

**Fiscal Analysis:** Using available maternity claims, it is estimated that approximately 36,779 pregnant women per month would be made eligible for remote patient monitoring under the provisions of this bill. This number excludes those high-risk pregnancies that are already provided with remote patient monitoring services. It is unclear how many newly eligible members would utilize remote patient monitoring services. For the purposes of this cost estimate, it is assumed that 40 percent of these members would utilize services each month. Based on a twelve-month average of actual remote monitoring expenditures, the monthly cost of providing services is estimated to be \$23.87. The service duration is projected to cover six months during pregnancy and 12 months postpartum. The total cost of expanding remote patient monitoring services, as provided for in the bill, is estimated to be \$5.8 million (\$2.2 million general fund) in FY 2027. A typical growth rate of five percent is assumed for subsequent years. Only 11 months of costs are assumed in the first year due to payment lag.
