Commending Bishop Jerome L. Williams and Pastor Shajuan E. Williams.

WHEREAS, Bishop Jerome L. Williams and Pastor Shajuan E. Williams have provided 25 years of faithful and visionary pastoral leadership at New Testament Church Ministries in Portsmouth; and

WHEREAS, Jerome Williams holds a bachelor's degree in religious education from Smith Chapel Bible University, a master's degree in ministry from Richmond Virginia Seminary, and a Doctor of Ministry degree from Virginia University of Lynchburg, where he is also a member of the Leonard N. Smith Fellows; and

WHEREAS, Shajuan Williams, the executive pastor of New Testament Church Ministries and co-founder of Changing Hearts International Fellowship, is a dedicated servant leader, known for her grace, excellence, and deep spiritual insight; and

WHEREAS, Shajuan Williams was licensed to preach in 1997, ordained as an elder in 2007, and consecrated as executive pastor in 2010, and her ministry is marked by a heart for the lost and a desire to see others experience the fullness of joy in God's presence; and

WHEREAS, Shajuan Williams' messages consistently emphasize faithfulness, obedience, and empowerment, as she labors faithfully beside her husband, serving as a mentor, teacher, and spiritual mother to many; and

WHEREAS, Bishop and Pastor Williams are devoted partners in life and ministry, loving parents to their son, Jerrod, and proud grandparents to Journi and Jenesis, modeling a faith-centered family and tireless dedication to the call of God; now, therefore, be it
