AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE  
(Proposed by the Senate Committee on Finance and Appropriations  
on March 4, 2026)  
(Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Hope)

*A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 4.1-100, 4.1-103, 4.1-103.01, 4.1-204, 4.1-229, 15.2-912.4, 18.2-246.8, 18.2-371.2, 18.2-371.2:1, 18.2-391, 58.1-1021.04:1, 59.1-200, 59.1-293.10, 59.1-293.13, 59.1-293.15 through 59.1-293.18, 59.1-293.20, and 59.1-293.21 of the Code of Virginia; to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 2 of Title 4.1 an article numbered 4, consisting of sections numbered 4.1-241 through 4.1-254, and by adding in Chapter 3 of Title 4.1 an article numbered 4, consisting of sections numbered 4.1-355 through 4.1-361; and to repeal §§ 58.1-1021.06 through 58.1-1021.09 and 59.1-293.11, 59.1-293.12, and 59.1-293.14 of the Code of Virginia, relating to Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority; permitting of retail tobacco product retailers; purchase, possession, and sale of retail tobacco products; penalties; report.*

**Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**

**1. That §§ 4.1-100, 4.1-103, 4.1-103.01, 4.1-204, 4.1-229, 15.2-912.4, 18.2-246.8, 18.2-371.2, 18.2-371.2:1, 18.2-391, 58.1-1021.04:1, 59.1-200, 59.1-293.10, 59.1-293.13, 59.1-293.15 through 59.1-293.18, 59.1-293.20, and 59.1-293.21 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 2 of Title 4.1 an article numbered 4, consisting of sections numbered 4.1-241 through 4.1-254, and by adding in Chapter 3 of Title 4.1 an article numbered 4, consisting of sections numbered 4.1-355 through 4.1-361, as follows:**

**§ 4.1-100. Definitions.**

As used in this subtitle, unless the context requires a different meaning:

"Alcohol" means the product known as ethyl or grain alcohol obtained by distillation of any fermented liquor, rectified either once or more often, whatever the origin, and shall include synthetic ethyl alcohol, but ~~shall~~ *does* not include methyl alcohol and alcohol completely denatured in accordance with formulas approved by the government of the United States.

"Alcohol vaporizing device" means any device, machine, or process that mixes any alcoholic beverages with pure oxygen or other gas to produce a vaporized product for the purpose of consumption by inhalation.

"Alcoholic beverages" includes alcohol, spirits, wine, and beer, and any one or more of such varieties containing one-half of one percent or more of alcohol by volume, including mixed alcoholic beverages, and

32 every liquid or solid, powder or crystal, patented or not, containing alcohol, spirits, wine, or beer and capable  
33 of being consumed by a human being. Any liquid or solid containing more than one of the four varieties shall  
34 be considered as belonging to that variety which has the higher percentage of alcohol, however obtained,  
35 according to the order in which they are set forth in this definition; except that beer may be manufactured to  
36 include flavoring materials and other nonbeverage ingredients containing alcohol, as long as no more than 49  
37 percent of the overall alcohol content of the finished product is derived from the addition of flavors and other  
38 nonbeverage ingredients containing alcohol for products with an alcohol content of no more than six percent  
39 by volume; or, in the case of products with an alcohol content of more than six percent by volume, as long as  
40 no more than one and one-half percent of the volume of the finished product consists of alcohol derived from  
41 added flavors and other nonbeverage ingredients containing alcohol.

42 "Arts venue" means a commercial or nonprofit establishment that is open to the public and in which  
43 works of art are sold or displayed.

44 "Authority" means the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority created pursuant to this subtitle.

45 "Barrel" means any container or vessel having a capacity of more than 43 ounces.

46 "Bed and breakfast establishment" means any establishment (i) having no more than 15 bedrooms; (ii)  
47 offering to the public, for compensation, transitory lodging or sleeping accommodations; and (iii) offering at  
48 least one meal per day, which may but need not be breakfast, to each person to whom overnight lodging is  
49 provided. For purposes of the licensing requirements of this subtitle, "bed and breakfast establishment"  
50 includes any property offered to the public for short-term rental, as that term is defined in § 15.2-983, other  
51 than a hotel as defined in this section, regardless of whether a meal is offered to each person to whom  
52 overnight lodging is provided.

53 "Beer" means any alcoholic beverage obtained by the fermentation of an infusion or decoction of barley,  
54 malt, and hops or of any similar products in drinkable water and containing one-half of one percent or more  
55 of alcohol by volume.

56 "Board" means the Board of Directors of the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority.

57 "Bottle" means any vessel intended to contain liquids and having a capacity of not more than 43 ounces.

58 "Bus" means a motor vehicle that (i) is operated by a common carrier licensed under Chapter 20  
59 (§ 46.2-2000 et seq.) of Title 46.2 to transport passengers for compensation over the highways of the  
60 Commonwealth on regular or irregular routes of not less than 100 miles, (ii) seats no more than 24  
61 passengers, (iii) is 40 feet in length or longer, (iv) offers wireless ~~Internet~~ internet services, (v) is equipped

62 with charging stations at every seat for cellular phones or other portable devices, and (vi) during the  
63 transportation of passengers, is staffed by an attendant who has satisfied all training requirements set forth in  
64 this subtitle or Board regulation.

65 *"Child-resistant packaging" means packaging that is designed or constructed to meet the child-resistant*  
66 *effectiveness standards set forth in 16 C.F.R. § 1700.15(b)(1) when tested in accordance with the protocols*  
67 *described in 16 C.F.R. § 1700.20 as in effect on July 1, 2015.*

68 "Club" means any private nonprofit corporation or association which is the owner, lessee, or occupant of  
69 an establishment operated solely for a national, social, patriotic, political, athletic, or other like purpose, but  
70 not for pecuniary gain, the advantages of which belong to all of the members. It also means the establishment  
71 so operated. A corporation or association shall not lose its status as a club because of the conduct of  
72 charitable gaming conducted pursuant to Article 1.1:1 (§ 18.2-340.15 et seq.) of Chapter 8 of Title 18.2 in  
73 which nonmembers participate frequently or in large numbers, provided that no alcoholic beverages are  
74 served or consumed in the room where such charitable gaming is being conducted while such gaming is being  
75 conducted and that no alcoholic beverages are made available upon the premises to any person who is neither  
76 a member nor a bona fide guest of a member.

77 Any such corporation or association which has been declared exempt from federal and state income taxes  
78 as one which is not organized and operated for pecuniary gain or profit shall be deemed a nonprofit  
79 corporation or association.

80 "Commercial lifestyle center" means a mixed-use commercial development covering a minimum of 10  
81 acres of land and having at least 100,000 square feet of retail space featuring national specialty chain stores  
82 and a combination of dining, entertainment, office, residential, or hotel establishments located in a physically  
83 integrated outdoor setting that is pedestrian friendly and that is governed by a commercial owners' association  
84 that is responsible for the management, maintenance, and operation of the common areas thereof.

85 "Container" means any barrel, bottle, carton, keg, vessel, or other receptacle used for holding alcoholic  
86 beverages.

87 "Contract winemaking facility" means the premises of a licensed winery or farm winery that obtains  
88 grapes, fruits, and other agricultural products from a person holding a winery or farm winery license and  
89 crushes, processes, ferments, bottles, or provides any combination of such services pursuant to an agreement  
90 with the winery or farm winery licensee. For all purposes of this subtitle, wine produced by a contract  
91 winemaking facility for a winery or farm winery shall be considered to be wine owned and produced by the

92 winery or farm winery that supplied the grapes, fruits, or other agricultural products used in the production of  
93 the wine. The contract winemaking facility shall have no right to sell the wine so produced, unless the terms  
94 of payment have not been fulfilled in accordance with the contract. The contract winemaking facility may  
95 charge the winery or farm winery for its services. A winery licensee may utilize contract winemaking  
96 services only for the manufacture or processing of wine of which no less than 90 percent of the grapes, fruits,  
97 and other agricultural products used to make such wine are grown in the Commonwealth.

98 "Convenience grocery store" means an establishment that (i) has an enclosed room in a permanent  
99 structure where stock is displayed and offered for sale and (ii) maintains an inventory of edible items  
100 intended for human consumption consisting of a variety of such items of the types normally sold in grocery  
101 stores.

102 "Culinary lodging resort" means a facility (i) having not less than 13 overnight guest rooms in a building  
103 that has at least 20,000 square feet of indoor floor space; (ii) located on a farm in the Commonwealth with at  
104 least 1,000 acres of land zoned agricultural; (iii) equipped with a full-service kitchen; and (iv) offering to the  
105 public, for compensation, at least one meal per day, lodging, and recreational and educational activities  
106 related to farming, livestock, and other rural activities.

107 "Delicatessen" means an establishment that sells a variety of prepared foods or foods requiring little  
108 preparation, such as cheeses, salads, cooked meats, and related condiments.

109 "Designated area" means a room or area approved by the Board for on-premises licensees.

110 "Dining area" means a public room or area in which meals are regularly served.

111 "Drugstore" means an establishment that sells medicines prepared by a licensed pharmacist pursuant to a  
112 prescription and other medicines and items for home and general use.

113 "*Electronic smoking device*" means any device that may be used to deliver any aerosolized or vaporized  
114 substance to the person inhaling from the device, including an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, vape pen, or e-  
115 hookah. "*Electronic smoking device*" includes any component, part, or accessory of the device, whether or  
116 not sold separately, and also includes any substance intended to be aerosolized or vaporized during the use  
117 of the device, whether or not the substance contains nicotine. "*Electronic smoking device*" does not include  
118 any (i) battery or battery charger when sold separately or (ii) device used for heated tobacco products.  
119 "*Electronic smoking device*" does not include drugs or devices, as such terms are defined in 21 U.S.C. § 321,  
120 or combination products, as such term is used in 21 U.S.C. § 353, if such drugs, devices, or combination  
121 products are authorized for sale by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

122 "Establishment" means any place where alcoholic beverages of one or more varieties are lawfully  
123 manufactured, sold, or used.

124 "Farm winery" means (i) an establishment or cooperative located in the Commonwealth on land zoned  
125 agricultural that has (a) a vineyard, orchard, or similar growing area that produces fruits or other agricultural  
126 products used to manufacture the wine of such farm winery, subject to the requirements set forth in § 4.1-219,  
127 and (b) facilities for fermenting and bottling wine on the premises where such farm winery manufactures  
128 wine that contains not more than 21 percent alcohol by volume or (ii) an accredited public or private  
129 institution of higher education, provided that (a) no wine manufactured by the institution shall be sold, (b) the  
130 wine manufactured by the institution shall be used solely for research and educational purposes, (c) the wine  
131 manufactured by the institution shall be stored on the premises of such farm winery that shall be separate and  
132 apart from all other facilities of the institution, and (d) such farm winery is operated in strict conformance  
133 with the requirements of this clause (ii) and Board regulations. As used in this definition, the term  
134 "cooperative" means a cooperative formed by an association of individuals for the purpose of manufacturing  
135 wine. In determining whether a cooperative licensed as a farm winery has met the requirements set forth in  
136 clause (i), the Board shall consider all land in the Commonwealth that is owned or leased by a member of the  
137 cooperative. For purposes of this definition, "land zoned agricultural" means (1) land zoned as an agricultural  
138 district or classification or (2) land otherwise permitted by a locality for farm winery use. For purposes of this  
139 definition, "land zoned agricultural" does not include land zoned "residential conservation." Except for the  
140 limitation on land zoned "residential conservation," nothing in the definition of "land zoned agricultural" shall  
141 otherwise limit or affect local zoning authority.

142 "Gift shop" means any bona fide retail store selling, predominantly, gifts, books, souvenirs, specialty  
143 items relating to history, original and handmade arts and products, collectibles, crafts, and floral  
144 arrangements, which is open to the public on a regular basis. Such shop shall be a permanent structure where  
145 stock is displayed and offered for sale and which has facilities to properly secure any stock of wine or beer.  
146 Such shop may be located (i) on the premises or grounds of a ~~government registered~~ *government-registered*  
147 national, state, or local historic building or site or (ii) within the premises of a museum. The Board shall  
148 consider the purpose, characteristics, nature, and operation of the shop in determining whether it shall be  
149 considered a gift shop.

150 "Gourmet brewing shop" means an establishment which sells to persons to whom wine or beer may  
151 lawfully be sold, ingredients for making wine or brewing beer, including packaging, and rents to such persons  
152 facilities for manufacturing, fermenting, and bottling such wine or beer.

153 "Gourmet oyster house" means an establishment that (i) is located on the premises of a commercial  
154 marina, (ii) is permitted by the Department of Health to serve oysters and other fresh seafood for  
155 consumption on the premises, and (iii) offers to the public events for the purpose of featuring and educating  
156 the consuming public about local oysters and other seafood products.

157 "Gourmet shop" means an establishment provided with adequate inventory, shelving, and storage  
158 facilities, where, in consideration of payment, substantial amounts of domestic and imported wines and beers  
159 of various types and sizes and related products such as cheeses and gourmet foods are habitually furnished to  
160 persons.

161 "Government store" means a store established by the Authority for the sale of alcoholic beverages.

162 "Grocery store" means an establishment that sells food and other items intended for human consumption,  
163 including a variety of ingredients commonly used in the preparation of meals.

164 "Historic cinema house" means a nonprofit establishment exempt from taxation under § 501(c)(3) of the  
165 Internal Revenue Code that was built prior to 1970 and that exists for the primary purpose of showing motion  
166 pictures to the public.

