5. **Summary/Purpose:**

This bill would authorize the governing body of any locality to provide by ordinance procedures for the adjustment of bills and account balances for taxes and other charges due to the locality to account for the cessation of production of the penny coin by the United States Mint. The authorization provided by the bill would include providing for the rounding of such bills and account balances to the nearest five-cent increment and the write-down or write-off of sums due that are less than five cents.

If enacted during the regular session of the 2026 General Assembly, this bill would become effective July 1, 2026.
