WHEREAS, on November 24, 2024, Seuk Kim took to the skies on one such mission of mercy, transporting four dogs to their adoptive homes, an act of selflessness that would tragically be his final flight; and

WHEREAS, in the face of challenging weather and difficult flying conditions, Seuk Kim remained committed to his mission, ultimately sacrificing his life in an effort to see it through; and

WHEREAS, Seuk Kim not only saved countless animals, but touched countless lives in the community, inspiring family members, friends, coworkers, and volunteers alike through his kindness and dedication; and

WHEREAS, Seuk Kim's legacy is one of compassion, servant leadership, and love, and he was an exemplar for all who strive to live with purpose and give back to their communities; and

WHEREAS, Seuk Kim will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his wife, Anna; his children, Leah, Isaac, and Mason, and numerous other family members, friends, and colleagues; now, therefore, be it