167 "Hotel" means any duly licensed establishment, provided with special space and accommodation, where,  
168 in consideration of payment, food and lodging are habitually furnished to persons, and which has four or  
169 more bedrooms. It shall also mean the person who operates such hotel.

170 "Interdicted person" means a person to whom the sale of alcoholic beverages is prohibited by order  
171 pursuant to this subtitle.

172 "Internet wine and beer retailer" means a person who owns or operates an establishment with adequate  
173 inventory, shelving, and storage facilities, where, in consideration of payment, ~~Internet~~ internet or telephone  
174 orders are taken and shipped directly to consumers and which establishment is not a retail store open to the  
175 public.

176 "Intoxicated" means a condition in which a person has drunk enough alcoholic beverages to observably  
177 affect his manner, disposition, speech, muscular movement, general appearance, or behavior.

178 "Licensed" means the holding of a valid license granted by the Authority.

179 "Licensee" means any person to whom a license has been granted by the Authority.

180 "Liqueur" means any of a class of highly flavored alcoholic beverages that do not exceed an alcohol  
181 content of 25 percent by volume.

182 *"Liquid nicotine" means the same as that term is defined in § 58.1-1021.01.*

183 *"Liquid nicotine container" means the same as that term is defined in § 59.1-293.10.*

184 "Low alcohol beverage cooler" means a drink containing one-half of one percent or more of alcohol by  
185 volume, but not more than seven and one-half percent alcohol by volume, and consisting of spirits mixed  
186 with nonalcoholic beverages or flavoring or coloring materials; it may also contain water, fruit juices, fruit  
187 adjuncts, sugar, carbon dioxide, preservatives or other similar products manufactured by fermenting fruit or  
188 fruit juices. Low alcohol beverage coolers shall be treated as wine for all purposes of this subtitle, except that  
189 low alcohol beverage coolers may be manufactured by a licensed distiller or a distiller located outside the  
190 Commonwealth.

191 "Marina store" means an establishment that is located on the same premises as a marina, is operated by  
192 the owner of such marina, and sells food and nautical and fishing supplies.

193 "Meals" means, for a mixed beverage license, an assortment of foods commonly ordered in bona fide,  
194 full-service restaurants as principal meals of the day. Such restaurants shall include establishments  
195 specializing in full course meals with a single substantial entree.

196 "Member of a club" means (i) a person who maintains his membership in the club by the payment of  
197 monthly, quarterly, or annual dues in the manner established by the rules and regulations thereof or (ii) a  
198 person who is a member of a bona fide auxiliary, local chapter, or squadron composed of direct lineal  
199 descendants of a bona fide member, whether alive or deceased, of a national or international organization to  
200 which an individual lodge holding a club license is an authorized member in the same locality. It shall also  
201 mean a lifetime member whose financial contribution is not less than 10 times the annual dues of resident  
202 members of the club, the full amount of such contribution being paid in advance in a lump sum.

203 "Mixed beverage" or "mixed alcoholic beverage" means a drink composed in whole or in part of spirits.

204 "Mixer" means any prepackaged ingredients containing beverages or flavoring or coloring materials, and  
205 which may also contain water, fruit juices, fruit adjuncts, sugar, carbon dioxide, or preservatives which are  
206 not commonly consumed unless combined with alcoholic beverages, whether or not such ingredients contain  
207 alcohol. Such specialty beverage product shall be manufactured or distributed by a Virginia corporation.

208 "Municipal golf course" means any golf course that is owned by any town incorporated in 1849 and which  
209 is the county seat of Smyth County.

210 *"Nicotine vapor product" means the same as that term is defined in § 58.1-1021.01 and includes liquid*

211 *nicotine containers.*

212 "Performing arts facility" means an indoor or outdoor amphitheater, arena, multipurpose theater, or  
213 similar facility at which live musical, dance, theatre, or similar performances, the types of which are  
214 approved by the Authority, are performed, provided that the facility has stationary stadium or similar seating  
215 for more than 500 persons.

216 "Place or premises," *when used in reference to alcoholic beverages*, means the real estate, together with  
217 any buildings or other improvements thereon, designated in the application for a license as the place at which  
218 the manufacture, bottling, distribution, use, or sale of alcoholic beverages shall be performed, except that  
219 portion of any such building or other improvement actually and exclusively used as a private residence.

220 "*Place or premises*," *when used in reference to a retail tobacco permit*, means the real estate, together  
221 with any buildings or other improvement thereon, designated in the application for a retail tobacco permit as  
222 the place at which the sale of retail tobacco products is performed, except that portion of any such building  
223 or other improvement actually and exclusively used as a private residence.

224 "Principal stockholder" means any person who individually or in concert with his spouse and immediate  
225 family members beneficially owns or controls, directly or indirectly, five percent or more of the equity  
226 ownership of any person that is a licensee of the Authority, or who in concert with his spouse and immediate  
227 family members has the power to vote or cause the vote of five percent or more of any such equity  
228 ownership. "Principal stockholder" does not include a broker-dealer registered under the Securities Exchange  
229 Act of 1934, as amended, that holds in inventory shares for sale on the financial markets for a publicly traded  
230 corporation holding, directly or indirectly, a license from the Authority.

231 "Public place" means any place, building, or conveyance to which the public has, or is permitted to have,  
232 access, including restaurants, soda fountains, hotel dining areas, lobbies and corridors of hotels, and any park,  
233 place of public resort or amusement, highway, street, lane, or sidewalk adjoining any highway, street, or lane.

234 "Public place" does not include (i) hotel or restaurant dining areas or ballrooms while in use for private  
235 meetings or private parties limited in attendance to members and guests of a particular group, association or  
236 organization; (ii) restaurants licensed by the Authority in office buildings or industrial or similar facilities  
237 while such restaurant is closed to the public and in use for private meetings or parties limited in attendance to  
238 employees and nonpaying guests of the owner or a lessee of all or part of such building or facility; (iii)  
239 offices, office buildings, or industrial facilities while closed to the public and in use for private meetings or  
240 parties limited in attendance to employees and nonpaying guests of the owner or a lessee of all or part of such

241 building or facility; or (iv) private recreational or chartered boats which are not licensed by the Board and on  
242 which alcoholic beverages are not sold.

243 "Residence" means any building or part of a building or structure where a person resides, but does not  
244 include any part of a building that is not actually and exclusively used as a private residence, nor any part of a  
245 hotel or club other than a private guest room thereof.

246 "Resort complex" means a facility (i) with a hotel owning year-round sports and recreational facilities  
247 located contiguously on the same property; (ii) owned by a nonstock, nonprofit, taxable corporation with  
248 voluntary membership which, as its primary function, makes available golf, ski, and other recreational  
249 facilities both to its members and to the general public; or (iii) operated by a corporation that operates as a  
250 management company which, as its primary function, makes available (a) vacation accommodations, guest  
251 rooms, or dwelling units and (b) golf, ski, and other recreational facilities to members of the managed entities  
252 and the general public. The hotel or corporation shall have or manage a minimum of 140 private guest rooms  
253 or dwelling units contained on not less than 50 acres, whether or not contiguous to the licensed premises; if  
254 the guest rooms or dwelling units are located on property that is not contiguous to the licensed premises, such  
255 guest rooms and dwelling units shall be located within the same locality. The Authority may consider the  
256 purpose, characteristics, and operation of the applicant establishment in determining whether it shall be  
257 considered as a resort complex. All other pertinent qualifications established by the Board for a hotel  
258 operation shall be observed by such licensee.

259 "Restaurant" means, for a wine and beer license or a limited mixed beverage restaurant license, any  
260 establishment provided with special space and accommodation, where, in consideration of payment, meals or  
261 other foods prepared on the premises are regularly sold.

262 "Restaurant" means, for a mixed beverage license other than a limited mixed beverage restaurant license,  
263 an established place of business (i) where meals with substantial entrees are regularly sold and (ii) which has  
264 adequate facilities and sufficient employees for cooking, preparing, and serving such meals for consumption  
265 at tables in dining areas on the premises, and includes establishments specializing in full course meals with a  
266 single substantial entree.

267 *"Retail dealer" means the same as that term is defined in § 58.1-1021.01.*

268 *"Retail tobacco establishment" means any place of business owned by a retail tobacco permittee or*  
269 *tobacco retailer to sell retail tobacco products to the general public, including any grocery store, retail*

270 tobacco product shop, kiosk, convenience store, gasoline service station, bar, or restaurant where retail  
271 tobacco products are available for sale to the general public. "Retail tobacco establishment" includes any  
272 facility from which cigarette delivery sales, as that term is defined in § 18.2-246.6, are made. "Retail tobacco  
273 establishment" does not include an establishment that does not sell retail tobacco products other than cigars  
274 and pipe tobacco as those terms are defined in § 58.1-1021.01.

275 "Retail tobacco permit" means a permit issued by the Board, pursuant to Article 4 (§ 4.1-241 et seq.), to a  
276 tobacco retailer that authorizes such retailer to sell retail tobacco products at a retail tobacco establishment  
277 owned by such retailer or retail tobacco permittee.

278 "Retail tobacco permittee" means any tobacco retailer to whom a retail tobacco permit has been issued  
279 by the Board.

280 "Retail tobacco product" means (i) any product containing, made of, or derived from tobacco or that  
281 contains nicotine that is intended for human consumption or is likely to be consumed, whether smoked,  
282 heated, chewed, dissolved, inhaled, absorbed, or ingested by other means, including a cigarette, heated  
283 tobacco product, chewing tobacco, snuff, or snus; (ii) any electronic smoking device and any substances that  
284 may be aerosolized or vaporized by such device, whether or not the substance contains nicotine; and (iii) any  
285 component, part, or accessory of a product described in clause (i) or (ii), whether or not such component,  
286 part, or accessory contains tobacco or nicotine, including filters, rolling papers, blunt or hemp wraps, and  
287 glass pipes. "Retail tobacco product" includes any liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product. "Retail tobacco  
288 product" does not include drugs or devices, as such terms are defined in 21 U.S.C. § 321, or combination  
289 products, as such term is used in 21 U.S.C. § 353, if such drugs, devices, or combination products are  
290 authorized for sale by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. "Retail tobacco product" does not include any  
291 cigar or pipe tobacco as defined in § 58.1-1021.01.

292 "Sale" and "sell" includes soliciting or receiving an order for; keeping, offering or exposing for sale;  
293 peddling, exchanging, or bartering; or delivering otherwise than gratuitously, by any means, alcoholic  
294 beverages.

295 "Sangria" means a drink consisting of red or white wine mixed with some combination of sweeteners,  
296 fruit, fruit juice, soda, or soda water that may also be mixed with brandy, triple sec, or other similar spirits.

297 "Special agent" means an employee of the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority whom the  
298 Board has designated as a law-enforcement officer pursuant to § 4.1-105.

299 "Special event" means an event sponsored by a duly organized nonprofit corporation or association and  
300 conducted for an athletic, charitable, civic, educational, political, or religious purpose.

301 "Spirits" means any beverage that contains alcohol obtained by distillation mixed with drinkable water  
302 and other substances, in solution, and includes, among other things, brandy, rum, whiskey, and gin, or any  
303 one or more of the last four named ingredients, but ~~shall~~ *does* not include any such liquors completely  
304 denatured in accordance with formulas approved by the United States government.

305 "Sports facility" means a coliseum, stadium, racetrack, or similar facility at which professional sports, as  
306 defined in § 58.1-4030, or similar events, the types of which are approved by the Authority, are conducted.

307 *"Tobacco product" means the same as that term is defined in § 58.1-1021.01.*

308 *"Tobacco retailer" means any person, partnership, joint venture, society, club, trustee, trust, association,*  
309 *organization, or corporation that owns, operates, or manages any retail tobacco establishment. "Tobacco*  
310 *retailer" does not include nonmanagement employees of a retail tobacco establishment.*

311 "Wine" means any alcoholic beverage, including cider, obtained by the fermentation of the natural sugar  
312 content of fruits or other agricultural products containing (i) sugar, including honey and milk, either with or  
313 without additional sugar; (ii) one-half of one percent or more of alcohol by volume; and (iii) no product of  
314 distillation. "Wine" includes any wine to which wine spirits have been added, as provided in the Internal  
315 Revenue Code, to make products commonly known as "fortified wine" which do not exceed an alcohol  
316 content of 21 percent by volume.

317 "Wine cooler" means a drink containing one-half of one percent or more of alcohol by volume, and not  
318 more than three and two-tenths percent of alcohol by weight or four percent by volume consisting of wine  
319 mixed with nonalcoholic beverages or flavoring or coloring materials, and which may also contain water,  
320 fruit juices, fruit adjuncts, sugar, carbon dioxide, or preservatives and shall include other similar products  
321 manufactured by fermenting fruit or fruit juices. Wine coolers and similar fermented fruit juice beverages  
322 shall be treated as wine for all purposes except for taxation under § 4.1-236.

323 "With or without meals" means the selling and serving of alcoholic beverages by retail licensees for  
324 on-premises consumption whether or not accompanied by food so long as the total food-beverage ratio  
325 required by § 4.1-206.3, or the monthly food sale requirement established by Board regulation, is met by such  
326 retail licensee.

