Bill Title: School boards; bleeding control programs; bleeding control kits; immunity from civil

liability.

Bill Summary: Requires, with such funds as may be provided by the General Assembly for such purpose, each school board to develop and implement a bleeding control program in each public elementary and secondary school in the local school division whereby the school board, among other things, requires bleeding control kits with certain enumerated contents such as bandages and tourniquets to be placed in each public elementary and secondary school building in locations designated as being easily accessible, requires that bleeding control kits be included in the emergency plans of the local school divisions, requires annual inspection of bleeding control kit inventories, and requires each bleeding control kit be restocked after each use.

Budget Amendment Necessary: No Items Impacted: None

Explanation: This bill establishes requirements for school divisions with such funds as may be provided in

the appropriation act; therefore a budget amendment is necessary only if funds are provided to implement the bill. The Department of Education can absorb any impact to

distribute provided funds. Any impact to local school divisions is indeterminate.
