WHEREAS, Joyce Gatling was also a committed community leader and political activist, serving as chaplain of the Portsmouth City Democratic Committee and as a lifetime member of the NAACP, offering spiritual guidance, civic leadership, and an unshakable voice for equality and justice; and

WHEREAS, Joyce Gatling's legacy of faith, compassion, and service will continue to shine through all who were blessed to know her, and her memory shall remain a beacon of light and inspiration; and
