Bill Title: Public elementary and secondary schools; student diabetes medical care and management.

Bill Summary: Establishes several provisions relating to student diabetes medical care and management in public elementary and secondary schools in the Commonwealth, including (i) defining relevant terms; (ii) requiring and permitting certain diabetes management-related tasks by certain trained school employees; and (iii) permitting, within certain parameters, students to engage in certain diabetes self-care tasks in a school setting.

Budget Amendment Necessary: Yes

Items Impacted: 117

Explanation: The Department of Education would require additional ongoing funding to support staff to complete ongoing work related to the provisions of the bill and one time funding to support implementation. Any impact to local school divisions is indeterminate.

Fiscal Summary: The Department of Education would require an additional 0.5 position at a cost of \$77,051 general fund per year beginning in FY27. The Department of Education would also require \$60,000 general fund one time in FY27 to support implementation.

Fiscal Analysis: The bill makes several changes related to students who are diagnosed with diabetes. The bill requires the Department of Education (DOE) to update Diabetes Management in Schools: A Manual for Unlicensed Personnel and to update Promoting Healthy Students: A Guide for School Health Advisory Boards. The bill also requires DOE to collect information from school divisions on access to glucagon for students and report on that.

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DOE does not currently have staff time available to support the requirements of this bill. DOE anticipates the need for an additional 0.5 of a position at a total estimated cost of \$77,051 including salary, benefits, and technology. DOE also requires \$60,000 general fund in FY27 in additional support one time to work with consultants and provide trainings to support the initial implementation of the bill.

Other: This bill is identical HB1301 as introduced.
