WHEREAS, with a brave and adventurous spirit, Hunter Reedy could often be found racing at Wythe Raceway, where he won several feature races, and he was also undaunted by the challenge of bull riding; and

WHEREAS, Hunter Reedy was unwavering in his willingness and desire to help others, and he found no greater joy in life than to spend time with his family; and

WHEREAS, Hunter Reedy will be fondly remembered and dearly missed by his loving wife, Bettina; his children, Brantley, Kaden, and Kaede Belle; his parents, Chuck and Marie; and numerous other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Senate of Virginia hereby note with great sadness the loss of Hunter Dakota Reedy, a distinguished law-enforcement officer whose service and sacrifice will inspire others for generations to come; and, be it
