4 A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 2 of Title 9.1 a section numbered 9.1-208.2,
5 relating to Department of Fire Programs; Virginia Fire Personnel and Equipment Grant Program

9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

10 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 2 of Title 9.1 a section numbered
11 9.1-208.2 as follows:

12 § 9.1-208.2. **Virginia Fire Personnel and Equipment Grant Program; report.**

13 A. The Virginia Fire Personnel and Equipment Grant Program (the Program) is hereby established to
14 award grants to localities on a competitive basis from such funds as may be available for the purpose
15 described in subsections B and C. Grants shall be awarded in an amount to be established in the
16 appropriation act, and the Program shall be administered by the Department of Fire Programs (the
17 Department).

18 B. 1. a. The Department shall award grants to localities on a competitive basis for the purpose of
19 increasing the number of firefighters to help communities meet required standards and to ensure adequate
20 protection from fire and fire-related hazards. Such grants shall be made for up to three years and shall be
21 used by localities for programs to (i) hire new, additional full-time firefighters; (ii) convert part-time or
22 volunteer firefighters to full-time firefighters; and (iii) recruit and retain volunteer firefighters.

23 b. The portion of the cost of hiring a firefighter, including salary and benefits, that may be covered by the
24 grants authorized by this subsection shall not exceed (i) 75 percent in the first or second year of the grant
25 and (ii) 35 percent in the third year of the grant.

26 c. No less than 50 percent of funds allocated to the Program for purposes of this subsection shall be used
27 each year to provide grants to departments with majority volunteer or all volunteer personnel.

28 2. In addition to the requirements described in subsection D, the Department shall require each
29 application for a grant under this subsection to (i) include an explanation of the applicant's inability to
30 address the need for funding without assistance from the Commonwealth and (ii) describe the locality's plan
31 to retain firefighters following the conclusion of support from the grant provided by this subsection.

32 3. Any grants awarded pursuant to this subsection shall not be used to supplant any funds currently
33 provided by the Commonwealth or by the locality prior to the receipt of a grant and shall be used to increase
34 the total amount of funds available for the provision of firefighting services. Additionally, no grant shall be
35 made to any locality whose annual expenditures for firefighting services at the time of the application have
36 been reduced below 80 percent of the average level of funding provided by the locality for firefighting
37 services in the three fiscal years prior to the date of the application for a grant.

38 4. The Department may waive the requirements of subdivision 1 b or 3 in the case of demonstrated
39 economic hardship for the locality. Instances of demonstrated economic hardship shall be determined by the
40 Department, taking into consideration whether the locality is distressed or double distressed, as those terms
41 are defined in subdivision 28 of § 58.1-322.02, and the demonstrated need for funding described by the
42 locality as part of its application pursuant to clause (i) of subdivision 2. The Department shall develop
43 guidelines and criteria for evaluating waiver claims pursuant to this subdivision.

44 5. If the Department determines that a grant recipient is not in substantial compliance with the terms and
45 requirements of a grant provided under this subsection, the Department may revoke or suspend funding of
46 such grant, in whole or in part, or require repayment of grant funds.

47 C. 1. The Department shall award grants to localities on a competitive basis for the purpose of improving
48 their firefighting and emergency medical services as described in this subsection. Each locality receiving a
49 grant shall use the grant for one or more of the following purposes:

50 a. Acquiring firefighting and emergency medical services vehicles, including fire trucks, ambulances, and
51 other apparatus;

52 b. Acquiring firefighting and emergency medical services equipment, including personal protective
53 equipment; stretchers or other medical equipment; communications, monitoring, or disaster response
54 equipment; and foam for fighting fires in areas without access to water; and

55 c. Modifying fire stations, fire training facilities, emergency medical services facilities, and other facilities
56 to protect the health and safety of firefighting and emergency medical services personnel.

59 2. In addition to the requirements described in subsection D, the Department shall require each
60 application for a grant under this subsection to (i) include an explanation of the applicant's inability to
61 address the need for funding without assistance from the Commonwealth and (ii) describe the locality's plan
62 to maintain its level of services following the conclusion of support from the grant provided by this
63 subsection.

64 3. In considering applications for grants under this subsection, the Department shall examine:
65 a. The extent to which the grant would enhance the daily operations of the applicant and the impact of
66 such a grant on the protection of lives and property; and
67 b. Factors important to the applicant's ability to respond to fires and related hazards, including
68 population served; geographic response area; hazard vulnerability; call volume; economic conditions of the
69 area served; and the need for apparatus or equipment.

70 4. Any grants awarded pursuant to this subsection shall not be used to supplant any funds currently
71 provided by the Commonwealth or by the locality prior to receipt of a grant and shall be used to increase the
72 total amount of funds available for the provision of firefighting or emergency medical services. Additionally,
73 no grant shall be made to any locality whose annual expenditures for firefighting or emergency medical
74 services at the time of the application have been reduced below 80 percent of the average level of funding
75 provided by the locality for firefighting and emergency medical services in the three fiscal years prior to the
76 date of the application for a grant.

77 5. The Department may waive the requirements of subdivision 4 in the case of demonstrated economic
78 hardship for the locality. Instances of demonstrated economic hardship shall be determined by the
79 Department, taking into consideration whether the locality is distressed or double distressed, as those terms
80 are defined in subdivision 28 of § 58.1-322.02, and the demonstrated need for funding described by the
81 locality as part of its application pursuant to clause (i) of subdivision 2. The Department shall develop
82 guidelines and criteria for evaluating waiver claims pursuant to this subdivision.

83 6. No locality shall receive a grant pursuant to this subsection unless the locality provides matching funds
84 from local sources of revenue equal to at least 15 percent of the value of the grant to carry out grant
85 activities.

86 7. If the Department determines that a grant recipient is not in substantial compliance with the terms and
87 requirements of a grant provided under this subsection, the Department may revoke or suspend funding of
88 such grant, in whole or in part, or require repayment of grant funds.

89 D. In administering the Program, the Department shall establish and publish guidelines and criteria for
90 grant awards, including guidelines and criteria governing agreements between the Department and grant
91 recipients relating to the use of grant funds. The Department shall also develop and implement a
92 performance assessment system, including quantifiable performance metrics, to evaluate the effectiveness of
93 grants in accomplishing the purposes described in this section.

94 E. The Department shall submit a report annually, beginning November 1, 2027, to the Governor and the
95 General Assembly containing a list of grants, the amount of each approved grant, information on the
96 performance assessment system described in subsection D, an evaluation of each grant based on such system,
97 and any other criteria deemed relevant by the Department.
