9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

10 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 9.3 of Title 24.2 an article numbered 3.1,
11 consisting of a section numbered 24.2-948.10, as follows:

12 Article 3.1.

13 *Public Campaign Financing.*14 **§ 24.2-948.10. System of public campaign financing.**15 A. Subject to the provisions of this section, the governing body of a county or city may establish, by
16 ordinance, a system of public campaign financing for elected local offices. The ordinance shall specify the
17 criteria for use in determining whether a candidate is eligible for public campaign financing.

18 B. A system of public campaign financing established in a county or city pursuant to this section shall:

19 1. Provide for the participation of candidates in public campaign financing on a strictly voluntary basis.
20 Candidates who do not choose to participate in the system of public campaign financing shall not be
21 regulated pursuant to (i) this section or (ii) any ordinance adopted pursuant to this section.22 2. Prohibit the use of public campaign financing for any campaign except a campaign for an elected local
23 office.24 3. Require a candidate who accepts public campaign financing to (i) designate a campaign depository
25 solely for the campaign of the elected local office and (ii) use funds from that campaign depository only for
26 the campaign of the elected local office for which it was designated.27 4. Prohibit a candidate who accepts public campaign financing from transferring funds (i) to the
28 campaign depository designated for the campaign of the elected local office from any other campaign
29 depository designated for the candidate and (ii) from the campaign depository designated for the campaign
30 of the elected local office to any other campaign depository.31 C. The governing body of a county or city that establishes a system of public campaign financing shall
32 provide for a public election fund for elected local offices. Such fund shall be administered by the treasurer of
33 the county or city.34 D. A system of public campaign financing established pursuant to this section may provide for more
35 stringent regulation of the campaign finance activity by candidates participating in the system of public
36 campaign financing than provided by this chapter, including regulations regarding contributions,
37 expenditures, and reporting requirements, and may impose civil penalties for violations.38 E. Any system of public campaign financing established pursuant to this section shall be subject to
39 regulation and oversight by the State Board to ensure conformity and compliance with state law and policy to
40 the extent practicable.
