**Bill Title:** Hospitals; itemized statements; non-emergent procedures, tests, or services

**Bill Summary:** The proposed legislation requires hospitals to provide patients with an itemized statement of charges for services rendered for any non-emergent medical procedure, test, or service.

**Budget Amendment Necessary:** No

**Item Impacted:** 190

**Explanation:** The University of Virginia (UVA) Health System, which includes the UVA Medical Center, reports that this legislation would increase costs. However, no budget amendment is necessary as the medical center has a sum sufficient nongeneral fund appropriation.

**Fiscal Summary:** This statement has been revised to reflect the fiscal impact on the UVA Health System.

**Fiscal Analysis:** The UVA Health System estimates an additional annual cost of \$2.4 million to comply with the requirements proposed in this bill. Operations of the UVA Health System are fully supported by revenues generated by the entity. As a component of UVA, the UVA Medical Center has a sum sufficient state nongeneral fund appropriation in Item 190 of HB/SB 30 to reflect the anticipated expenditure of revenues generated by the Medical Center. Any impact on the nongeneral fund appropriation for the UVA Medical Center from this legislation is indeterminate.
