Bill Title: Pedestrian crossing violation monitoring systems and stop sign violation monitoring

systems; violation enforcement; civil penalty.

Bill Summary: Authorizes state and local law enforcement agencies to use traffic enforcement and monitoring systems, such as speed safety cameras, pedestrian crossing violation monitoring systems, or stop sign violation monitoring systems, in school crossing zones, highway work zones, and high-risk speed corridors to record and penalize traffic violations. Violations captured by these devices can result in civil penalties up to \$100. Collected penalties are allocated for traffic safety improvements. The bill requires state and local law enforcement agencies that use traffic enforcement and monitoring systems to report annually to the Department of State Police on various metrics, including traffic violations, prosecutions, operating costs, and civil penalties collected. Agencies are required to provide information and publicize changes about these systems on their websites and social media.

Requires at least two conspicuous signs for speed safety cameras, pedestrian crossing violation monitoring systems, or stop sign violation monitoring systems and to require one of such signs to be a speed display sign for speed safety cameras shall become effective on July 1, 2026.