327 **§ 4.1-103. General powers of Board.**

328 The Board shall have the power to:

329 1. Sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, and complain and defend in all courts;

330 2. Adopt, use, and alter at will a common seal;

331 3. Fix, alter, charge, and collect rates, rentals, fees, and other charges for the use of property of, the sale of  
332 products of, or services rendered by the Authority at rates to be determined by the Authority for the purpose  
333 of providing for the payment of the expenses of the Authority;

334 4. Make and enter into all contracts and agreements necessary or incidental to the performance of its  
335 duties, the furtherance of its purposes, and the execution of its powers under this subtitle, including  
336 agreements with any person or federal agency;

337 5. Employ, at its discretion, consultants, researchers, architects, engineers, accountants, financial experts,  
338 investment bankers, superintendents, managers, and such other employees and special agents as may be  
339 necessary and fix their compensation to be payable from funds made available to the Authority. Legal  
340 services for the Authority shall be provided by the Attorney General in accordance with Chapter 5 (§ 2.2-500  
341 et seq.) of Title 2.2;

342 6. Receive and accept from any federal or private agency, foundation, corporation, association, or person  
343 grants or other aid to be expended in accomplishing the objectives of the Authority, and receive and accept  
344 from the Commonwealth or any state and any municipality, county, or other political subdivision thereof or  
345 from any other source aid or contributions of either money, property, or other things of value, to be held,  
346 used, and applied only for the purposes for which such grants and contributions may be made. All federal  
347 moneys accepted under this section shall be accepted and expended by the Authority upon such terms and  
348 conditions as are prescribed by the United States and as are consistent with state law, and all state moneys  
349 accepted under this section shall be expended by the Authority upon such terms and conditions as are  
350 prescribed by the Commonwealth;

351 7. Adopt, alter, and repeal bylaws, rules, and regulations governing the manner in which its business shall  
352 be transacted and the manner in which the powers of the Authority shall be exercised and its duties  
353 performed. The Board may delegate or assign any duty or task to be performed by the Authority to any  
354 officer or employee of the Authority. The Board shall remain responsible for the performance of any such  
355 duties or tasks. Any delegation pursuant to this subdivision shall, where appropriate, be accompanied by  
356 written guidelines for the exercise of the duties or tasks delegated. Where appropriate, the guidelines shall  
357 require that the Board receive summaries of actions taken. Such delegation or assignment shall not relieve the  
358 Board of the responsibility to ensure faithful performance of the duties and tasks;

359 8. Conduct or engage in any lawful business, activity, effort, or project consistent with the Authority's

360 purposes or necessary or convenient to exercise its powers;

361 9. Develop policies and procedures generally applicable to the procurement of goods, services, and  
362 construction, based upon competitive principles;

363 10. Develop policies and procedures consistent with Article 4 (§ 2.2-4347 et seq.) of Chapter 43 of Title  
364 2.2;

365 11. Buy, import, and sell alcoholic beverages other than beer and wine not produced by farm wineries,  
366 and to have alcoholic beverages other than beer and wine not produced by farm wineries in its possession for  
367 sale;

368 12. Buy and sell any mixers;

369 13. Buy and sell products licensed by the Virginia Tourism Corporation that are within international  
370 trademark classes 16 (paper goods and printer matters), 18 (leather goods), 21 (housewares and glass), and 25  
371 (clothing);

372 14. Control the possession, sale, transportation, and delivery of alcoholic beverages;

373 15. Determine, subject to § 4.1-121, the localities within which government stores shall be established or  
374 operated and the location of such stores;

375 16. Maintain warehouses for alcoholic beverages and control the storage and delivery of alcoholic  
376 beverages to and from such warehouses;

377 17. Acquire, purchase, hold, use, lease, or otherwise dispose of any property, real, personal or mixed,  
378 tangible or intangible, or any interest therein necessary or desirable for carrying out the purposes of the  
379 Authority; lease as lessee any property, real, personal or mixed, tangible or intangible, or any interest therein,  
380 at such annual rental and on such terms and conditions as may be determined by the Board; lease as lessor to  
381 any person any property, real, personal or mixed, tangible or intangible, or any interest therein, at any time  
382 acquired by the Authority, whether wholly or partially completed, at such annual rental and on such terms  
383 and conditions as may be determined by the Board; sell, transfer, or convey any property, real, personal or  
384 mixed, tangible or intangible, or any interest therein, at any time acquired or held by the Authority on such  
385 terms and conditions as may be determined by the Board; and occupy and improve any land or building  
386 required for the purposes of this subtitle;

387 18. Purchase, lease, or acquire the use of, by any manner, any plant or equipment that may be considered  
388 necessary or useful in carrying into effect the purposes of this subtitle, including rectifying, blending, and

389 processing plants. The Board may purchase, build, lease, and operate distilleries and manufacture alcoholic  
390 beverages;

391 19. Determine the nature, form, and capacity of all containers used for holding alcoholic beverages to be  
392 kept or sold under this subtitle, and prescribe the form and content of all labels and seals to be placed thereon;  
393 however, no container sold in or shipped into the Commonwealth shall include powdered or crystalline  
394 alcohol;

395 20. Appoint every agent and employee required for its operations; require any or all of them to give bonds  
396 payable to the Commonwealth in such penalty as shall be fixed by the Board; and engage the services of  
397 experts and professionals;

398 21. Hold and conduct hearings; issue subpoenas requiring the attendance of witnesses and the production  
399 of records, memoranda, papers, and other documents before the Board or any agent of the Board; and  
400 administer oaths and take testimony thereunder. The Board may authorize any Board member or agent of the  
401 Board to hold and conduct hearings, issue subpoenas, administer oaths and take testimony thereunder, and  
402 decide cases, subject to final decision by the Board, on application of any party aggrieved. The Board may  
403 enter into consent agreements and may request and accept from any applicant or licensee a consent agreement  
404 in lieu of proceedings on (i) objections to the issuance of a license or (ii) disciplinary action. Any such  
405 consent agreement shall include findings of fact and may include an admission or a finding of a violation. A  
406 consent agreement shall not be considered a case decision of the Board and shall not be subject to judicial  
407 review under the provisions of the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.), but may be considered by  
408 the Board in future disciplinary proceedings;

409 22. Make a reasonable charge for preparing and furnishing statistical information and compilations to  
410 persons other than (i) officials, including court and police officials, of the Commonwealth and of its  
411 subdivisions if the information requested is for official use and (ii) persons who have a personal or legal  
412 interest in obtaining the information requested if such information is not to be used for commercial or trade  
413 purposes;

414 23. Promulgate regulations in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.) and  
415 § 4.1-111;

416 24. Grant, suspend, and revoke licenses for the manufacture, bottling, distribution, importation, and sale  
417 of alcoholic beverages;

418 25. *Grant, suspend, and revoke retail tobacco permits for the sale of retail tobacco products;*

419 26. Assess and collect civil penalties and civil charges for violations of this subtitle and Board regulations;  
420 ~~26-~~ 27. Maintain actions to enjoin common nuisances as defined in § 4.1-317;  
421 ~~27-~~ 28. Establish minimum food sale requirements for all retail licensees;  
422 ~~28-~~ 29. Review and approve any proposed legislative or regulatory changes suggested by the Chief  
423 Executive Officer as the Board deems appropriate;  
424 ~~29-~~ 30. Report quarterly to the Secretary of Public Safety and Homeland Security on the law-enforcement  
425 activities undertaken to enforce the provisions of this subtitle;  
426 ~~30-~~ 31. Establish and collect fees for all permits set forth in this subtitle, including fees associated with  
427 applications for such permits;  
428 ~~31-~~ 32. Impose a requirement that a mixed beverage casino licensee pursuant to subdivision A 14 of  
429 § 4.1-206.3 pay for any cost incurred by the Board to enforce such license in excess of the applicable state  
430 license fee; and  
431 ~~32-~~ 33. Do all acts necessary or advisable to carry out the purposes of this subtitle.

432 **§ 4.1-103.01. Additional powers; access to certain tobacco sales records; inspections; penalty.**

433 A. Notwithstanding the provisions of § 58.1-3 or any other provision of law, the Tax Commissioner shall  
434 provide to the Board the name, address, and other identifying information within his possession of all  
435 ~~wholesale cigarette dealers~~ *tobacco retailers*.

436 B. All invoices, books, papers, or other memoranda and records concerning the sale of ~~cigarettes~~  
437 ~~maintained by wholesale cigarette dealers pursuant to § 58.1-1007~~ *retail tobacco products by a tobacco*  
438 *retailer shall be subject to inspection during normal business hours by special agents of the Board pursuant to*  
439 *§ 4.1-253. Additionally, all invoices, books, papers, or other memoranda and records concerning the sale of*  
440 *cigarettes shall be subject to inspection during normal business hours by the Attorney General or his*  
441 *authorized representative during any audit and investigation conducted pursuant to § 3.2-4215.1. Any person*  
442 *who, upon request by a special agent or the Attorney General or his authorized representative, unreasonably*  
443 *fails or refuses to allow an inspection of the records authorized by this subsection shall be is guilty of a Class*  
444 *2 misdemeanor.*

445 C. The Board may use the information obtained from the Tax Commissioner or by the inspections  
446 authorized by subsection B *for retail tobacco products* only for the purpose of creating and maintaining a list  
447 of retail dealers to facilitate enforcement of the laws governing the sale of tobacco products *and retail*  
448 *tobacco products* to minors. Neither the Board nor any special agent shall divulge any information provided  
449 by the Tax Commissioner or obtained in the performance of the inspections authorized by subsection B to

450 anyone other than to another special agent. Any person violating the provisions of this subsection ~~shall be~~ is  
451 guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor.

452 *D. Nothing contained in this section shall prohibit the use or release of such information or documents by*  
453 *the Board to any governmental or law-enforcement agency or when considering the granting, denial,*  
454 *suspension, or revocation of a license or permit or the assessment of any penalty against a licensee or retail*  
455 *tobacco permittee.*

456 **§ 4.1-204. Records of licensees and retail tobacco permittees; inspection of records and places of**  
457 **business.**

458 ~~A. Manufacturers, bottlers or wholesalers.~~ — Every licensed manufacturer, bottler, or wholesaler shall  
459 keep complete, accurate, and separate records in accordance with Board regulations of all alcoholic beverages  
460 purchased, manufactured, bottled, sold, or shipped by him, and the applicable tax required by § 4.1-234 or  
461 4.1-236, if any.

462 ~~B. Retailers.~~ — Every retail licensee *and retail tobacco permittee* shall keep complete, accurate, and  
463 separate records, in accordance with Board regulations, of all purchases of alcoholic beverages *or retail*  
464 *tobacco products*, the prices charged such licensee ~~therefor~~ *or retail tobacco permittee for such purchases*,  
465 and the names and addresses of the persons from whom purchased. Every retail licensee *or retail tobacco*  
466 *permittee* shall also preserve all invoices showing his purchases for a period as specified by Board  
467 regulations. He shall also keep an accurate account of daily sales, showing quantities of alcoholic beverages  
468 *or retail tobacco products* sold and the total price charged by him therefor. Except as otherwise provided in  
469 subsection D, such account need not give the names or addresses of the purchasers ~~thereof~~, except as may be  
470 required by Board regulation for the sale of alcoholic beverages in kegs. In the case of persons holding retail  
471 licenses that require sales of food to determine their qualifications for such licenses, the records shall also  
472 include purchases and sales of food and nonalcoholic beverages.

473 Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection F, electronic records of retail licensees *or permittees* may be  
474 stored off site, provided that such records are readily retrievable and available for electronic inspection by the  
475 Board or its special agents at the licensed *or permitted* premises. However, in the case that such electronic  
476 records are not readily available for electronic inspection on the licensed *or permitted* premises, the retail  
477 licensee *or retail tobacco permittee* may obtain Board approval, for good cause shown, to permit the retail  
478 licensee *or retail tobacco permittee* to provide the records to a special agent of the Board within three  
479 business days or less, as determined by the Board, after a request is made to inspect the records.

480 ~~C. Common carriers.~~ — Common carriers of passengers by train, boat, bus, or airplane shall keep records

481 of purchases and sales of alcoholic beverages and food as required by Board regulation.

482 D. ~~Wine and beer shippers.~~ — Every wine and beer shipper licensee shall keep complete, accurate, and  
483 separate records in accordance with Board regulations of all shipments of wine or beer to persons in the  
484 Commonwealth. Such licensees shall also remit on a monthly basis an accurate account stating whether any  
485 wine, farm wine, or beer products were sold and shipped and, if so, stating the total quantities of wine and  
486 beer sold and the total price charged for such wine and beer. Such records shall include the names and  
487 addresses of the purchasers to whom the wine and beer is shipped.

488 E. ~~Deliveries.~~ — Every licensee or permittee that is authorized to make deliveries pursuant to § 4.1-212.1  
489 shall keep complete, accurate, and separate records for a period of at least two years in accordance with  
490 Board regulations of all deliveries of wine and beer to persons in the Commonwealth. Such records shall  
491 include (i) the types of wine and beer sold, (ii) the total quantities of wine and beer sold, (iii) the total price  
492 charged for such wine and beer, (iv) the name and date of birth of the person to whom the wine and beer are  
493 delivered, and (v) the address to which the wine and beer is delivered. Licensees and permittees shall remit  
494 such records on a monthly basis for any month during which the licensee or permittee makes a delivery for  
495 which the licensee or permittee is required to collect and remit excise taxes due to the Authority pursuant to  
496 subsection E of § 4.1-212.1.

497 Every licensee that is authorized to make deliveries pursuant to § 4.1-212.2 shall keep complete, accurate,  
498 and separate records for a period of at least two years in accordance with Board regulations of all deliveries  
499 of alcoholic beverages to persons in the Commonwealth. Such records shall include all information  
500 prescribed by Board regulations. Licensees shall remit such records within 24 hours of a records request by  
501 the Authority; however, the licensee may obtain Board approval, for good cause shown, to permit the licensee  
502 to provide records to a special agent of the Board within three business days or less, as determined by the  
503 Board, after a request is made to inspect the records.

