Bill Title: Competitive bidding for compost

Bill Summary: The amended legislation allows that when determining the award of any contract for compost or other products containing organic soil amendments to be purchased for use by a locality or the governing body of a locality may, in the case of a tie bid, give preference to compost or other products containing organic soil amendments produced in such locality or provided by persons, firms, or corporations maintaining a principal place of business in such locality, if such option is available. The amendment also details the separation of organic waste that may be required and the penalties that may be imposed for failure to comply. Finally, it delineates the waste disposal infrastructure for new public school buildings and facilities and improvements and renovations to existing public school buildings and facilities.
