WHEREAS, the empowering and transformative programs at Camp Holiday Trails focus on helping campers build confidence, leadership abilities, and personal skills while learning to manage their medical diagnoses; and

WHEREAS, Camp Holiday Trails has fulfilled its mission through generous support from individuals, alumni, and community partners; and

WHEREAS, the compassionate volunteers, staff members, and medical professionals at Camp Holiday Trails work diligently to ensure every camper has access to meaningful programs and foster a sense of resilience, joy, and belonging; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, That Camp Holiday Trails hereby be commended on the occasion of its 50th anniversary; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to Camp Holiday Trails as an expression of the House of Delegates' admiration for its life-changing work to create new opportunities for children with a wide range of medical diagnoses throughout the Mid-Atlantic region.
