Bill Title: Law-enforcement officers; duty to render aid upon danger to life or limb; civil immunity.

Bill Summary: The substitute bill provides that a law-enforcement officer, while engaged in the performance of his duties, has a duty to render aid to any person that he observes suffering from serious bodily injury or life-threatening condition as circumstances objectively permit. The substitute bill also provides that in the absence of gross negligence or willful misconduct, a law-enforcement officer shall not be liable for any personal injury or wrongful death resulting from the rendering or withholding of such aid. The bill directs the Department of Criminal Justice Services to adopt regulations to provide law-enforcement officers with basic medical training, including emergency first aid training.
