WHEREAS, Buck Manning began teaching in Portsmouth Public Schools in 1967; he mentored and inspired students as a teacher at William E. Waters Junior High School, Manor High School, and Craddock High School, where he also served as a junior varsity basketball coach and strove to help students achieve their fullest potential on and off the court; and

WHEREAS, Buck Manning went above and beyond to provide for his family, working on the night shift at the United States Gypsum Corporation and holding summer jobs with the City of Portsmouth Maintenance Department and the City of Chesapeake's Tidewater Detention Home; and

WHEREAS, Buck Manning enjoyed fellowship and worship with the congregation of St. John Baptist Church, where he held several leadership roles; and

WHEREAS, Buck Manning's greatest joy in life was his family, and he relished every opportunity to support his children and grandchildren in all their pursuits; and

WHEREAS, Buck Manning will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his wife of 57 years, Bertha; his sons, Laurence, Jr., and Michael, and their families; and numerous other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it
