WHEREAS, Nathaniel Jasper currently serves as a school resource officer and strives to impart his wisdom, compassion, and dedication to duty to local young people, giving them the tools they need to become more engaged citizens and future leaders; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of his personal and professional accomplishments, Nathaniel Jasper has received the Culpeper Colonel Award, the L.B. Henretty Memorial Outstanding Citizen Award from the Culpeper Chamber of Commerce, the Amazing Citizen Award from the Culpeper Police Department, and the Outstanding Officer of the Year Award from the Culpeper Optimist Club, among many others; now, therefore, be it
