact statement is preliminary. It is anticipated that DWR can absorb any costs associated with the implementation of this bill.

A Class 4 misdemeanor is punishable by a fine of up to \$250. These offenses do not carry jail time. All revenue collected from such fines is deposited into the Literary Fund. However, it is not possible to estimate either the number of convictions that may result or the amount of each fine that may be assessed under this legislation. Therefore, the impact of this bill cannot be determined.
