Bill Summary: The enrolled bill directs the Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) to amend the state plan for medical assistance services to include a provision for payment for postpartum doula care. Such provision must ensure that eligible individuals receive up to 10 doula visits, with up to four doula visits during pregnancy and up to six doula visits during the 12 months after the individual gives birth, with additional visits permitted if such visits are deemed medically necessary. The bill also requires DMAS to report to the Governor and General Assembly annually on the implementation and outcomes of the provision with the first report being due on December 31, 2026.

Fiscal Analysis: Currently, Virginia Medicaid reimburses for doula services from the date of confirmed conception through 180 days after delivery, contingent on the individual maintaining Medicaid eligibility. Appropriation Act language (Chapter 2, Item 288, UUU.) requires DMAS to reimburse up to eight prenatal/postpartum visits and attendance at birth. Further, any service limits may be exceeded based upon medical necessity. The substitute bill would increase the number of doula visits by two to ten. DMAS estimates that the annual cost of these two visits would be \$17,188 (\$4,960 general fund).