504 F. ~~Inspection.~~ — The Board and its special agents shall be allowed free access during reasonable hours to  
505 every place in the Commonwealth and to the premises of ~~both~~ (i) every wine and beer shipper licensee ~~and~~;  
506 (ii) every licensee or permittee authorized to make deliveries wherever located where alcoholic beverages are  
507 manufactured, bottled, stored, offered for sale or sold; *and (iii) every retail tobacco establishment* for the  
508 purpose of examining and inspecting such place and all records, invoices, and accounts therein. The Board  
509 may engage the services of alcoholic beverage control authorities in any state to assist with the inspection of  
510 the premises of a wine and beer shipper licensee, licensee, or permittee authorized to make deliveries, or any  
511 applicant for such license or permit.

512 For purposes of a Board inspection of the records of any retail licensees *or retail tobacco permittee*,  
513 "reasonable hours" means the hours between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.; however, if the licensee *or retail tobacco*  
514 *establishment* generally is not open to the public substantially during the same hours, "reasonable hours" shall  
515 mean the business hours when ~~the~~ *such* licensee *or establishment* is open to the public. At any other time of  
516 day, if the ~~retail licensee's~~ records are not available for inspection, the ~~retailer~~ *retail licensee or retail tobacco*  
517 *permittee* shall provide the records to a special agent of the Board within 24 hours after a request is made to  
518 inspect the records.

519 **§ 4.1-229. Suspension or revocation of permits; grounds; notice and hearing; exception.**

520 A. The Board may suspend or revoke any permit. The suspension or revocation of any permit shall be in  
521 accordance with §§ 4.1-225 and 4.1-227.

522 B. This section shall not apply to (i) temporary permits granted under § 4.1-212, which may be revoked  
523 summarily in the same manner as a temporary license may be revoked under § 4.1-211, *or (ii) retail tobacco*  
524 *permits, which may be suspended or revoked in accordance with Article 4 (§ 4.1-241 et seq.).*

525 *Article 4.*

526 *Permitting and Restrictions for Tobacco Retailers.*

527 **§ 4.1-241. Retail tobacco permits; privileges; liabilities.**

528 *The Board may grant a retail tobacco permit to a tobacco retailer that shall authorize the retail tobacco*  
529 *permittee to sell retail tobacco products in a retail tobacco establishment. The privilege of any retail tobacco*  
530 *permittee to sell retail tobacco products shall extend to such retail tobacco permittee and to all agents or*  
531 *employees of such retail tobacco permittee for the purpose of selling retail tobacco products under such*  
532 *permit. Such retail tobacco permittee may be held liable for any violation of this article or any Board*  
533 *regulation committed by his agents or employees in connection with their employment.*

534 **§ 4.1-242. Separate retail tobacco permit for each place of business; transfer or amendment; posting;**  
535 ***expiration; carriers; civil penalties.***

536 A. *Each retail tobacco permit granted by the Board shall designate the place where such retail sales will*  
537 *be located. A separate retail tobacco permit shall be required for each separate place of business. Each retail*  
538 *tobacco permit shall be posted in a location conspicuous to the public at the place where such retail sales*  
539 *will be located.*

540 B. *No retail tobacco permit shall be transferable from one tobacco retailer to another, or from one place*  
541 *to another.*

542 C. *The privileges conferred by any retail tobacco permit granted by the Board shall continue until the last*

543 *day of the twelfth month next ensuing, except the retail tobacco permit may be sooner terminated for any*  
544 *cause for which the Board would be entitled to refuse to grant a retail tobacco permit, by operation of law,*  
545 *voluntary surrender, or order of the Board.*

546 *The Board may permit a retail tobacco permittee who fails to pay:*

547 *1. The required retail tobacco permit fee covering the continuation or reissuance of its permit by midnight*  
548 *of the fifteenth day of the twelfth month following the granting of the retail tobacco permit, to pay the tax in*  
549 *lieu of reapplying, provided payment of the tax is made within 30 days following that date and is*  
550 *accompanied by a civil penalty of \$25 or 10 percent of such tax, whichever is greater; and*

551 *2. The tax and civil penalty pursuant to subdivision 1 to pay the tax in lieu of reapplying, provided*  
552 *payment of the tax is made within 45 days following the 30 days specified in subdivision 1 and is*  
553 *accompanied by a civil penalty of \$100 or 25 percent of such tax, whichever is greater.*

554 *Such civil penalties collected by the Board shall be deposited in accordance with § 4.1-116.*

555 **§ 4.1-243. Applications for retail tobacco permits; fees.**

556 *A. Prior to selling any retail tobacco product, all persons with such intent shall file with the Board an*  
557 *application for a retail tobacco permit on a form prescribed by the Board and a statement in writing by the*  
558 *applicant swearing and affirming that all of the information contained therein is true. This section shall apply*  
559 *to all persons intending to sell any retail tobacco product, including (i) persons that hold a Retail Sales and*  
560 *Use Tax Exemption Certificate for Stamped Cigarettes Purchased for Resale or an Other Tobacco Products*  
561 *Distributor's License; (ii) retail dealers of liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products; and (iii) persons that*  
562 *hold any other similar permit issued by the Department of Taxation.*

563 *B. The provisions of subsection A shall not apply to the continuance of retail tobacco permits granted*  
564 *under this article; however, such retail tobacco permittees shall file and maintain with the Board a current,*  
565 *accurate record of the information required by the Board pursuant to subsection A and notify the Board of*  
566 *any changes to such information in accordance with Board regulations.*

567 *C. The Board shall conduct a background investigation on each applicant for a tobacco retail permit that*  
568 *includes a completed personal data form and a criminal history records search. The Board may waive, for*  
569 *good cause shown, the requirement of a criminal history records search and a completed personal data form*  
570 *for (i) law enforcement officers and (ii) directors, nonmanaging members, or limited partners of any*  
571 *applicant corporation, limited liability company, or limited partnership.*

572 *D. Each applicant for a tobacco retail permit shall pay an application fee in the amount of \$400, plus any*  
573 *cost charged to the Department of State Police by the Federal Bureau of Investigation or the Central*

574 *Criminal Records Exchange for the processing of fingerprints for such applicant's criminal history records*  
575 *search required by the Board. Such application fee shall be in addition to the state permit fee required*  
576 *pursuant to § 4.1-244 of the Code of Virginia and shall not be refunded. Each applicant shall pay such*  
577 *application fee at the time the application for a tobacco retail permit is filed.*

578 **§ 4.1-244. Fees on retail tobacco products and permits.**

579 *A. The annual renewal fee on retail tobacco permits shall be in an amount set by the Board and apply to*  
580 *all persons permitted to sell any retail tobacco product, including (i) persons that hold a Retail Sales and Use*  
581 *Tax Exemption Certificate for Stamped Cigarettes Purchased for Resale or an Other Tobacco Products*  
582 *Distributor's License; (ii) retail dealers of liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products; and (iii) persons that*  
583 *hold any other similar permit issued by the Department of Taxation.*

584 *B. Nothing in this article shall exempt any retail tobacco permittee from any other tax or fee imposed by*  
585 *this article, state merchants' license, state restaurant license, or any other state tax. Every retail tobacco*  
586 *permittee, in addition to the taxes imposed by this article, shall be liable to state merchants' license taxation,*  
587 *state restaurant license taxation, and other state or local taxation applicable to retail tobacco products.*

588 **§ 4.1-245. Conditions under which Board may refuse to grant retail tobacco permits.**

589 *The Board may refuse to grant any retail tobacco permit if it has reasonable cause to believe that:*

590 *1. The applicant, or if the applicant is a partnership, any general partner thereof, or if the applicant is an*  
591 *association, any member thereof, or any limited partner of 10 percent or more with voting rights, or if the*  
592 *applicant is a corporation, any officer, director, or shareholder owning 10 percent or more of its capital*  
593 *stock, or if the applicant is a limited liability company, any member-manager or any member owning 10*  
594 *percent or more of the membership interest of the limited liability company:*

595 *a. Is not 21 years of age or older;*

596 *b. Has been convicted in any court of a felony or any crime or offense involving moral turpitude under the*  
597 *laws of any state or of the United States;*

598 *c. Has been convicted, within the five years immediately preceding the date of the application for such*  
599 *retail tobacco permit, of a violation of any law applicable to the manufacture, transportation, possession,*  
600 *use, or sale of retail tobacco products;*

601 *d. Is not a person of good moral character and repute;*

602 *e. Is not the legitimate owner of the business proposed to be licensed, or other persons have ownership*  
603 *interests in the business that have not been disclosed;*

604 *f. Has not demonstrated financial responsibility sufficient to meet the requirements of the business*

605 *proposed to be permitted;*

606 *g. Has demonstrated, either by his police record or by his record as a former licensee or retail tobacco*  
607 *permittee of the Board, a lack of respect for law and order;*

608 *h. Has misrepresented a material fact in applying to the Board for a retail tobacco permit;*

609 *i. Has defrauded or attempted to defraud the Board or any federal, state, or local government or*  
610 *governmental agency or authority by making or filing any report, document, or tax return required by statute*  
611 *or regulation that is fraudulent or contains a false representation of a material fact, or has willfully deceived*  
612 *or attempted to deceive the Board or any federal, state, or local government or governmental agency or*  
613 *authority by making or maintaining business records required by statute or regulation that are false and*  
614 *fraudulent;*

615 *j. Has violated or allowed the violation of any provision of this article or Article 4 (§ 4.1-355 et seq.) of*  
616 *Chapter 3 in his establishment in the one year prior to application for a retail tobacco permit or while his*  
617 *application for a retail tobacco permit is pending;*

618 *k. Is a police officer with police authority in the political subdivision within which the establishment*  
619 *designated in the application is located;*

620 *l. Is physically unable to carry on the business for which the application for a retail tobacco permit is*  
621 *filed or has been adjudicated incapacitated; or*

622 *m. Is a member, agent, or employee of the Board.*

623 *2. The place to be occupied by the applicant:*

624 *a. Does not conform to the requirements of the governing body of the locality in which such place is*  
625 *located with respect to sanitation, health, construction, or equipment, or to any similar requirements*  
626 *established by the laws of the Commonwealth or by Board regulation;*

627 *b. Is so located that granting a retail tobacco permit and operation thereunder by the applicant would*  
628 *result in violations of this article, Board regulations, or violation of the laws of the Commonwealth or local*  
629 *ordinances relating to peace and good order;*

630 *c. Is so located with respect to any church; synagogue; hospital; public, private, or parochial school or*  
631 *institution of higher education; public or private playground or other similar recreational facility; or state,*  
632 *local, or federal government-operated facility that the operation of such place under such retail tobacco*  
633 *permit will adversely affect or interfere with the normal, orderly conduct of the affairs of such facilities or*  
634 *institutions;*

635 *d. Is so located with respect to any residence or residential area that the operation of such place under*

636 *such retail tobacco permit will adversely affect real property values or substantially interfere with the usual*  
637 *quietude and tranquility of such residence or residential area; or*

638 *e. Is so constructed, arranged, or illuminated that law-enforcement officers and special agents of the*  
639 *Board are prevented from ready access to and reasonable observation of any room or area within which*  
640 *retail tobacco products are to be sold.*

641 *3. There exists any law, ordinance, or regulation of the United States, the Commonwealth, or any political*  
642 *subdivision thereof that warrants refusal by the Board to grant a retail tobacco permit.*

643 *4. The Board is not authorized under this article to grant such retail tobacco permit.*

644 *5. The Board, the Department of Taxation, or investigators with the Office of the Attorney General have*  
645 *found that the applicant exceeded the legal volume limits set by § 58.1-1017.1 during the prior year.*

646 *6. Investigators with the Office of the Attorney General seized cigarette inventory, as authorized by*  
647 *§ 2.2-509.1, from the applicant during the prior year.*

648 **§ 4.1-246. Conditions under which Board shall refuse to grant retail tobacco permits.**

649 *The Board shall refuse to grant any retail tobacco permit authorized by this article until the retail tobacco*  
650 *permit fee required by § 4.1-244 is paid to the Board.*

651 **§ 4.1-247. Notice and hearings for refusal to grant retail tobacco permits; Administrative Process Act;**  
652 **exceptions.**

653 *A. The action of the Board in granting or refusing to grant any retail tobacco permit shall be subject to*  
654 *review in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.), except as provided in*  
655 *subsections B and C. Review shall be limited to the evidential record of the proceedings provided by the*  
656 *Board. Both the petitioner and the Board shall have the right to appeal to the Court of Appeals from any*  
657 *order of the court.*

658 *B. The Board may refuse a hearing on any application for the granting of any retail tobacco permit,*  
659 *provided that the:*

660 *1. Permit for the applicant was refused or revoked within a period of 12 months;*

661 *2. Permit for any premises was refused or revoked at such premises within a period of 12 months;*

662 *3. Applicant, within the immediately preceding 12 months, has allowed his retail tobacco permit to expire*  
663 *for nonpayment of the retail tobacco permit fee and, at the time of the expiration of such permit, there was a*  
664 *pending and unadjudicated charge, either before the Board or in any court, against the retail tobacco*  
665 *permittee alleging a violation of this article; or*

666 *4. Applicant received a restricted retail tobacco permit pursuant to subsection C of § 4.1-252 and*

667 *reapplies for a lesser-restricted retail tobacco permit at the same location within 12 months of the date of the*  
668 *issuance of the restricted retail tobacco permit.*

