Bill Title: Decreasing probation period.

Bill Summary: The engrossed bill establishes criteria for which a defendant's supervised probation period shall be reduced, including completing educational activities, maintaining employment, completing treatment, or obtaining housing. The engrossed bill provides that a court may decrease a defendant's probation period if warranted by the defendant's conduct and adds language clarifying that this decrease requires the Department of Corrections to request termination of a defendant's supervised probation period after 12 months in certain situations.

According to the Department of Corrections (DOC), there is no anticipated fiscal impact from the bill. The fiscal impact to the Supreme Court of Virginia is unknown at this time.
