WHEREAS, Round the Mountain, a nonprofit organization dedicated to promoting and preserving Appalachian arts and culture, celebrates its 20th anniversary in 2025; and

WHEREAS, established in 2005, Round the Mountain fosters a network that connects artisans across Southwest Virginia and provides support through business development, marketing, and capacity-building initiatives; and

WHEREAS, Round the Mountain has facilitated the growth of local artisans, providing a platform for their work to be showcased both regionally and nationally; and

WHEREAS, Round the Mountain has expanded access to education and training programs for artists and artisans, strengthening the creative economy; and

WHEREAS, Round the Mountain has developed partnerships with local, regional, and national organizations, which increased visibility for Southwest Virginia's artisans; and

WHEREAS, Round the Mountain contributed to the region's tourism by encouraging visitors to explore the arts, crafts, and cultural heritage of Southwest Virginia; and

WHEREAS, Round the Mountain established artisan galleries at the Southwest Virginia Cultural Center and Marketplace, formerly known as Heartwood, providing a permanent space for regional artisans to showcase and sell their work, as well as a cultural hub to bolster the local economy and cultural tourism; and

WHEREAS, over the last two decades, Round the Mountain has played a pivotal role by supporting artisans, fostering community growth and economic development, and helping create sustainable tourism initiatives that highlight the arts and cultural heritage of the region; now, therefore, be it