669 *C. If an applicant has permitted a retail tobacco permit to expire for nonpayment of the retail tobacco*  
670 *permit fee, and at the time of expiration there remained unexecuted any period of suspension imposed upon*  
671 *the retail tobacco permittee by the Board, the Board may refuse a hearing on an application for a new retail*  
672 *tobacco permit until after the date on which the suspension period would have been executed had the retail*  
673 *tobacco permit not have been permitted to expire.*

674 **§ 4.1-248. Grounds for which Board may suspend or revoke retail tobacco permits.**

675 *The Board may suspend or revoke any retail tobacco permit if it has reasonable cause to believe that:*

676 *1. The retail tobacco permittee, or if the retail tobacco permittee is a partnership, any general partner*  
677 *thereof, or if the retail tobacco permittee is an association, any member thereof, or any limited partner of 10*  
678 *percent or more with voting rights, or if the retail tobacco permittee is a corporation, any officer, director, or*  
679 *shareholder owning 10 percent or more of its capital stock, or if the retail tobacco permittee is a limited*  
680 *liability company, any member-manager or any member owning 10 percent or more of the membership*  
681 *interest of the limited liability company:*

682 *a. Has misrepresented a material fact in applying to the Board for such retail tobacco permit;*

683 *b. Within the five years immediately preceding the date of the hearing held in accordance with § 4.1-250,*  
684 *has (i) been convicted of a violation of any law, ordinance, or regulation of the Commonwealth, of any*  
685 *locality in the Commonwealth, of any state, or of the United States applicable to the manufacture,*  
686 *transportation, possession, use, or sale of retail tobacco products; (ii) violated any provision of this article;*  
687 *(iii) violated or failed or refused to comply with any regulation, rule, or order of the Board; (iv) failed or*  
688 *refused to comply with any of the conditions or restrictions of the retail tobacco permit granted by the Board;*  
689 *or (v) violated, failed, or refused to comply with Article 4 (§ 4.1-355 et seq.) of Chapter 3;*

690 *c. Has been convicted in any court of a felony or of any crime or offense involving moral turpitude under*  
691 *the laws of any state or of the United States;*

692 *d. Is not the legitimate owner of the business conducted under the retail tobacco permit granted by the*  
693 *Board, or other persons have ownership interests in the business that have not been disclosed;*

694 *e. Cannot demonstrate financial responsibility sufficient to meet the requirements of the business*  
695 *conducted under the retail tobacco permit granted by the Board;*

696 *f. Has been intoxicated or under the influence of some self-administered drug while upon the permitted*  
697 *premises;*

698 g. Subsequent to the granting of his original retail tobacco permit, has demonstrated by his police record  
699 a lack of respect for law and order;

700 h. Is physically unable to carry on the business conducted under such retail tobacco permit or has been  
701 adjudicated incapacitated;

702 i. Has possessed any illegal gambling device, as defined in § 18.2-325, upon the permitted premises;

703 j. Has upon the permitted premises (i) illegally possessed, distributed, sold, or used or has knowingly  
704 allowed any employee or agent, or any other person, to illegally possess, distribute, sell, or use marijuana,  
705 controlled substances, imitation controlled substances, drug paraphernalia, or controlled paraphernalia as  
706 those terms are defined in Articles 1 (§ 18.2-247 et seq.) and 1.1 (§ 18.2-265.1 et seq.) of Chapter 7 of Title  
707 18.2 and the Drug Control Act (§ 54.1-3400 et seq.); (ii) laundered money in violation of § 18.2-246.3; or  
708 (iii) conspired to commit any drug-related offense in violation of Article 1 or 1.1 of Chapter 7 of Title 18.2 or  
709 the Drug Control Act. The provisions of this subdivision shall also apply to any conduct related to the  
710 operation of the permitted business that facilitates the commission of any of the offenses set forth herein;

711 k. Has failed to take reasonable measures to prevent (i) the permitted premises, (ii) any premises  
712 immediately adjacent to the permitted premises that are owned or leased by the retail tobacco permittee, or  
713 (iii) any portion of public property immediately adjacent to the permitted premises from becoming a place  
714 where patrons of the establishment commit criminal violations of Article 1 (§ 18.2-30 et seq.), 2 (§ 18.2-38 et  
715 seq.), 2.1 (§ 18.2-46.1 et seq.), 2.2 (§ 18.2-46.4 et seq.), 3 (§ 18.2-47 et seq.), 4 (§ 18.2-51 et seq.), 5  
716 (§ 18.2-58 et seq.), 6 (§ 18.2-59 et seq.), or 7 (§ 18.2-61 et seq.) of Chapter 4 of Title 18.2; Article 2  
717 (§ 18.2-266 et seq.) of Chapter 7 of Title 18.2; Article 3 (§ 18.2-346 et seq.) or 5 (§ 18.2-372 et seq.) of  
718 Chapter 8 of Title 18.2; or Article 1 (§ 18.2-404 et seq.), 2 (§ 18.2-415), or 3 (§ 18.2-416 et seq.) of Chapter  
719 9 of Title 18.2, and such violations lead to arrests that are so frequent and serious as to reasonably be  
720 deemed a continuing threat to public safety; or

721 l. Has failed to take reasonable measures to prevent an act of violence resulting in death or serious bodily  
722 injury, or a recurrence of such acts, from occurring on (i) the permitted premises, (ii) any premises  
723 immediately adjacent to the permitted premises that is owned or leased by the retail tobacco permittee, or  
724 (iii) any portion of public property immediately adjacent to the permitted premises.

725 2. The place occupied by the retail tobacco permittee:

726 a. Does not conform to the requirements of the governing body of the locality in which such establishment  
727 is located with respect to sanitation, health, construction, or equipment or to any similar requirements  
728 established by the laws of the Commonwealth or by Board regulations;

729 *b. Has been adjudicated a common nuisance under the provisions of this subtitle or § 18.2-258; or*  
730 *c. Has become a meeting place or rendezvous for illegal gambling, illegal users of narcotics, drunks,*  
731 *prostitutes, pimps, panderers, or habitual law violators or has become a place where illegal drugs are*  
732 *regularly used or distributed. The Board may consider the general reputation in the community of such*  
733 *establishment in addition to any other competent evidence in making such determination.*

734 *3. The retail tobacco permittee or any employee of the retail tobacco permittee discriminated against any*  
735 *member of the Armed Forces of the United States by prices charged or otherwise.*

736 *4. Any cause exists for which the Board would have been entitled to refuse to grant such retail tobacco*  
737 *permit had the facts been known.*

738 *5. The retail tobacco permittee is delinquent for a period of 90 days or more in the payment of any taxes,*  
739 *or any related penalties or interest, lawfully imposed by the locality where the permitted business is located,*  
740 *as certified by the treasurer, commissioner of the revenue, or finance director of such locality, unless (i) the*  
741 *outstanding amount is de minimis; (ii) the retail tobacco permittee has pending a bona fide application for*  
742 *correction or appeal with respect to such taxes, penalties, or interest; or (iii) the retail tobacco permittee has*  
743 *entered into a payment plan approved by the same locality to settle the outstanding liability.*

744 *6. The Board, the Department of Taxation, or investigators with the Office of the Attorney General found*  
745 *that the retail tobacco permittee (i) exceeded the legal volume limits set by § 58.1-1017.1 during the prior*  
746 *year or (ii) committed any violation of § 59.1-293.20.*

747 *7. Investigators with the Office of the Attorney General seized cigarette inventory pursuant to § 2.2-509.1*  
748 *from the retail tobacco permittee during the prior year.*

749 *8. Any other cause authorized by this article.*

750 **§ 4.1-249. Grounds for which Board shall suspend or revoke retail tobacco permits.**

751 *The Board shall suspend or revoke any retail tobacco permit if it finds that:*

752 *1. A retail tobacco permittee has violated or permitted the violation of § 18.2-331, relating to the illegal*  
753 *possession of a gambling device, upon the premises for which the Board has granted a retail tobacco permit*  
754 *for the sale of retail tobacco products to the public.*

755 *2. A retail tobacco permittee has defrauded or attempted to defraud the Board or any federal, state, or*  
756 *local government or governmental agency or authority by making or filing any report, document, or tax*  
757 *return required by statute or regulation that is fraudulent or contains a willfully or knowingly false*  
758 *representation of a material fact or has willfully deceived or attempted to deceive the Board, or any federal,*  
759 *state, or local government or governmental agency or authority by making or maintaining business records*

760 *required by statute or regulation that are false or fraudulent.*

761 **§ 4.1-250. Suspension or revocation of retail tobacco permits; notice and hearings; imposition of**  
762 **penalties.**

763 *A. 1. Except for temporary retail tobacco permits issued pursuant to § 4.1-252, before the Board may*  
764 *impose a civil penalty or suspend or revoke any retail tobacco permit, reasonable notice of such proposed or*  
765 *contemplated action shall be given to the retail tobacco permittee in accordance with the provisions of*  
766 *§ 2.2-4020.*

767 *2. Notwithstanding the provisions of § 2.2-4022, the Board shall, upon written request by the retail*  
768 *tobacco permittee, permit the retail tobacco permittee to inspect and copy or photograph all (i) written or*  
769 *recorded statements made by the retail tobacco permittee or copies thereof or the substance of any oral*  
770 *statements made by the retail tobacco permittee or a previous or present employee of the retail tobacco*  
771 *permittee to any law-enforcement officer, the existence of which is known by the Board and upon which the*  
772 *Board intends to rely as evidence in any adversarial proceeding under this chapter against the retail tobacco*  
773 *permittee and (ii) designated books, papers, documents, tangible objects, buildings, or places, or copies or*  
774 *portions thereof, that are within the possession, custody, or control of the Board and upon which the Board*  
775 *intends to rely as evidence in any adversarial proceeding under this chapter against the retail tobacco*  
776 *permittee. In addition, any subpoena for the production of documents issued to any person at the request of*  
777 *the retail tobacco permittee or the Board pursuant to § 4.1-103 shall provide for the production of the*  
778 *documents sought within 10 working days, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in § 4.1-103.*

779 *3. If the Board fails to provide for inspection or copying under this section for the retail tobacco permittee*  
780 *after a written request, the Board shall be prohibited from introducing into evidence any items the retail*  
781 *tobacco permittee would have lawfully been entitled to inspect or copy under this section.*

782 *4. The action of the Board in suspending or revoking any retail tobacco permit or in imposing a civil*  
783 *penalty shall be subject to judicial review in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et*  
784 *seq.). Such review shall extend to the entire evidential record of the proceedings provided by the Board in*  
785 *accordance with the Administrative Process Act. An appeal shall lie to the Court of Appeals from any order*  
786 *of the court. Notwithstanding § 8.01-676.1, the final judgment or order of the circuit court shall not be*  
787 *suspended, stayed, or modified by such circuit court pending appeal to the Court of Appeals. Neither*  
788 *mandamus nor injunction shall lie in any such case.*

789 *B. In suspending any retail tobacco permit, the Board may impose, as a condition precedent to the*  
790 *removal of such suspension or any portion thereof, a requirement that the retail tobacco permittee pay the*

791 *cost incurred by the Board in investigating the retail tobacco permittee and in holding the proceeding*  
792 *resulting in such suspension, or it may impose and collect such civil penalties as it deems appropriate. In no*  
793 *event shall the Board impose a civil penalty exceeding \$2,000 for the first violation occurring within the five*  
794 *years immediately preceding the date of the violation or \$5,000 for the second violation occurring within the*  
795 *five years immediately preceding the date of the second violation. However, if the violation involved selling*  
796 *retail tobacco products to a person prohibited from purchasing such retail tobacco products, the Board may*  
797 *impose a civil penalty not to exceed \$3,000 for the first violation occurring within the five years immediately*  
798 *preceding the date of the violation and \$6,000 for a second violation occurring within the five years*  
799 *immediately preceding the date of the second violation in lieu of such suspension or any portion thereof, or*  
800 *both. The Board may also impose a requirement that the retail tobacco permittee pay for the cost incurred by*  
801 *the Board, not to exceed \$25,000, in investigating the retail tobacco permittee and in holding the proceeding*  
802 *resulting in the violation in addition to any suspension or civil penalty incurred.*

803 *C. Following notice to (i) the retail tobacco permittee of a hearing that may result in the suspension or*  
804 *revocation of the retail tobacco permit or (ii) the applicant of a hearing to resolve a contested application,*  
805 *the Board may accept a consent agreement as authorized in subdivision 21 of § 4.1-103. The notice shall*  
806 *advise the retail tobacco permittee or applicant of the option to (a) admit the alleged violation or the validity*  
807 *of the objection; (b) waive any right to a hearing or an appeal under the Administrative Process Act; and (c)*  
808 *(1) accept the proposed restrictions for operating under the retail tobacco permit, (2) accept the period of*  
809 *suspension of the permitted privileges within the Board's parameters, (3) pay a civil penalty in lieu of the*  
810 *period of suspension or any portion of the suspension as applicable, or (4) proceed to a hearing.*

811 *D. The Board may, by regulation or written order:*

812 *1. Designate those (i) objections to an application or (ii) alleged violations that will proceed to an initial*  
813 *hearing;*

814 *2. Designate the violations for which a waiver of a hearing and payment of a civil charge in lieu of*  
815 *suspension may be accepted for a first offense occurring within three years immediately preceding the date of*  
816 *the violation;*

817 *3. Establish a schedule of penalties for such offenses that prescribes the appropriate suspension of a retail*  
818 *tobacco permit and the civil charge acceptable in lieu of such suspension; and*

