8 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**9 **1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 32.1-45.5 as follows:**10 **§ 32.1-45.5. *Opioid antagonist distribution program; reports.***11 *A. The Department shall maintain a list of all agencies and organizations that submit requests for and*
12 *receive opioid antagonists through its distribution program. At least quarterly, the Department shall submit a*
13 *report to the Chairs of the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Resources, House*
14 *Health and Human Services Committee, Senate Finance and Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and*
15 *Human Resources, and Senate Subcommittee on Health and the chair of the Virginia Opioid Abatement*
16 *Authority with the following information: (i) the name of the agency or organization; (ii) the county, city, or*
17 *town service area; (iii) the quantity, along with the specific formulation and dosage of opioid antagonist,*
18 *requested by the agency or organization in its most recent order, and the date the request was made; and (iv)*
19 *the quantity, along with the specific formulation and dosage of opioid antagonist, received by the agency or*
20 *organization in response to its most recent order, and the date the request was fulfilled.*21 *B. The Department shall develop a methodology to estimate annual opioid antagonist distribution*
22 *program costs. In developing such methodology, the Department shall use available data and consider*
23 *account saturation goals, community needs, local resources, and the costs of products. The Department shall*
24 *submit an annual report estimating the opioid antagonist distribution program costs for the following fiscal*
25 *year using such methodology to the Joint Commission on Health Care and the Chairs of the House*
26 *Appropriations Committee and the Senate Finance and Appropriations Committee by December 1 of each*
27 *year.*
