6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 23.1-610 of the Code of Virginia, relating to higher education; financial
7	assistance; Virginia National Guard State Tuition Assistance Program; eligibility criteria.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 23.1-610 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 23.1-610. Virginia National Guard State Tuition Assistance Program; grants.
11	A. Any Subject to regulations as prescribed by the Adjutant General, any individual who (i) is a member
12	of the Virginia National Guard and has a minimum remaining obligation of two years, (ii) has satisfactorily
13	completed required initial active duty service, (iii) is satisfactorily performing duty in accordance with
14	regulations of the National Guard, and (iv) is enrolled in any course or program and in good standing at any
15	public institution of higher education or accredited nonprofit private institution of higher education whose
16	primary purpose is to provide collegiate or graduate education and not to provide religious training or
17	theological education is eligible for a grant in the amount of the difference between the full cost of tuition and
18	any other educational benefits for which he is eligible as a member of the National Guard. Grants provided
19	under this section shall be subject to limitation based on the amount of funds appropriated for such purpose.
20	If applications for grants exceed the amount of funding appropriated, the Department of Military Affairs (the
21	Department) shall issue grants to eligible recipients based on the order in which applications were received.
22	B. Application for a grant shall be made to the Department no later than 30 days prior to the beginning of
23	an academic semester. The Department shall determine whether an applicant is eligible for the grant as
24	described in subsection A and communicate acceptance and any additional requirements determined by the
25	Department in writing no later than 30 days after receipt of an application. Applicants eligible for a grant
26	pursuant to this section shall:
27	1. Satisfy all financial obligations with the institution of higher education at the beginning of each
28	semester; and
29	2. Provide written proof of acceptable academic performance and good standing with the institution of
30	higher education for the current term to the Department no later than 30 days following the end of a term or

semester. Upon the receipt of proof of academic performance and continued good standing to the
Department, the Department shall issue grants in a manner and amount that is consistent with regulations
promulgated by the Adjutant General. As used in this subdivision, "academic performance" means (i)
achieving a passing grade in each course during the semester and (ii) maintaining a cumulative grade point
average of at least 2.0 on a scale of 4.0 or its equivalent, and "good standing" means that the individual has

C. Any member of the Virginia National Guard shall be eligible to receive a grant under this section if such member has two years remaining on his service obligation to the Virginia National Guard as of the last day of the last term or semester for which tuition assistance is requested. Service in the inactive National Guard, the active duty or reserve forces of the United States, or the National Guard of any other state shall not count as applicable service toward fulfilling this service obligation. Federal active duty mobilizations occurring while still a member of the Virginia National Guard and state active duty for the Commonwealth

fulfilled all obligations to the institution of higher education. Upon acceptance, grant funds shall be

disbursed to the applicable institution of higher education for credit against the recipient's student account.

D. The Department may utilize grant funding in order to recruit qualified applicants for service in the Virginia National Guard. The yearly funding amount for such recruitment shall be at the discretion of the Adjutant General and the Department and not exceed \$50,000 per fiscal year.