819 *4. Establish a schedule of offenses for which any penalty may be waived upon a showing that the retail*  
820 *tobacco permittee has had no prior violations within five years immediately preceding the date of the*  
821 *violation. No waiver shall be granted by the Board, however, for a retail tobacco permittee's willful and*

822 *knowing violation of this article or Board regulations.*

823 *E. Notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary in this section or in Article 3 (§ 2.2-4018 et seq.) of the*  
824 *Administrative Process Act, retail tobacco permittees shall be subject to the provisions of § 4.1-225.1.*

825 **§ 4.1-251. Suspension or revocation; disposition of retail tobacco products on hand; termination.**

826 *A. Retail tobacco products owned by or in possession of, or for sale by, any retail tobacco permittee at the*  
827 *time the retail tobacco permit of such retail tobacco permittee is suspended or revoked may be disposed of as*  
828 *follows:*

829 *1. Sold to persons in the Commonwealth who are permitted to sell such retail tobacco products; or*

830 *2. Upon retail tobacco permits granted by the Board and conditions specified by the Board, sold to*  
831 *persons outside the Commonwealth for resale outside the Commonwealth upon retail tobacco permits*  
832 *granted by the Board.*

833 *B. Upon retail tobacco permits granted by the Board and upon payment of any excise tax due thereon,*  
834 *retail tobacco products owned and in possession of, or either, or for sale by, any retail tobacco permittee at*  
835 *the time the retail tobacco permit of such retail tobacco permittee is suspended or revoked may be sold to any*  
836 *person authorized to purchase the same for resale.*

837 *C. All retail tobacco products owned by or in possession of any retail tobacco permittee whose retail*  
838 *tobacco permit is suspended or revoked shall be disposed of by such retail tobacco permittee in accordance*  
839 *with the provisions of this section within 60 days from the date of such suspension or revocation.*

840 *D. Retail tobacco products owned by, or in possession of, or for sale by any retail tobacco permittee*  
841 *whose retail tobacco permit has been terminated other than by suspension or revocation may be disposed of*  
842 *in accordance with subsection A or B within such time as the Board deems proper. Such period shall not be*  
843 *less than 60 days.*

844 *E. All retail tobacco products owned by or remaining in the possession of any retail tobacco permittee*  
845 *described in subsection A, B, or D after the expiration of such period shall be deemed contraband and*  
846 *forfeited to the Commonwealth in accordance with the provisions of § 4.1-338.*

847 **§ 4.1-252. Continuation of retail tobacco permittee operations in certain instances; temporary retail**  
848 **tobacco permits.**

849 *A. The Board may grant the following temporary permits which shall authorize:*

850 *1. Any person who (i) purchases at a foreclosure, secured creditor's, or judicial auction sale the premises*  
851 *or property of a retail tobacco permittee or (ii) has become lawfully entitled to the possession of the*  
852 *permitted premises to continue to operate the retail tobacco establishment to the same extent as a retail*

853 *tobacco permittee for a period not to exceed 60 days or for such longer period as determined by the Board.*  
854 *Such retail tobacco permit shall be temporary and shall confer the privileges of any retail tobacco permits*  
855 *held by the previous owner to the extent determined by the Board. Such temporary retail tobacco permit may*  
856 *be issued in advance, conditioned on the above requirements.*

857 *2. Any person who, through contract, lease, concession, license, management or similar agreement*  
858 *(collectively, the contract), becomes lawfully entitled to the use and control of the premises of a retail*  
859 *tobacco permittee to continue to operate the retail tobacco establishment to the same extent as a retail*  
860 *tobacco permittee, provided such person has made application to the Board for a retail tobacco permit at the*  
861 *same premises. The temporary retail tobacco permit shall (i) confer the privileges of any retail tobacco*  
862 *permits held by the previous owner to the extent determined by the Board and (ii) be valid for a period of 120*  
863 *days or for such longer period as may be necessary as determined by the Board pending the completion of*  
864 *the processing of the temporary retail tobacco permittee's retail tobacco permit application. No temporary*  
865 *retail tobacco permit shall be issued without the written consent of the previous retail tobacco permittee. No*  
866 *temporary retail tobacco permit shall be issued under the provisions of this subdivision if the previous retail*  
867 *tobacco permittee owes any state or local taxes, or has any pending charges for violation of this article or*  
868 *any Board regulation, unless the temporary retail tobacco permittee agrees to assume the liability of the*  
869 *previous retail tobacco permittee for the taxes or any penalty for the pending charges. An application for a*  
870 *temporary retail tobacco permit may be filed prior to the effective date of the contract, in which case the*  
871 *temporary retail tobacco permit, when issued, shall become effective on the effective date of the contract.*  
872 *Upon the effective date of the temporary retail tobacco permit, (a) the temporary retail tobacco permittee*  
873 *shall be responsible for compliance with the provisions of this article and any Board regulation and (b) the*  
874 *previous retail tobacco permittee shall not be held liable for any violation of this article or any Board*  
875 *regulation committed by, or any errors or omissions of, the temporary retail tobacco permittee.*

876 *B. Every application for a temporary retail tobacco permit granted pursuant to this section shall be on a*  
877 *form prescribed by the Board. The fee for a temporary retail tobacco permit shall be one-twelfth of the*  
878 *combined retail tobacco permit application fee and retail tobacco permit fee computed to the nearest cent*  
879 *and multiplied by the number of months for which the temporary retail tobacco permit is granted.*

880 *C. The decision to refuse to grant a temporary retail tobacco permit shall not be subject to a hearing. A*  
881 *temporary retail tobacco permit may be revoked summarily by the Board for any cause set forth in § 4.1-248*  
882 *without complying with subsection A of § 4.1-250. Revocation of a temporary retail tobacco permit shall be*  
883 *effective upon service of the order of revocation upon the temporary retail tobacco permittee or upon the*

884 *expiration of three business days after the order of the revocation has been mailed to the temporary retail*  
885 *tobacco permittee at either his residence or the address given for the business in the application. No further*  
886 *notice shall be required.*

887 **§ 4.1-253. Records of certain retail tobacco permittees; audits, inspections, and investigations;**  
888 **penalties.**

889 *A. Every retail tobacco permittee that receives, stores, sells, handles, or transports liquid nicotine or*  
890 *nicotine vapor products shall preserve all invoices, books, papers, canceled checks, or other documents*  
891 *relating to the purchase, sale, exchange, receipt, or transportation of all liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor*  
892 *products for a period of three years. All such invoices, books, papers, canceled checks, or other documents*  
893 *shall be subject to audit or inspection at any time by any duly authorized representative of the Attorney*  
894 *General.*

895 *B. Any person who violates the provisions of subsection A is guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor.*

896 *C. The Department of Taxation shall impose a penalty of \$1,000 for each day that a person fails or*

909 *with other law-enforcement officials engaging in enforcement action relating to such trafficking.*

910 **§ 4.1-254. Retail Tobacco Enforcement Fund.**

911 *There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the Retail*  
912 *Tobacco Enforcement Fund, referred to in this section as "the Fund." The Fund shall be established on the*

921 *on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the Chief Executive Officer of the*  
922 *Authority.*

923 *Article 4.*

924 *Retail Tobacco Products.*

925 **§ 4.1-355. *Illegal sale of retail tobacco products in general; penalty.***

926 *Any person who is not a retail tobacco permittee who sells any retail tobacco product except as permitted*  
927 *by this subtitle or, for manufacturers or distributors licensed by the Department of Taxation, purchases such*  
928 *products for resale pursuant to Title 58.1, is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.*

929 **§ 4.1-356. *Packaging of certain retail tobacco products; civil penalty.***

930 *A. Cigarettes shall be sold only in sealed packages provided by the manufacturer, with the required health*  
931 *warning. The proprietor of every retail tobacco establishment that offers for sale any retail tobacco product*  
932 *shall post in a conspicuous manner and place a sign or signs indicating that the sale of retail tobacco*  
933 *products to any person under 21 years of age is prohibited by law.*

934 *B. For the purpose of compliance with regulations of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services*  
935 *Administration published as 61 Federal Register 1492, the Board may promulgate regulations that allow the*  
936 *Board to undertake the activities necessary to comply with such regulations.*

937 *C. Agents of the Authority may issue a summons for any violation of this section. Any attorney for the*  
938 *locality in which an alleged violation of this section occurred may enforce this section by civil action to*  
939 *recover a civil penalty not to exceed \$500. The civil penalty shall be paid into the local treasury. No filing fee*  
940 *or other fee or cost shall be charged to the locality which instituted the action.*

941 *D. Nothing in this section shall be construed to create a private cause of action.*

942 **§ 4.1-357. *Sale or distribution of liquid nicotine container; prohibition; penalty.***

943 *A. No person shall sell or distribute at retail or offer for retail sale or distribution a liquid nicotine*  
944 *container in the Commonwealth unless such liquid nicotine container meets child-resistant packaging*  
945 *standards.*

956 *any other federal agency where such legislation or regulations mandate child-resistant packaging for liquid*  
957 *nicotine containers.*

958 *E. The provisions of this section with respect to retail sales, retail establishments, and offers for retail*  
959 *sales shall only apply to retail sales or offers at retail of liquid nicotine containers before July 1, 2024.*

960 **§ 4.1-358. Purchase of retail tobacco products from person not authorized to sell; penalty.**

961 *Any person who buys retail tobacco products from any person other than a retail tobacco permittee*  
962 *authorized under this subtitle is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.*

963 **§ 4.1-359. Persons to whom retail tobacco products may not be sold; proof of legal age; civil penalty.**

964 *A. No person shall sell to any person younger than 21 years of age, knowing or having reason to believe*  
965 *that such person is younger than 21 years of age, any retail tobacco products. No person shall sell retail*  
966 *tobacco products from a vending machine.*

967 *B. 1. No person shall sell a retail tobacco product to any individual who does not demonstrate, by*

975 *detection software, technology, or a scanner that confirms the authenticity of such identification.*

976 *3. This subsection shall not apply to mail order or internet sales, provided that the person offering the*

977 *retail tobacco product for sale through mail order or the internet (i) prior to the sale of the retail tobacco*  
978 *product verifies that the purchaser is at least 21 years of age through a commercially available database that*  
979 *is regularly used by businesses or governmental entities for the purpose of age and identity verification and*

982 *C. A violation of subsection A or B by an individual is punishable by a civil penalty in the amount of \$500*

984 *three-year period. Such civil penalty shall not preclude the Board from taking administrative action against a*  
985 *retail tobacco permittee for the conduct of his agent or employee who violates subsection A or B. If*  
986 *applicable, upon a second or subsequent violation within a three-year period, the Board may suspend or*  
987 *revoke any retail tobacco permit issued pursuant to this subtitle.*

988 **§ 4.1-360. Prohibiting possession of retail tobacco products by a person younger than 21 years of age;**  
989 **seizure.**

990 *A. No person younger than 21 years of age shall possess any retail tobacco product. The provisions of this*  
991 *section shall not apply to the possession of retail tobacco products by a person younger than 21 years of age*  
992 *(i) making a delivery of retail tobacco products in pursuance of his employment or (ii) as part of a scientific*

1002 *subdivision A 2 of § 19.2-386.23.*

1003 *C. The seizure of contraband pursuant to subsection B shall be the sole penalty for a violation of this*

1005 *D. The provisions of this section shall not preclude prosecution under any other statute.*

1007 **forfeiture.**

1008 A. Any person who purchases for, or otherwise gives, provides, or assists in the provision of retail

1010 21 years of age, except (i) where possession of the retail tobacco products by a person younger than 21 years

1193 E. No person shall sell, rent, or loan any item described in subdivision A 1 or A 2 to any individual who

1195 F. A violation of subsection A, B, C, or D is a Class 1 misdemeanor. A person or separate retail  
1196 establishment who violates subsection E shall be liable for a civil penalty not to exceed \$100 for a first  
1197 violation, a civil penalty not to exceed \$200 for a second violation, and a civil penalty not to exceed \$500 for  
1198 a third or subsequent violation.

1200 A. 1. No person shall engage in the business of selling or dealing in tobacco products as a distributor in  
1201 the Commonwealth without first having received a separate license from the Department for each location or  
1202 place of business. Each application for a distributor's license shall be accompanied by a fee to be prescribed  
1203 by the Department. Every application for such license shall be made on a form prescribed by the Department  
1204 and the following information shall be provided on the application:

1206 and address of each of its members shall be provided. If the applicant is a corporation, the name and address  
1207 of each of its principal officers shall be provided;

1209 c. The place or places where the business to be licensed is to be conducted; and

1210 d. Such other information as the Department may require for the purpose of the administration of this  
1211 article.

1212 2. A person outside the Commonwealth who ships or transports tobacco products to retailers in the  
1213 Commonwealth, to be sold by those retailers, may make application for license as a distributor, be granted  
1214 such a license by the Department, and thereafter be subject to all the provisions of this article. Once a license  
1215 is granted pursuant to this section, such person shall be entitled to act as a licensed distributor and, unless  
1216 such person maintains a registered agent pursuant to Chapter 9 (§ 13.1-601 et seq.), 10 (§ 13.1-801 et seq.),

1228 engaged in handling tobacco products at the licensable location of the applicant have been (i) found guilty of  
1229 any fraud or misrepresentation in any connection; (ii) convicted of robbery, extortion, burglary, larceny,  
1230 embezzlement, fraudulent conversion, gambling, perjury, bribery, treason, or racketeering; or (iii) convicted  
1231 of a felony. Anyone who knowingly and willfully falsifies, conceals, or misrepresents a material fact or  
1232 knowingly and willfully makes a false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or representation in any application  
1233 for a distributor's license to the Department, is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. The Department may  
1234 establish an application or renewal fee not to exceed \$750 to be retained by the Department to be applied to  
1235 the administrative and other costs of processing distributor's license applications, conducting background  
1236 investigations, and issuing distributor's licenses. Any amount collected pursuant to this section in excess of  
1237 such costs as of June 30 in even-numbered years shall be reported to the State Treasurer and deposited into  
1238 the state treasury.

