4 A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 23.1-3223, 23.1-3224, and 23.1-3227 of the Code of Virginia, relating to
5 public institutions of higher education; museums and other cultural institutions; Virginia Commission for
6 the Arts; revisions.

9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

10 1. That §§ 23.1-3223, 23.1-3224, and 23.1-3227 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as
11 follows:

12 § 23.1-3223. Duties of the Commission.

13 A. The Commission shall:

14 1. Stimulate, *fund*, and encourage throughout the Commonwealth growth in artistic quality and
15 excellence, public interest and participation in the arts, and access to high-quality and affordable literary,
16 visual, and performing arts for all Virginians;

17 2. Make recommendations concerning appropriate methods to encourage improve the economic viability,
18 an intellectually stimulating environment intellectual, and participatory environments for artists, and
19 participation in and appreciation of the arts to meet the legitimate needs and aspirations of persons in all parts
20 of the Commonwealth;

21 3. Promote the development and implementation of a planned, sequential, and comprehensive program of
22 *Support supplemental arts education programs, taught by licensed teachers endorsed in arts education*
23 *including performances and workshops*, in the public elementary and secondary schools of the
24 Commonwealth;

25 4. Provide supplemental learning opportunities to the public school arts education curriculum;

26 5. Encourage the development of *Develop a network of professional arts professionals, including*
27 *presenters, arts organizations, and the media, and arts promoters for the production of classical and new*
28 *works of art and diversity in artistic expressions in media including the literary, visual, and performing arts*
29 *that reflects a variety of artistic disciplines and backgrounds*;

30 6. Provide funding for and technical assistance to artists, recognized nonprofit arts organizations,
31 localities, and arts organizations and activities that celebrate and preserve the various cultures represented
32 among the citizens of in the Commonwealth;

33 7. Encourage and support arts organizations in the creation of new works of art, arts organizations
34 whose primary objective is to increase public access to the arts, particularly in underserved areas, and
35 performing arts tours to increase the availability of this form of artistic expression and the expansion of
36 access to these works throughout the Commonwealth;

37 8. Establish a program of financial assistance to provide scholarships, grants, and other awards to artists
38 who demonstrate exceptional ability and talent;

39 9. Establish an advisory panel composed of artists, arts administrators, and citizens to advise the
40 Commission concerning fiscal matters as needed;

41 10. Encourage arts organizations to dedicate to their endowments at least \$1 of the price of each adult
42 admission to performances or exhibitions or at least one percent of moneys collected in fund campaigns;

43 11. Encourage arts organizations to develop and implement plans for long-term fiscal sustainability,
44 including financial management and control capabilities, endowment enlargement plans that yield enough
45 income to underwrite one-third of the organizations' annual operating costs, and fundraising from
46 nongovernmental sources;

47 12. Apply to and enter into contracts and agreements with the United States or any appropriate agency
48 or officer of the United States for participation in or receipt of funding from any federal program respecting
49 the arts;

50 13. Provide incentives to local governing bodies to encourage public support and funding of the arts;

51 14. Accept, hold, and administer gifts, contributions, and bequests of money or any other thing to be
52 used for carrying out the purposes of this article;

53 15. Develop specific procedures for the administration and implementation of a grantmaking program,
54 so long as any such program is for the benefit of a nonprofit organization qualifying as a § 501(c)(3)
55 organization under the Internal Revenue Code and prepare written guidelines to govern such program;

56 16. Administer any funds available to the Commission and disburse such funds in accordance with the

70 B. Nothing in this article shall be construed to affect the statutory purposes of the Virginia Museum of
71 Fine Arts.

72 **§ 23.1-3224. Executive Director of the Commission.**

73 The Governor ~~may~~ shall appoint ~~a~~ *an executive* director of the Commission, who shall serve at the
74 pleasure of the Governor. The *executive* director may employ the personnel required to assist the Commission
75 in the exercise and performance of its powers and duties. The *executive* director shall supervise and manage
76 such personnel and shall prepare, approve, and submit all requests for appropriations and be responsible for
77 all expenditures pursuant to appropriations, *including all appropriations made to the Virginia Commission*
78 *for the Arts Fund established pursuant to § 23.1-3227.*

79 **§ 23.1-3227. Virginia Commission for the Arts Fund.**

80 A. There is created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the Virginia
81 Commission for the Arts Fund, referred to in this article as "the Fund." The Fund shall be established on the
82 books of the Comptroller.

83 B. The Fund shall include such funds as may be appropriated by the General Assembly; revenues
84 transferred to the Fund from the special license plates for Virginians for the Arts program pursuant to
85 § 46.2-749.2:2; voluntary contributions collected through the income tax checkoff for the arts pursuant to
86 subdivision B 8 of § 58.1-344.3; and designated gifts, contributions, and bequests of money, securities, or
87 property of any other character.

88 C. All money, securities, or other property designated for the Fund shall be paid into the state treasury and
89 credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it.
90 Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert
91 to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. *Moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for the purposes of*
92 *supporting initiatives relating to the duties of the Commission set forth in § 23.1-3223.* Expenditures and
93 disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller
94 upon written request signed by persons authorized by the ~~Commission~~ *executive director of the Commission.*
95 The Fund's principal is not subject to expenditure by the Commission.
