

Fiscal Analysis: This proposal allows a person who is prohibited from possessing a firearm to transfer a firearm to any person who is not otherwise prohibited by law from possessing such firearm. This proposal also allows that a prohibited person who transfers, sells, or surrenders a firearm, pursuant to the provisions of the bill, to inform the clerk of the court of the name, address, and signature of the transferee, federally licensed firearms dealer, or law-enforcement agency in possession of the firearm and shall provide a copy of the form to the transferee. The bill also provides that a person who is prohibited from possessing a firearm because the person is subject to a protective order or has been convicted of an assault and battery of a family or household member be advised that a law-enforcement officer may obtain a search warrant to search for any firearms from the person if the law-enforcement officer has probable cause that the person has not relinquished all firearms in his possession.
