Bill Title: Enforcement of federal traffic infractions by state and local law-enforcement officers;
Photo speed monitoring devices; Planning District 8.

Bill Summary: Provides that state and local law-enforcement officers may enforce federal traffic infractions on any highway within Planning District 8. The bill requires the uniform traffic summons form to be updated to reference both newly proposed § 46.2-102.1 and the incorporated state statute, local ordinance, or federal statute or regulation. The substitute bill authorizes a state or local law-enforcement agency to place and operate a photo speed monitoring device on a National Park highway.

Fiscal Summary: There is no anticipated fiscal impact on state agencies.

Fiscal Analysis: This proposal allows state and local law-enforcement officers to enforce federal traffic violations on any highway within Planning District 8. Additionally, this bill authorizes a state or local law-enforcement agency to place and operate a photo speed monitoring device on a National Park highway.

Under current law, civil penalties collected from a summons issued by a local law-enforcement officer are paid to the locality in which such violation occurred. Civil penalties collected from a summons issued by a law-enforcement officer employed by the Department of State Police are paid into the Literary Fund. While the expansion of places where photo speed monitoring devices are permitted to be used could potentially increase the number of penalties collected on, the exact impact is indeterminate.
