**Bill Title:** Public schools; student instruction; addictive potential of time spent using certain electronic devices.

**Bill Summary:** Requires instruction concerning time spent using electronic devices such as computers, cell phones, and other smart devices and the addictive potential thereof to be provided by the public schools as prescribed by the Board of Education.