1239 3. No person inside or outside the Commonwealth shall make a remote retail sale of cigars or pipe tobacco  
1240 to consumers in the Commonwealth without (i) completing an application for and being granted a license as a  
1241 remote retail seller; (ii) determining whether economic nexus activity thresholds have been met to register for  
1242 a dealer's certificate under § 58.1-613; (iii) if economic nexus thresholds are met, collecting and remitting the  
1243 excise tax pursuant to subsection A of § 58.1-1021.02; (iv) providing for age verification through an  
1244 independent, third-party age verification service that compares information available from a commercially  
1245 available database, or aggregate of databases, that is regularly used by government agencies and businesses  
1246 for the purpose of age and identity verification to the personal information entered by the individual during

1332 compares information available from a commercially available database, or aggregate of databases, that is  
1333 regularly used by government agencies and businesses for the purpose of age and identity verification to the  
1334 personal information entered by the individual during the ordering process that establishes that the individual  
1335 is of age.

1336 6. For any transaction between a distributor and a retail dealer involving liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor  
1337 products, both the distributor and the retail dealer shall maintain and retain records of any invoice or sales  
1338 receipt involved that shall include itemized lists of the types of products included in such transaction, the tax  
1339 due on each product pursuant to subsection B of § 58.1-1021.02, and the total amount of taxes paid. Such  
1340 records shall be produced and provided to the Department as necessary for auditing, compliance, and  
1341 enforcement purposes.

1342 D. C. The Department shall compile and maintain a current list of licensed distributors and remote retail  
1343 sellers of tobacco products and of manufacturers, distributors, and retail dealers of liquid nicotine and

**1357** 7. Advertising or offering for sale goods that are used, secondhand, repossessed, defective, blemished,  
**1358** deteriorated, or reconditioned, or that are "seconds," irregulars, imperfects, or "not first class," without clearly  
**1359** and unequivocally indicating in the advertisement or offer for sale that the goods are used, secondhand,  
**1360** repossessed, defective, blemished, deteriorated, reconditioned, or are "seconds," irregulars, imperfects, or  
**1361** "not first class";

**1362** 8. Advertising goods or services with intent not to sell them as advertised, or with intent not to sell at the  
**1363** price or upon the terms advertised.

**1364** In any action brought under this subdivision, the refusal by any person, or any employee, agent, or servant  
**1365** thereof, to sell any goods or services advertised or offered for sale at the price or upon the terms advertised or  
**1366** offered, shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this subdivision. This paragraph shall not apply when  
**1367** it is clearly and conspicuously stated in the advertisement or offer by which such goods or services are  
**1368** advertised or offered for sale, that the supplier or offeror has a limited quantity or amount of such goods or

1378 "wholesaler," "factory," or "manufacturer" in the supplier's name, or to describe the nature of the supplier's  
1379 business, unless the supplier is actually engaged primarily in selling at wholesale or in manufacturing the  
1380 goods or services advertised or offered for sale;

1381 13. Using in any contract or lease any liquidated damage clause, penalty clause, or waiver of defense, or  
1382 attempting to collect any liquidated damages or penalties under any clause, waiver, damages, or penalties that  
1383 are void or unenforceable under any otherwise applicable laws of the Commonwealth, or under federal  
1384 statutes or regulations;

1385 13a. Failing to provide to a consumer, or failing to use or include in any written document or material  
1386 provided to or executed by a consumer, in connection with a consumer transaction any statement, disclosure,  
1387 notice, or other information however characterized when the supplier is required by 16 C.F.R. Part 433 to so  
1388 provide, use, or include the statement, disclosure, notice, or other information in connection with the  
1389 consumer transaction;

1390 14. Using any other deception, fraud, false pretense, false promise, or misrepresentation in connection  
1391 with a consumer transaction;

1392 15. Violating any provision of § 3.2-6509, 3.2-6512, 3.2-6513, 3.2-6513.1, 3.2-6514, 3.2-6515, 3.2-6516,  
1393 or 3.2-6519 is a violation of this chapter;

1394 16. Failing to disclose all conditions, charges, or fees relating to:

1395 a. The return of goods for refund, exchange, or credit. Such disclosure shall be by means of a sign  
1396 attached to the goods, or placed in a conspicuous public area of the premises of the supplier, so as to be  
1397 readily noticeable and readable by the person obtaining the goods from the supplier. If the supplier does not  
1398 permit a refund, exchange, or credit for return, he shall so state on a similar sign. The provisions of this  
1399 subdivision shall not apply to any retail merchant who has a policy of providing, for a period of not less than  
1400 20 days after date of purchase, a cash refund or credit to the purchaser's credit card account for the return of  
1401 defective, unused, or undamaged merchandise upon presentation of proof of purchase. In the case of  
1402 merchandise paid for by check, the purchase shall be treated as a cash purchase and any refund may be

1499 derivative" means a chemical compound produced by man through a chemical transformation to turn a  
1500 compound into a different compound by adding or subtracting molecules to or from the original compound.  
1501 This subdivision shall not (i) apply to products that are approved for marketing by the U.S. Food and Drug  
1502 Administration and scheduled in the Drug Control Act (§ 54.1-3400 et seq.) or (ii) be construed to prohibit  
1503 any conduct permitted under Chapter 16 (§ 4.1-1600 et seq.) of Title 4.1;

1526 73. Selling or offering for sale any substance intended for human consumption, orally or by inhalation,  
1527 that contains tetrahydrocannabinol and, without authorization, bears, is packaged in a container or wrapper

1528 that bears, or is otherwise labeled to bear the trademark, trade name, famous mark as defined in 15 U.S.C. §  
1529 1125, or other identifying mark, imprint, or device, or any likeness thereof, of a manufacturer, processor,  
1530 packer, or distributor of a product intended for human consumption other than the manufacturer, processor,  
1531 packer, or distributor that did in fact so manufacture, process, pack, or distribute such substance;

1532 74. Selling or offering for sale a topical hemp product, as defined in § 3.2-4112, that does not include a  
1533 label stating that the product is not intended for human consumption. This subdivision shall not (i) apply to  
1534 products that are approved for marketing by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and scheduled in the  
1535 Drug Control Act (§ 54.1-3400 et seq.), (ii) be construed to prohibit any conduct permitted under Chapter 16  
1536 (§ 4.1-1600 et seq.) of Title 4.1, or (iii) apply to topical hemp products that were manufactured prior to July  
1537 1, 2023, provided that the person provides documentation of the date of manufacture if requested;

1540 77. Selling or offering for sale (i) any kratom product to a person younger than 21 years of age or (ii) any  
1541 kratom product that does not include a label listing all ingredients and with the following guidance: "This  
1542 product may be harmful to your health, has not been evaluated by the FDA, and is not intended to diagnose,  
1543 treat, cure, or prevent any disease." As used in this subdivision, "kratom" means any part of the leaf of the  
1544 plant *Mitragyna speciosa* or any extract thereof;

1545 78. Advertising of any ignition interlock system in Virginia by an ignition interlock vendor not approved  
1546 by the Commission on the Virginia Alcohol Safety Action Program to operate in Virginia; targeted

1559 81. Selling or offering for sale services as a professional mold remediator to be performed upon any  
1560 residential dwelling without holding a mold remediation certification from a nationally or internationally  
1561 recognized certifying body for mold remediation, and failing to comply with (i) the U.S. Environmental  
1562 Protection Agency's publication on Mold Remediation in Schools and Commercial Buildings, as revised; (ii)  
1563 the ANSI/IICRC S520 Standard for Professional Mold Remediation, as revised; or (iii) any other equivalent  
1564 ANSI-accredited mold remediation standard, when conducting or offering to conduct mold remediation in the  
1565 Commonwealth;

1566 82. Willfully violating any provision of § 59.1-444.4;

1567 83. Violating any provision of ~~Chapter 23.2 (§ 59.1-293.10 et seq.)~~ §§ 4.1-253, 4.1-356, 4.1-357, or  
1568 59.1-293.15 through 59.1-293.22;

1569 84. Selling any food that is required by the FDA to have a nutrition label that does not meet the  
1570 requirements of 21 C.F.R. Part 101;

1571 85. Obtaining, disclosing, selling, or disseminating any personally identifiable reproductive or sexual  
1572 health information without the consent of the consumer;

1573 86. Violating any provision of Chapter 58 (§ 59.1-607 et seq.); and

1574 87. (Effective July 1, 2026) Violating any provision of the Medical Debt Protection Act (§ 59.1-611 et  
1575 seq.).

1576 B. Nothing in this section shall be construed to invalidate or make unenforceable any contract or lease  
1577 solely by reason of the failure of such contract or lease to comply with any other law of the Commonwealth  
1578 or any federal statute or regulation, to the extent such other law, statute, or regulation provides that a violation  
1579 of such law, statute, or regulation shall not invalidate or make unenforceable such contract or lease.

1580 **§ 59.1-293.10. Definitions.**

1581 As used in this chapter, unless the context requires ~~another~~ a different meaning:

1582 "Child-resistant packaging" means packaging that is designed or constructed to meet the child-resistant  
1583 effectiveness standards set forth in 16 C.F.R. § 1700.15(b)(1) when tested in accordance with the protocols  
1584 described in 16 C.F.R. § 1700.20 as in effect on July 1, 2015.

1585 "Department" means the Department of Taxation.

1586 "Liquid nicotine" means the same as that term is defined in § 58.1-1021.01.

1587 "Liquid nicotine container" means a bottle or other container holding liquid nicotine in any concentration

1588 but does not include a cartridge containing liquid nicotine if such cartridge is prefilled and sealed by the  
1589 manufacturer of such cartridge and is not intended to be opened by the consumer.

1590 "Nicotine vapor product" means the same as that term is defined in § 58.1-1021.01 and includes liquid  
1591 nicotine containers.

1592 "*Permitted location*" means the individual location or place of business permitted as a retail tobacco  
1593 establishment by a retail tobacco permittee.

1594 "Retail dealer" means the same as that term is defined in § 58.1-1021.01.

1595 "Retail tobacco product" means ~~(i) any product containing, made of, or derived from tobacco or that~~  
1596 ~~contains nicotine that is intended for human consumption or is likely to be consumed, whether smoked,~~  
1597 ~~heated, chewed, dissolved, inhaled, absorbed, or ingested by other means, including a cigarette, a heated~~  
1598 ~~tobacco product, chewing tobacco, snuff, or snus; (ii) any electronic smoking device and any substances that~~  
1599 ~~may be aerosolized or vaporized by such device, whether or not the substance contains nicotine; and (iii) any~~  
1600 ~~component, part, or accessory of a product described in clause (i) or (ii), whether or not such component,~~  
1601 ~~part, or accessory contains tobacco or nicotine, including filters, rolling papers, blunt or hemp wraps, and~~  
1602 ~~glass pipes. "Retail tobacco product" includes any nicotine vapor product. "Retail tobacco product" does not~~  
1603 ~~include drugs or devices, as such terms are defined in 21 U.S.C. § 321, or combination products, as such term~~  
1604 ~~is used in 21 U.S.C. § 353, if such drugs, devices, or combination products are authorized for sale by the U.S.~~  
1605 ~~Food and Drug Administration. "Retail tobacco product" does not include any cigar or pipe tobacco as~~  
1606 ~~defined in § 58.1-1021.01 the same as that term is defined in § 4.1-100.~~

1607 "Tobacco retailer" means any person, partnership, joint venture, society, club, trustee, trust, association,  
1608 organization, or corporation that owns, operates, or manages any tobacco retail establishment. "Tobacco  
1609 retailer" does not include nonmanagement employees of a tobacco retail establishment.

1610 "Tobacco retail establishment" means any place of business where retail tobacco products are available  
1611 for sale to the general public, including any grocery store, retail tobacco product shop, kiosk, convenience  
1612 store, gasoline service station, bar, or restaurant where retail tobacco products are available for sale to the  
1613 general public.

1614 **§ 59.1-293.13. Required education for retail dealers and employees.**

1615 Any retail dealer shall be required to attest that it has conducted education and training for its employees  
1616 related to:

1617 1. The provisions of ~~§ 59.1-293.12~~ *Article 4 (§ 4.1-355 et seq.) of Chapter 3 of Title 4.1;*

1618 2. The prohibitions on the sale of retail tobacco products to persons under age 21 and other restrictions  
1619 prescribed by §§ 18.2-246.8, 18.2-246.10, and 18.2-371.2;

1620 3. Forms of identification that are acceptable as proof of age; and

1621 4. The legal penalties that may be incurred for violation of the provisions of law identified in subdivisions  
1622 1 and 2.

1623 **§ 59.1-293.15. Liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor product; directory.**

1624 The Attorney General shall establish and maintain a directory that lists all liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor  
1625 product manufacturers and liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products for which current and accurate  
1626 certification forms have been submitted in accordance with the provisions of § ~~59.1-293.13~~ 59.1-293.16. The  
1627 Attorney General shall make the directory available for public inspection on its website. The Attorney  
1628 General shall update the directory as necessary.

