1 SENATE BILL NO. 311

2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
3 (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections
4 on January 27, 2026)

5 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Ebbin)

6 A BILL to provide for the submission to the voters of a proposed amendment to Section 15-A of Article I of
7 the Constitution of Virginia, relating to marriage between two adult persons; repeal of same-sex marriage
8 prohibition.

9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

10 1. It shall be the duty of the officers conducting the election directed by law to be held on the Tuesday
11 after the first Monday in November 2026, at the places appointed for holding the same, to open a poll and
12 take the sense of the qualified voters upon the ratification or rejection of the proposed amendment to the
13 Constitution of Virginia, contained herein and in the joint resolution proposing such amendment, to wit:

14 Amend Section 15-A of Article I of the Constitution of Virginia as follows:

15 ARTICLE I
16 BILL OF RIGHTS

17 Section 15-A. Marriage.

18 That only a union between one man and one woman may be a marriage valid in or recognized by this
19 Commonwealth and its political subdivisions marriage is one of the vital personal rights essential to the
20 orderly pursuit of happiness.21 This Commonwealth and its political subdivisions shall not create or recognize a legal status for
22 relationships of unmarried individuals that intends to approximate the design, qualities, significance, or
23 effects of marriage deny the issuance of a marriage license to two adult persons seeking a lawful marriage on
24 the basis of the sex, gender, or race of such persons. Nor shall this Commonwealth or its political
25 subdivisions create or recognize another union, partnership, or other legal status to which is assigned the
26 rights, benefits, obligations, qualities, or effects of marriage. This Commonwealth and its political
27 subdivisions shall recognize any lawful marriage between two adult persons and treat such marriages
28 equally under the law, regardless of the sex, gender, or race of such persons.

29 § 2. The ballot shall contain the following question:

30 "Question: Should the Constitution of Virginia be amended to (i) remove the ban on same-sex marriage;
31 (ii) affirm that two adults may marry regardless of sex, gender, or race; and (iii) require all legally valid
32 marriages to be treated equally under the law?"33 The ballots shall be prepared, distributed and voted, and the results of the election shall be ascertained and
34 certified, in the manner prescribed by § 24.2-684 of the Code of Virginia. The State Board of Elections shall
35 comply with § 30-19.9 of the Code and shall cause to be sent to the electoral boards of each county and city
36 sufficient copies of the full text of the amendment and question contained herein for the officers of election to
37 post in each polling place on election day.38 The electoral board of each county and city shall make out, certify, and forward an abstract of the votes
39 cast for and against such proposed amendment in the manner now prescribed by law in relation to votes cast
40 in general elections.41 The State Board of Elections shall open and canvass such abstracts and examine and report the whole
42 number of votes cast at the election for and against such amendment in the manner now prescribed by law in
43 relation to votes cast in general elections. The State Board of Elections shall record a certified copy of such
44 report in its office and without delay make out and transmit to the Governor an official copy of such report,
45 certified by it. The Governor shall without delay make proclamation of the result, stating therein the
46 aggregate vote for and against the amendment.

47 If a majority of those voting vote in favor of the amendment, it shall become effective on January 1, 2027.

48 The expenses incurred in conducting this election shall be defrayed as in the case of election of members
49 of the General Assembly.
