WHEREAS, in 1991, William Harris expanded the business to Chase City with the purchase of the former Giles Funeral Home and the creation of Giles-Harris Funeral Home and Cremation Services; he subsequently oversaw the opening of a new facility in Buffalo Junction after the Fourth Street building was destroyed by fire; and

WHEREAS, Harris Funeral Homes currently serves the Counties of Mecklenburg, Lunenburg, and Charlotte in Virginia and the counties of Vance, Granville, and Person in North Carolina from its two locations, Giles-Harris Funeral Home and Cremation Services in Chase City and C.H. Harris Funeral Home in Buffalo Junction; now, therefore, be it
