6	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 1 of Title 9.1 an article numbered 17, consisting
7	of a section numbered 9.1-194, relating to the Virginia Center for Firearm Violence Intervention and
8	Prevention; creation.
9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 1 of Title 9.1 an article numbered 17,
11	consisting of a section numbered 9.1-194, as follows:
12	Article 17.
13	Virginia Center for Firearm Violence Intervention and Prevention.
14	§ 9.1-194. Virginia Center for Firearm Violence Intervention and Prevention created; duties.
15	A. From such funds as may be appropriated, the Virginia Center for Firearm Violence Intervention and
16	Prevention (the Center) is hereby established within the Department. The Center shall:
17	1. Serve as the Commonwealth's primary resource for research, best practices, and strategies for the
18	implementation of firearm violence intervention, community-based intervention, and group violence
19	intervention programs designed to reduce violence in communities;
20	2. Operate a statewide firearm violence intervention and prevention research center. The Center shall
21	serve as the Commonwealth's clearinghouse for data regarding firearm violence and firearm violence
22	intervention and prevention programs collected by state and local agencies and shall maintain an integrated
23	information system containing data, research, and statistical information regarding firearm violence in the
24	Commonwealth;
25	3. Facilitate sharing of data regarding firearm violence and firearm violence intervention and prevention
26	programs among state and local agencies, including local health departments, institutions of higher
27	education, research institutions, hospitals and other medical care facilities, community-based organizations,
28	and law-enforcement agencies;
29	4. In conjunction with the Department of Health, Department of Social Services, Department of
30	Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, Department of Education, and Department of Veterans

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31	Services, work to enhance programs and strategies designed to address firearm violence, including programs			
32	that focus on the prevention of suicide or domestic violence in the populations served by such departments;			
33	5. Facilitate coordination between state agencies, localities, and community-based organization.

57	12. Apply for and	l accept grants from the United States government or any	other source in carrying out	
58	the purposes of this	article and accept any and all donations, both real and pe	ersonal, and grants of money	

from any governmental unit or public agency, or from any institution, person, firm, or corporation, and may

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60	receive, utilize, and dispose of the same. Any moneys received pursuant to this section shall be deposited in
61	the state treasury to the account of the Department.
62	B. The Center may require and shall receive from every department, division, board, bureau, commission,
63	authority, or other agency created by the Commonwealth, or to which the Commonwealth is a party, or any
64	political subdivision thereof, cooperation and assistance in the performance of its duties. The Center may
65	also consult and exchange information with local government agencies and interested stakeholders,
66	institutions of higher education, research institutions, hospitals and other medical care facilities, and
67	community-based organizations.
68	C. The Center shall report annually on or before October 1 to the Governor and the General Assembly.
69	The report shall include a summary of activities for the year and any recommendations to address firearm
70	violence within the Commonwealth. The Department shall ensure that such report is available to the public.

71 2. That the provisions of this act shall become effective on July 1, 2026.
