## 1 VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER 2 An Act to amend and reenact § 32.1-248.2 of the Code of Virginia, relating to local ordinances for the use of 3 certain rainwater harvesting systems. [S 851] 4 5 Approved Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6 1. That § 32.1-248.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 7 8 § 32.1-248.2. Use of rainwater and reuse of gray water; regulations. 9 A. The Board shall adopt regulations regarding the use of gray water and rainwater. The regulations shall (i) describe the conditions under which gray water and rainwater may appropriately be used and for what 10 purposes; (ii) include categories of gray water, such as types of used household water and used water from 11 businesses, that are appropriate for reuse; and (iii) include a definition of gray water that excludes used toilet 12 water. The regulations shall also provide standards for the use of rainwater harvesting systems, including 13 14 systems that collect rainwater for use by commercial enterprises but do not provide water for human 15 consumption, as defined in § 32.1-167. Such regulations shall not apply to water not for human consumption, as defined in § 32.1-167, including 16 17 gray water and rainwater, that is produced and utilized by any facility that is permitted through a Virginia Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit or General Virginia Pollution Abatement permit. 18 19 B. The Department, in conjunction with the Department of Environmental Quality, shall promote the use 20 of rainwater and reuse of gray water as means to reduce fresh water consumption, ease demands on public 21 treatment works and water supply systems, and promote conservation. C. The Department, in conjunction with the Department of Environmental Quality, shall consider 22 23 recognizing rainwater as an independent source of fresh water available for use by the residents of the 24 Commonwealth. 25 D. Existing local ordinances adopted prior to July 1, 2025, governing rainwater harvesting systems, shall 26 continue in force: however, in the event of a conflict between a Board regulation and a local ordinance 27 adopted prior to July 1, 2025, the Board regulation shall govern, except when the conflicting local ordinance 28 is more stringent. No locality shall adopt any local ordinance requiring owners of Tier 4 rainwater 29 harvesting systems, as that term is described in the Rainwater Harvesting System Regulations (12VAC-635), 30 to connect to any municipal water supply or impose any penalty, including condemnation proceedings, on such owner for failing to connect to a municipal water supply. For purposes of this subsection "rainwater 31 harvesting system" means a water system for collecting, storing, potentially treating, and distributing 32 33 rainwater for the use of water from such system.

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
