4 *A BILL to amend and reenact § 19.2-387.3 of the Code of Virginia, relating to Substantial Risk Order*
5 *Reporting System established.*

8 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**

9 **1. That § 19.2-387.3 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**

10 **§ 19.2-387.3. Substantial Risk Order Registry; maintenance; access; Substantial Risk Order**
11 **Reporting System.**

12 A. The Department of State Police shall keep and maintain a computerized Substantial Risk Order
13 Registry (the Registry) for the entry of orders issued pursuant to § 19.2-152.13 or 19.2-152.14. The
14 Department of State Police shall make the Registry information available, upon request, to criminal justice
15 agencies, including local law-enforcement agencies, through the Virginia Criminal Information Network.

16 The Department of State Police may make the Registry information available upon request to institutions
17 of higher education and other research organizations or institutions in the Commonwealth. The Department of
18 State Police shall remove the names and other personal identifying information from the data before it is
19 released to the institution of higher education or research organization or other institution.

20 Registry information provided under this section shall be used only for the purposes of the administration
21 of criminal justice as defined in § 9.1-101, except as otherwise provided in this ~~subsection~~ section.

22 B. *The Department of State Police shall also establish a Substantial Risk Order Reporting System for the*
23 *purpose of tracking and reporting the entry of orders issued pursuant to § 19.2-152.13 or 19.2-152.14 by*
24 *locality. Such report by locality shall be published monthly by the Department of State Police and distributed*
25 *in an electronic format to the General Assembly and the Office of the Governor. The Department of State*
26 *Police shall remove the names and other personal identifying information from the data before the reports*
27 *are published.*

28 C. No liability shall be imposed upon any law-enforcement official who disseminates information or fails
29 to disseminate information in good faith compliance with the requirements of this section, but this provision
30 shall not be construed to grant immunity for gross negligence or willful misconduct.
