9                           Committee Referral Pending10                          WHEREAS, artificial intelligence (AI) brings tremendous potential to transform education at all levels;  
11                          and12                          WHEREAS, integration of AI in education is critical in order to equip students with the skills, knowledge,  
13                          and competencies necessary to use AI responsibly and effectively, so that AI can be used to amplify learning  
14                          rather than shortcircuiting it; and15                          WHEREAS, integration of AI in education must be done deliberately and with ongoing monitoring and  
16                          oversight; and17                          WHEREAS, state-level action is pivotal to the creation of a unified framework for AI use in education  
18                          and the adoption of statewide AI literacy standards is equally critical; and19                          WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 30 (2024) called for the promulgation of safety standards and  
20                          guidelines for the use of AI and directed the development and issuance of tools, instructional resources, and  
21                          support to assist with the implementation and use of AI at postsecondary institutions; now, therefore, be it22                          RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and  
23                          Review Commission be directed to study the artificial intelligence use policies in place at the institutions of  
24                          higher education in the Commonwealth.25                          In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission (JLARC) shall conduct a  
26                          survey of the AI use policies that have been adopted or are being considered by the institutions of higher  
27                          education in the Commonwealth, including AI use policies that may be applicable only to a subset of the  
28                          institution, and evaluate each policy in terms of how it addresses (i) academic integrity, (ii) data privacy, (iii)  
29                          equity and access, (iv) transparency, and (v) faculty autonomy and instructional agency. JLARC shall  
30                          develop a model policy for AI use in institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth, as well as make  
31                          recommendations for AI tools, curricula, and other resources that could be included in a statewide  
32                          clearinghouse for educators and students at institutions of higher education, in addition to the public at large.33                          Technical assistance shall be provided to JLARC by the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia,  
34                          the Virginia Community College System, and the Virginia Information Technologies Agency. All agencies of  
35                          the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to JLARC for this study, upon request.36                          JLARC shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2026, and the chair shall submit to the Division of  
37                          Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the  
38                          first day of the 2027 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether  
39                          JLARC intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and  
40                          recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be  
41                          submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing  
42                          of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
