## Senate Bill 339

**Version:** Senate Substitute 1

**Patron:** Perry

**Title:** State Corporation Commission; cost allocation proceedings for certain electric utilities.

**Summary as Passed Senate:** Directs the State Corporation Commission to conduct proceedings to review cost allocation among different customer classifications for certain electric utilities. For Dominion Energy and Appalachian Power, the Commission is directed to determine if the cost allocation of transmission costs require customers that are not data centers to unreasonably subsidize the transmission costs attributable to serving customers that are data centers by January 1, 2027. For Dominion Energy, the Commission is directed to determine if the current allocation of generation and distribution costs require customers that are not data centers to unreasonably subsidize the generation and distribution costs attributable to serving customers that are data centers by January 1, 2028.

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## *Fiscal Analysis*

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### **Revenue**

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When considered individually, the SCC can meet this bill's requirements with the adjustments identified in the fiscal impact summary table and within its existing funding authority. If enacted, the SCC will review operational and fiscal impacts of this legislation along with other enacted 2026 electric utility bills to determine implementation.

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The SCC will be required to hire a consultant to meet the requirements of this bill.

### **Other Comments**

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The bill requires the SCC to conduct two proceedings to review the allocation of transmission, generation, and distribution costs among Phase I and Phase II utilities customers. To meet the requirements of this bill, the SCC will need to hire a consultant with expertise in the subject matter to perform the needed technical analysis and meet the timeframes required in the bill.
