4 *A BILL to amend and reenact § 18.2-371.2 of the Code of Virginia, relating to sale of retail tobacco products*  
5 *and hemp products intended for smoking to persons younger than 21 years of age; civil penalty paid to*  
6 *locality.*

9 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**

10 **1. That § 18.2-371.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**

11 **§ 18.2-371.2. Prohibiting purchase or possession of retail tobacco products and hemp products**  
12 **instead of smoking by a person under 21 years of age or sale of retail tobacco products and hemp**  
13 **products intended for smoking to persons under 21 years of age; civil penalties.**

14 A. No person shall sell to, distribute to, purchase for, or knowingly permit the purchase by any person  
15 younger than 21 years of age, knowing or having reason to believe that such person is younger than 21 years  
16 of age, any retail tobacco product or hemp product intended for smoking.

17 No person shall sell retail tobacco products or hemp products intended for smoking from a vending  
18 machine.

19 B. No person shall sell a retail tobacco product or hemp product intended for smoking to any individual  
20 who does not demonstrate, by producing a driver's license or similar photo identification issued by a  
21 government agency, that the individual is at least 21 years of age.

22 Before a retail dealer may sell retail tobacco products, other than cigar and pipe tobacco products as  
23 defined in § 58.1-1021.01, to any consumer, the person selling, offering for sale, giving, or furnishing the  
24 retail tobacco products shall verify that the consumer is of legal age by examining from any person who  
25 appears to be under 30 years of age a government-issued photographic identification that establishes that the  
26 person is of legal age or, if required pursuant to subdivision C 4 b of § 58.1-1021.04:1 or subdivision B 2 b of  
27 § 59.1-293.12, verifying the identification presented using identification fraud detection software,  
28 technology, or a scanner that confirms the authenticity of such identification.

29 This subsection shall not apply to mail order or Internet sales, provided that the person offering the retail  
30 tobacco product or hemp product intended for smoking for sale through mail order or the Internet (i) prior to  
31 the sale of the retail tobacco product or hemp product intended for smoking verifies that the purchaser is at  
32 least 21 years of age through a commercially available database that is regularly used by businesses or  
33 governmental entities for the purpose of age and identity verification and (ii) uses a method of mailing,  
34 shipping, or delivery that requires the signature of a person at least 21 years of age before the retail tobacco  
35 product or hemp product intended for smoking will be released to the purchaser.

36 C. A violation of subsection A or B by an individual or by a separate retail establishment is punishable by  
37 a civil penalty in the amount of \$500 for a first violation and a civil penalty in the amount of \$2,500 for a  
38 second or subsequent violation within a three-year period. If applicable, upon a second or subsequent  
39 violation within a three-year period, the Department of Taxation may suspend or revoke any approved  
40 license, permit, or registration issued pursuant to subsection C of § 58.1-1021.04:1.

41 For any violation of this section by an employee of a retail establishment, (i) such penalty shall be  
42 assessed against the establishment and (ii) an additional penalty of \$100 shall be assessed against the  
43 employee.

44 Any attorney for the Commonwealth of the county or city in which an alleged violation occurred may  
45 bring an action to recover the civil penalty, which shall be paid into the ~~state treasury~~ *local treasury*. Any  
46 law-enforcement officer may issue a summons for a violation of subsection A or B.

47 D. 1. Cigarettes and hemp products intended for smoking shall be sold only in sealed packages provided  
48 by the manufacturer, with the required health warning. The proprietor of every retail establishment that offers  
49 for sale any retail tobacco product or hemp product intended for smoking shall post in a conspicuous manner  
50 and place a sign or signs indicating that the sale of retail tobacco products or hemp products intended for  
51 smoking to any person under 21 years of age is prohibited by law. Any attorney for the county, city, or town  
52 in which an alleged violation of this subsection occurred may enforce this subsection by civil action to  
53 recover a civil penalty not to exceed \$500. The civil penalty shall be paid into the local treasury. No filing fee  
54 or other fee or cost shall be charged to the county, city, or town which instituted the action.

55 2. For the purpose of compliance with regulations of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services  
56 Administration published at 61 Federal Register 1492, the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services

59 may promulgate regulations which allow the Department to undertake the activities necessary to comply with  
60 such regulations.

61 3. Any attorney for the county, city, or town in which an alleged violation of this subsection occurred may  
62 enforce this subsection by civil action to recover a civil penalty not to exceed \$500. The civil penalty shall be  
63 paid into the local treasury. No filing fee or other fee or cost shall be charged to the county, city, or town  
64 which instituted the action.

65 E. Nothing in this section shall be construed to create a private cause of action.

66 F. Agents of the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority designated pursuant to § 4.1-105 may  
67 issue a summons for any violation of this section. Additionally, any retailer selling retail tobacco products  
68 shall be subject to the enforcement and compliance provisions of Chapter 23.2 (§ 59.1-293.10 et seq.) of Title  
69 59.1.

70 G. As used in this section:

71 "Electronic smoking device" means any device that may be used to deliver any aerosolized or vaporized  
72 substance to the person inhaling from the device, including an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, vape pen, or e-  
73 hookah. "Electronic smoking device" includes any component, part, or accessory of the device, whether or  
74 not sold separately, and also includes any substance intended to be aerosolized or vaporized during the use of  
75 the device, whether or not the substance contains nicotine. "Electronic smoking device" does not include any  
76 (i) battery or battery charger when sold separately or (ii) device used for heated tobacco products. "Electronic  
77 smoking device" does not include drugs or devices, as such terms are defined in 21 U.S.C. § 321, or  
78 combination products, as such term is used in 21 U.S.C. § 353, if such drugs, devices, or combination  
79 products are authorized for sale by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

80 "Hemp product" and "hemp product intended for smoking" mean the same as those terms are defined in  
81 § 3.2-4112.

82 "Retail tobacco product" means (i) any product containing, made of, or derived from tobacco or that  
83 contains nicotine that is intended for human consumption or is likely to be consumed, whether smoked,  
84 heated, chewed, dissolved, inhaled, absorbed, or ingested by other means, including a cigarette, a heated  
85 tobacco product, a cigar, pipe tobacco, chewing tobacco, snuff, or snus; (ii) any electronic smoking device  
86 and any substances that may be aerosolized or vaporized by such device, whether or not the substance  
87 contains nicotine; and (iii) any component, part, or accessory of a product described in clause (i) or (ii),  
88 whether or not such component, part, or accessory contains tobacco or nicotine, including filters, rolling  
89 papers, blunt or hemp wraps, and pipes. "Retail tobacco product" includes any nicotine vapor product as that  
90 term is defined in § 58.1-1021.01. "Retail tobacco product" does not include drugs or devices, as such terms  
91 are defined in 21 U.S.C. § 321, or combination products, as such term is used in 21 U.S.C. § 353, if such  
92 drugs, devices, or combination products are authorized for sale by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

93 "Wrappings" includes materials made or sold for covering or rolling tobacco or other materials for  
94 smoking in a manner similar to a cigarette or cigar.