1629 **§ 59.1-293.16. Liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor product; certification; penalty.**

1630 A. By December 31, 2025, and annually thereafter, every manufacturer of liquid nicotine or nicotine  
1631 vapor products that are sold for retail sale in the Commonwealth, whether directly or through a wholesaler,  
1632 distributor, retailer, or similar intermediary, shall certify in a form and manner as prescribed by the Attorney  
1633 General that the manufacturer agrees to comply with the provisions of this chapter and that:

1634 1. The manufacturer has received a marketing authorization or similar order for the liquid nicotine or  
1635 nicotine vapor product from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration pursuant to 21 U.S.C. § 387j; or

1636 2. The liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product was marketed in the United States as of August 8, 2016,  
1637 or the manufacturer submitted a premarket tobacco product application for the liquid nicotine or nicotine  
1638 vapor product to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration pursuant to 21 U.S.C. § 387j on or before  
1639 September 9, 2020, and the application either remains under review by the U.S. Food and Drug  
1640 Administration or a final decision on the application has not otherwise taken effect.

1641 B. A manufacturer of liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products shall submit a certification *or*  
1642 *recertification* form for each liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor product that such manufacturer sells for retail  
1643 sale in the Commonwealth.

1644 C. Each certification *or recertification* form shall be accompanied by:

1645 ~~±~~ ~~A~~ a copy of the marketing authorization or other order for each liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor  
1646 product issued by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration pursuant to 21 U.S.C. § 387j, or evidence that the  
1647 premarket tobacco product application for the liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product was submitted to the

1648 U.S. Food and Drug Administration and a final authorization or order has not yet taken effect; *and*:

1649 ~~2. A 1. An initial certification fee of \$2,000~~ \$5,000 for each liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor product; to  
1650 be remitted with the manufacturer's first certification submission that identifies any such product and with  
1651 any resubmission of a certification for any such product following any period of noncertified status; ~~and or~~

1652 ~~3. A 2. An annual recertification fee of \$500 to be submitted annually~~ \$2,500 for each liquid nicotine and  
1653 nicotine vapor product to be remitted with the manufacturer's annual recertification submission identifying  
1654 any ~~liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor~~ *such* product, where such recertification does not follow any period of  
1655 noncertified status.

1656 D. A manufacturer required to submit a certification pursuant to this section shall notify the Attorney  
1657 General within 30 days of any material change to the certification form, including the issuance or denial of a  
1658 marketing authorization or other order or action by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration pursuant to 21  
1659 U.S.C. § 387j, or any other order or action by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration that affects the ability  
1660 of the liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product to be introduced or delivered into interstate commerce for  
1661 commercial distribution in the United States.

1662 E. Any manufacturer that falsely represents any of the information required by this section is guilty of a  
1663 Class 3 misdemeanor for each false representation. *Notwithstanding the provisions of § 2.2-511, the Attorney*  
1664 *General may institute or conduct a prosecution for a violation of this subsection.* Venue for prosecution of a  
1665 *such* violation of ~~this subsection~~ shall be proper in the Circuit Court for the City of Richmond.

1666 **§ 59.1-293.17. Removal or exclusion from directory.**

1667 A. The Attorney General shall, in accordance with the provisions of this section, remove or exclude from  
1668 the directory any liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product manufacturer or liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor  
1669 product that the Attorney General determines is not in compliance with the provisions of this chapter.

1670 B. If the Attorney General determines to remove or exclude from the directory a liquid nicotine or  
1671 nicotine vapor product manufacturer or a liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product in the directory, the  
1672 Attorney General shall notify by electronic or other practicable means the manufacturer's registered agent in  
1673 the Commonwealth of such determination. The liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product manufacturer shall  
1674 have 10 business days from receipt of such notice to establish that the liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor  
1675 product manufacturer or liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product meets the requirements to be included in  
1676 the directory. If the liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product manufacturer fails to establish compliance  
1677 within the 10-business-day period, the Attorney General shall remove or exclude from the directory the liquid

1678 nicotine or nicotine vapor product manufacturer or liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product.

1679 C. Any determination by the Attorney General to remove or exclude from the directory a manufacturer or  
1680 a product shall be subject to review by the filing of a civil action for prospective declaratory or injunctive  
1681 relief in the Circuit Court for the City of Richmond.

1682 D. If a liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product is removed from the directory:

1683 1. Each retailer, distributor, and wholesaler shall have 30 days to sell the product or remove such product  
1684 intended for retail sale in the Commonwealth from its inventory and return the product to the manufacturer  
1685 for disposal. After ~~24~~ 30 days following the removal from the directory, the liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor  
1686 products removed from the directory shall be subject to seizure, forfeiture, and destruction *by the Attorney*  
1687 *General, the attorney for the Commonwealth, or the attorney for the county, city, or town or by local law*  
1688 *enforcement* and shall not be purchased or sold in the Commonwealth.

1689 2. Each manufacturer, wholesaler, or retail dealer selling the product intended for retail sale in the  
1690 Commonwealth shall notify each purchaser of the product that it has been removed from the directory at the  
1691 time of delivery of such product. Unless otherwise provided by contract or purchase agreement, the  
1692 manufacturer, wholesaler, or retail dealer shall provide the purchaser a refund of the purchase price of the  
1693 removed product. If a manufacturer, wholesaler, or retail dealer fails to provide such refund, the purchaser  
1694 may bring an action against the manufacturer, wholesaler, or retail dealer in a court of competent jurisdiction  
1695 to recover the purchase price and reasonable attorney fees and costs.

1696 § 59.1-293.18. **Agent for service of process.**

1697 A. Any nonresident manufacturer of liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products that has not registered to  
1698 do business in the Commonwealth as a foreign corporation or business entity shall, as a condition precedent  
1699 to being included in the directory established by the Attorney General pursuant to § ~~59.1-293.12~~ 59.1-293.15,  
1700 appoint and continually engage without interruption the services of an agent in the Commonwealth to act as  
1701 agent for the service of process in any action or proceeding against such nonresident manufacturer concerning  
1702 or arising out of the enforcement of this chapter, and such nonresident manufacturer may be served in any  
1703 manner authorized by law. Such service shall constitute legal and valid service of process on the nonresident  
1704 manufacturer. The manufacturer shall provide the name, address, telephone number, and proof of the  
1705 appointment and availability of such agent to the Attorney General.

1706 B. The manufacturer shall provide notice to the Attorney General 30 calendar days prior to termination of  
1707 the authority of an agent and shall further provide proof to the satisfaction of the Attorney General of the

1708 appointment of a new agent no less than five calendar days prior to the termination of an existing agent  
1709 appointment. In the event an agent terminates an agency appointment, the manufacturer shall notify the  
1710 Attorney General of the termination within five calendar days and shall include proof to the satisfaction of the  
1711 Attorney General of the appointment of a new agent.

1712 C. Any manufacturer whose liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products are sold in the Commonwealth who  
1713 has not appointed and engaged the services of an agent as required by this section shall be deemed to have  
1714 appointed the Secretary of the Commonwealth as its agent for service of process. The appointment of the  
1715 Secretary of the Commonwealth as agent shall not satisfy the condition precedent required in subsection A to  
1716 be included in the directory.

1717 **§ 59.1-293.20. Sale or distribution prohibited.**

1718 A. Beginning December 31, 2025, no person shall sell, distribute, or import for resale, or offer for sale a  
1719 liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product for retail sale in the Commonwealth unless such liquid nicotine or  
1720 nicotine vapor product is included in the directory established by the Attorney General pursuant to §  
1721 ~~59.1-293.12~~ 59.1-293.15.

1722 B. Beginning December 31, 2025, no liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product manufacturer shall sell for  
1723 retail sale, either directly or through a wholesaler, distributor, retailer, or similar intermediary or  
1724 intermediaries, a liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product in the Commonwealth unless such liquid nicotine  
1725 or nicotine vapor product is included in the directory established by the Attorney General pursuant to §  
1726 ~~59.1-293.12~~ 59.1-293.15.

1727 C. Any person that violates the provisions of subsection A *or* B is subject to a fine of \$1,000 per day for  
1728 each product offered for sale in violation until the offending product is removed from the market or until the  
1729 offending product is properly listed on the directory.

1730 D. A liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product manufacturer that violates the provisions of subsection B is  
1731 subject to a fine of \$1,000 per day for each product offered for sale in violation until the offending product is  
1732 removed from the market or until the offending product is properly listed on the directory.

1733 E. *the following civil penalties:*

1734 1. *For the first violation, a penalty of no less than \$5,000 per liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product*  
1735 *offered for sale;*

1736 2. *For a second violation, a penalty of no less than \$10,000 per liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product*  
1737 *offered for sale; and*

1738 3. *For a third violation, a penalty of no less than \$15,000 per liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product*

1739 *offered for sale.*

1740 *Such civil penalties shall only apply to the specific licensed location where the violation occurred.*

1741 *D. Each retailer shall have 60 days from the date that the Attorney General first makes the directory*  
1742 *available for inspection on its public website to sell any products that were in its inventory and not included*  
1743 *in the directory or to remove from inventory and return such products to the manufacturer for disposal.*

1744 ~~*F. E.*~~ *Each distributor or wholesaler shall have 60 days from the date that the Attorney General first makes*  
1745 *the directory available for inspection on its public website to remove any products intended for sale in the*  
1746 *Commonwealth from its inventory and return such products to the manufacturer for disposal.*

1747 ~~*G. F.*~~ *In an action brought under this section, the Attorney General, the attorney for the Commonwealth,*  
1748 *or the attorney for the county, city, or town may recover reasonable costs of investigation, the costs of the*  
1749 *action, and attorney fees in addition to any civil penalties.*

1750 ~~*H. G.*~~ *Any civil penalties, costs, and attorney fees assessed under this section in an action brought in the*  
1751 *name of a locality shall be paid into the general fund of the locality.*

1752 ~~*I. H.*~~ *All civil penalties, costs, and attorney fees assessed under this section in an action brought in the*

1755 **§ 59.1-293.21. Enforcement; inspection; forfeiture.**

1756 *A. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, the Attorney General, any attorney for the*  
1757 *Commonwealth, or the attorney for any city, county, or town may cause an action to be brought in the*  
1758 *appropriate circuit court in the name of the Commonwealth or of the county, city, or town to enjoin any*  
1759 *violation of this chapter. The circuit court having jurisdiction may enjoin such violations notwithstanding the*  
1760 *existence of an adequate remedy at law. In any action under this section, it shall not be necessary that*  
1761 *damages be proved.*

1762 *B. The circuit courts are authorized to (i) issue temporary or permanent injunctions to restrain and prevent*  
1763 *violations of this chapter and (ii) order forfeiture of any property seized for a violation of this chapter.*

1764 *C. Each violation of this chapter shall constitute a separate violation and shall be subject to any penalties*  
1765 *imposed under this chapter.*

1766 *D. Any retailer or wholesaler that sells or distributes any liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product in the*  
1767 *Commonwealth shall be subject to scheduled or unscheduled compliance checks carried out by the Attorney*  
1768 *General, or an agent thereof, for the purposes of enforcing the provisions of this chapter and Article 4*  
1769 *(§ 4.1-241 et seq.) of Chapter 2 of Title 4.1.*

1770 *E. Any liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product that has been sold, offered for sale, or possessed for sale*  
1771 *in the Commonwealth, or imported for personal consumption in the Commonwealth, in violation of this*  
1772 *chapter shall be deemed contraband and may not be sold or offered for sale unless such liquid nicotine or*  
1773 *nicotine vapor product are listed in the directory. Any such liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product that is*  
1774 *sold or offered for sale when not included in the directory shall be subject to confiscation and forfeiture. Any*  
1775 *such confiscation and forfeiture shall be governed by the procedures contained in Chapter 22.1 (§ 19.2-386.1*  
1776 *et seq.) of Title 19.2, which shall apply mutatis mutandis, except that all such liquid nicotine or nicotine*  
1777 *vapor product so confiscated and forfeited shall be destroyed and not resold.*

1778 *F. Any violation of this chapter shall constitute a prohibited practice under the provisions of § 59.1-200*  
1779 *and shall be subject to any and all of the enforcement provisions of Chapter 17 (§ 59.1-200 et seq.).*

1780 **2. That §§ 58.1-1021.06 through 58.1-1021.09 and 59.1-293.11, 59.1-293.12, and 59.1-293.14 of the Code**  
1781 **of Virginia are repealed.**

1782 **3. That for each retail tobacco permittee, the Board of Directors of the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage**  
1783 **Control Authority (the Board) shall conduct an unannounced underage buyer operation at least once**  
1784 **every 24 months to verify that the retail tobacco permittee is not selling retail tobacco products to**  
1785 **persons under 21 years of age. If the Board determines that the retail tobacco permittee has violated**  
1786 **the provisions of § 4.1-359, as created by this act, the Board shall conduct an additional underage**  
1787 **buyer operation of the retail tobacco permittee within six months of a Board order substantiating such**  
1788 **violation.**

1789 **4. That the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority (the Authority) shall enter into a**  
1790 **memorandum of understanding with the Office of the Attorney General (the Office) no later than July**  
1791 **1, 2026, that includes provisions for the Authority and the Office to (i) coordinate in the**  
1792 **implementation of the provisions of this act, (ii) cooperate in the mutual regulation of retail tobacco**  
1793 **products, as such term is defined in § 4.1-100 of the Code of Virginia, as amended by this act, and (iii)**  
1794 **jointly fund such implementation and regulation.**
