**Bill Title:** Teacher licensure; career and technical education or dual enrollment; three-year licenses; established.

**Bill Summary:** Requires the Board of Education to provide for the issuance of a three-year renewable license to teach solely career and technical education courses or dual enrollment courses at public high schools in the Commonwealth to any individual who (i) is employed as an instructor by an institution of higher education that is accredited by a nationally recognized regional accreditation body, (ii) is teaching in the specific career and technical education or dual enrollment subject area at such institution in which the individual seeks to teach at a public high school, and (iii) complies with the requirements set forth in relevant law to complete study in child abuse recognition and intervention and certification or training in emergency first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and the use of automated external defibrillators. The bill requires the Board to require any such instructor to maintain continuous employment in such position at the institution of higher education as a condition of continued licensure. The bill also requires the local school board to provide training on instruction and assessment for any such instructor during his first year.

**Budget Amendment Necessary:** No

**Items Impacted:** None

**Explanation:** There is no anticipated state fiscal impact resulting from the provision of this bill. Any impact to local school divisions is indeterminate.

**Fiscal Analysis:** The Department of Education can absorb any work to issue the licenses as prescribed by the bill with existing staff. Any impact to local school divisions to provide training is indeterminate.

**Other:** This version is identical to HB332 as passed the House.
